Staff Reports from the Parks, Recreation, Forestry & Cemeteries Department

PARKS

- Restrooms are winterized for the season (with the exception of Hart Park). Due to ongoing vandalism, Hart Park is closed until the ice rink is established there.
- Tennis and volleyball nets will be taken down once the weather gets colder; pickleball nets at Smith will remain up.
- The contractor for the shade structure at Hart Park said the installation is scheduled for mid-November and should be complete in one day. After that and weather dependent, the slab underneath will be completed by Park and Street staff. If weather is too cold, then the slab will be poured in Spring of 2023.
- Staff has begun trenching in the conduit for the final phase of the security camera installation at Hart Park. Wires still need to be pulled through conduit to the 3 locations in park where the additional cameras will be placed, along with backfilling the trenches. The goal is to have this completed by the end of November or beginning of December.
- The two seasonal staff who typically work May to October are done for the season. Positions for seasonal staff are typically posted in February.

POOL

- Staff re-painted the mushroom (water feature in the zero depth area of the pool) and the red and yellow lines this past month (the red lines are to distinguish a slope change and the yellow line indicates 2ft depth).
- Staff also repaired a void under the sidewalk that was noticed during normal inspection. Initially, staff thought a water line was leaking from the restroom area, but it turned out there were rocks and other debris in the tunnel area.

MARINA

• The Marina closed on October 15 for the 2022 season. At this time, only non-masted navigation is allowed under the bridge with notice.

TRAILS

 Director Sackett, Mayor Merkes and Principal Planner Farrah Yang participated in a trail summit organized by East Central Wisconsin Regional Planning Commission (ECWRPC) in mid-October. The goal of this event was to gather together with communities and experts across Winnebago County to map out the future of our trail and on-street accommodations and to also dream big. Connecting our own communities to other communities is such an important aspect of what we do.

Halloween Events: Between Picnic by Pumpkin Light, Hometown Halloween, and our Great Pumpkin Hunt, we had an estimated 1,200 people participate in and enjoy our Halloween events.



Hometown Halloween had 29 vendors join us, which was an increase of 5 from last year. We estimated about 1,000 people in attendance. Notably we had 4 people seek us out through our Facebook page to thank us for a great event. Thank you to Dick Sturm for representing Park Board as an awesome bee-keeper!



Fall Programs: We had a great No School Day with 12 school-aged children spending time playing games, decorating pumpkins and trying their hand at face painting.

Five littles and their adults joined us for

the October &Me program where we went camping at the Memorial Building with books, music, banana boats, and a "fire." We have 100% of our participants signed up for the following month's group.



As of 11/1/2022 program registration numbers, we show a 9% decrease from 2021 fall program numbers. Overall, we have seen an increase in participation in 2022. The decrease for Fall is notably from the loss of our Cheer program that we had in Fall 2021.

CAPITAL PROJECTS

- Jefferson Park Playground: Staff is expecting final renderings of the playground by mid-November. Next steps will be to review at the Park Board.
- Shepard Park: Staff submitted a grant for 50/50 matching funds of the playground. We should hear back in the next couple of weeks.

FORESTRY

One hundred trees have been ordered so far for spring planting and the 40th Arbor Day observance.

 - Park Shelter/Pavilion Rental Fee Policy Recently a request was made by a neighborhood group to waive the shelter/pavilion rental fees for monthly meetings and events for the neighborhood group.

A policy was established in 2014 that defines "Non-profits hosting an event that is free and open to the public may receive up to a 50% discount on the total Special Event bill. By definition, the non-profit group must be a registered 501(c)(3) or (4) organization and proof of this designation is required."

This policy was created to clearly define users that would qualify for a reduced fee when using park facilities. When looking to deviate from or broaden our current policy, staff would ask consideration be given to the following:

- How to clearly define additional recipients or groups that would be eligible for a reduced or complete waiver of fee.
- Access to other City facilities that offer facility spaces for a free or reduced rate that meet the needs of the user group during business hours. Currently, the City does offer free meeting space at the Elisha D. Smith Library.
- 2. Jefferson Park Playground

Over the past several months, staff, along with selected members of the Park Board, have been working with Northland Recreation to design the new community playground for Jefferson Park. Included in the packet are the two options. Both options include the same playground elements, just different color schemes. Main components of the design include the following:

• Integration of elements from Menasha's history and natural elements around Jefferson Park area

- Focus on accessibility and inclusivity
- Nearby seating options and shade
- Expanded play elements which creates an estimated capacity of nearly 250 people
- Natural integration of seating and landscaping and terrain elevation to create a unified look within the park

Staff will give an overview of the playground at the meeting and seek approval from the Board of the final playground design.



December 2022

BUDGET

Park and Rec Dept. staff presented the proposed 2022 budget on Thursday, November 10. Adoption of the budget took place on November 21 with no changes being made to the Parks, Rec and Forestry budgets.

PARKS

- Banta Point: With the completion of the Racine St. bridge project, the City will be working to restore some of the shoreline along Banta Point adjacent to the Lawson Canal restoration project. To aid in this financial cost of the restoration, the City is applying for the Healthy Lakes and Rivers grant through the Wisconsin DNR. The Healthy Lakes and Rivers is a subprogram of the Surface Water Management grant program that focuses on shore land landowners that want to install practices on their property to improve habitat and water quality.
- Due to weather not cooperating, the Hart Park shade structure installation has been rescheduled for spring. The contractor has us first on their list. Once the contractor is done with their part, city staff will finish the concrete slab (hopefully by the end of March).
- Ho! Ho! Ho! Staff put up holiday lights at Broad St, the Memorial Building, the Smith Gazebo/ Pavilion as well as the lights on all of the Christmas trees for the Gather 'Round event.

OPEN POSITIONS

Our department is in the hiring process for both the Arborist and Facilities Technician position. We are still accepting applications for the Arborist position. Information about applying can be found on the City website.

RECREATION

Summer Preparations

 Letters will be emailed to our 2022 seasonal staff directing them on the hiring process. Job postings will be live December 14th and applications will be reviewed on a rolling basis with interviews for new candidates scheduled around March 4th.

Programs

- Open Gym continues with crowds averaging 16 players . Open Gym is held every Wednesday from 6:30-9:30pm at Menasha High Fieldhouse.
- Family Flips hosts several families each Friday 10:00-11:15am at the Memorial Building gymnastics facility. An average of 13 children under the age of 5 and their caregivers attend each time.

Special Events

- Gather 'Round the Christmas Tree went well with 300-400 people downtown to view our 16 beautifully decorated trees. We have many fantastic ideas already in the works for next year with creating more social settings to encourage people to stay throughout the event.
- Holiday Hayride is sold out. We have reindeer, a petting zoo, holiday activities, and most importantly caroling on hayride through the beautifully light Doty Island neighborhoods.
