COVID-19 Weekly Data Summary



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November 19, 2020

Summary

- **There is still significant uncontrolled community spread of COVID-19 in our community. Assume you may be exposed to the virus when you are in public.**
 - There are people living in our community who have the virus, but don't know it. Even these individuals who do not feel sick (or do not show symptoms – “asymptomatic”) can spread the virus to others. This is called “asymptomatic spread.”
 - Some people know they are sick or that they are a close contact of someone with COVID-19, but they choose to go out in public anyway. These individuals are breaking isolation or quarantine and are exposing others to the virus. View [this fact sheet](#) for information about what the terms isolation and quarantine mean.
- **It is extremely important that you limit your trips outside of your home to essential errands only. Always wear a mask or face covering and maintain at least 6 feet of physical distance from others at all times. A mask/face covering is NOT a substitute for physical distancing. You need to do both. Do not attend group gatherings.**
- Governor Evers delivered a statewide address on the COVID-19 pandemic on November 10, 2020. It can be viewed [here](#). Governor Evers also signed [Executive Order #94](#), advising Wisconsinites to stay home, urging them to take precautions to stay safe if they must leave their home, and encouraging businesses to take additional steps to protect their customers, employees, and the community.
- **Please consider alternative ways of celebrating Thanksgiving this year. Travel and in-person gatherings with people who do not live in your household increase your chance of getting and spreading the virus that causes COVID-19. Staying home and celebrating with those in your household is the best way to protect yourself and others.**

 - The Northeast Region Public Health Officers issued a [Public Health Emergency COVID-19 Alert](#) on Friday, November 13 to urge residents to follow best public health practices during their upcoming holiday celebrations.
- The Wisconsin Department of Health Services (DHS) has information and resources to help you keep yourself, your family, and community healthy and safe. Check out the DHS [You Stop the Spread](#) website and the DHS [Making Safe Choices](#) website.
- DHS added a “critically high” category to the burden indicator and activity level for COVID-19, and is shown in red below in the burden table and chart. Adding this category of “critically high” will give Wisconsinites a better idea of how COVID-19 is impacting our state in the current surge of COVID-19 cases. The threshold for this new category is almost three times higher than the threshold for the “Very High” category.
- Currently in the City of Menasha the burden of confirmed COVID-19 cases is critically high and the activity level is critically high. The case rate for this 2-week period (November 4 – November 17) is 1,387.8 cases per 100,000 population, which is an increase from a case rate of 1,376.4 cases per 100,000 population in the previous 2-week period (October 28 – November 10).



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- The current case load is straining our disease investigation and contact tracing capacity. Due to the critically high case volume, City of Menasha disease investigators have implemented crisis standards of practice for disease investigation and contact tracing. Using these crisis standards of practice, disease investigators were able to contact all confirmed cases of COVID-19 within 24 hours of the confirmed cases being communicated to the health department.
- The Menasha Joint School District (MJSJSD) continues to utilize virtual learning for all schools. The MJSJSD Superintendent issued a letter to MJSJSD parents and guardians on November 10, 2020 to describe the most recent proposed schedule for bringing students back for in-person learning. - There are three regional COVID-19 Wisconsin Army National Guard (WING) testing sites now open; one in Appleton, one in Menasha, and one in Oshkosh. More information about these sites can be found on our [COVID-19 testing sites webpage](#).

Background

This data summary provides preliminary data on the confirmed cases of COVID-19 from November 4 – November 17, 2020. Case counts utilized for all graphs and tables are based on the date public health staff received and recorded the test results. Numbers here may not represent final case counts for this reporting period.

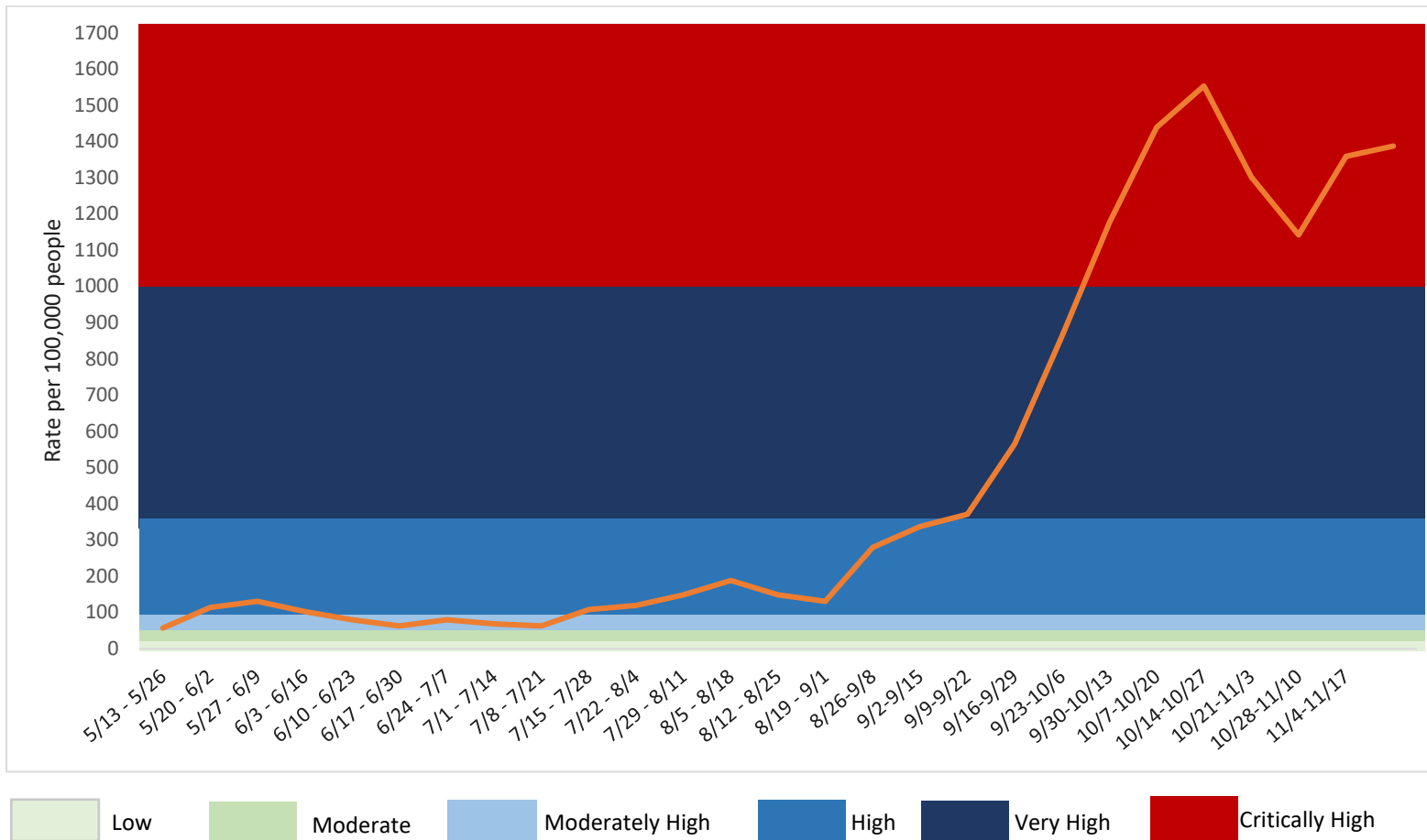

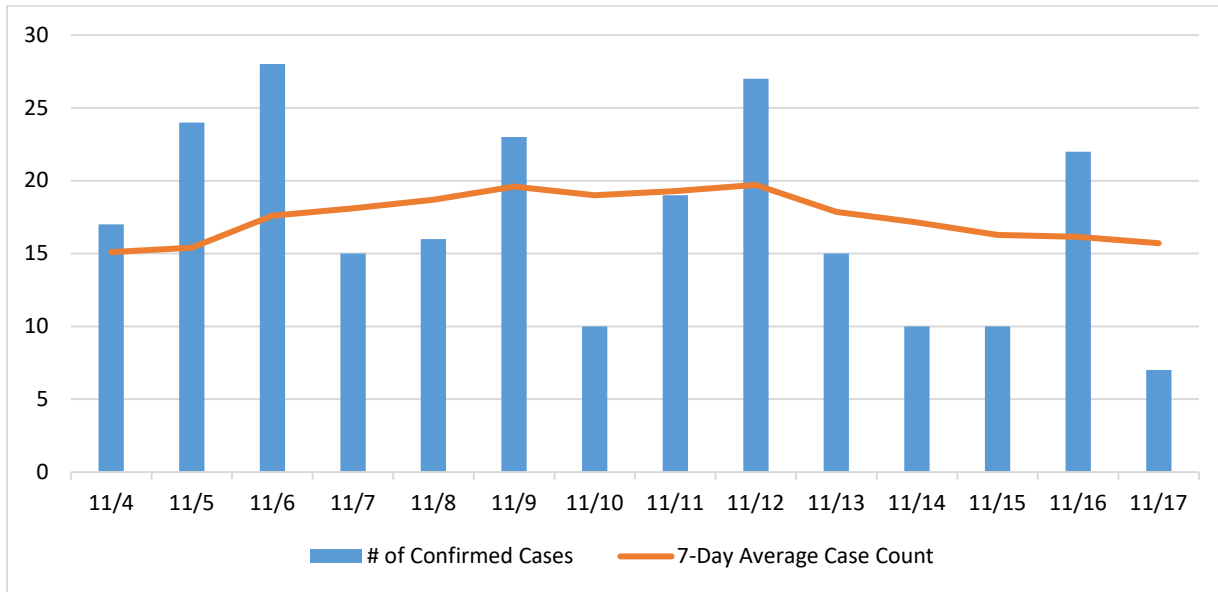
	Case Rate per 100,000 residents in the past two weeks	City of Menasha number of cases
Low	Case rate is less than or equal to 10.	Less than 2 cases.
Moderate	Case rate is greater than 10, but less than or equal to 50.	Greater than 1 cases, but less than or equal to 8 cases.
Moderately High	Case rate is greater than 50, but less than or equal to 100.	Greater than 8 cases, but less than or equal to 17 cases.
High	Case rate is greater than 100, but less than or equal to 350.	Greater than 17 cases, but less than or equal to 61 cases.
Very High	Case rate is greater than 350, but less than or equal to 1,000.	Greater than 61 cases, but less than or equal to 175 cases.
Critically High	Case rate is greater than 1,000.	Greater than 175 cases.

City of Menasha COVID-19 case rate trend and burden by 2-week periods*

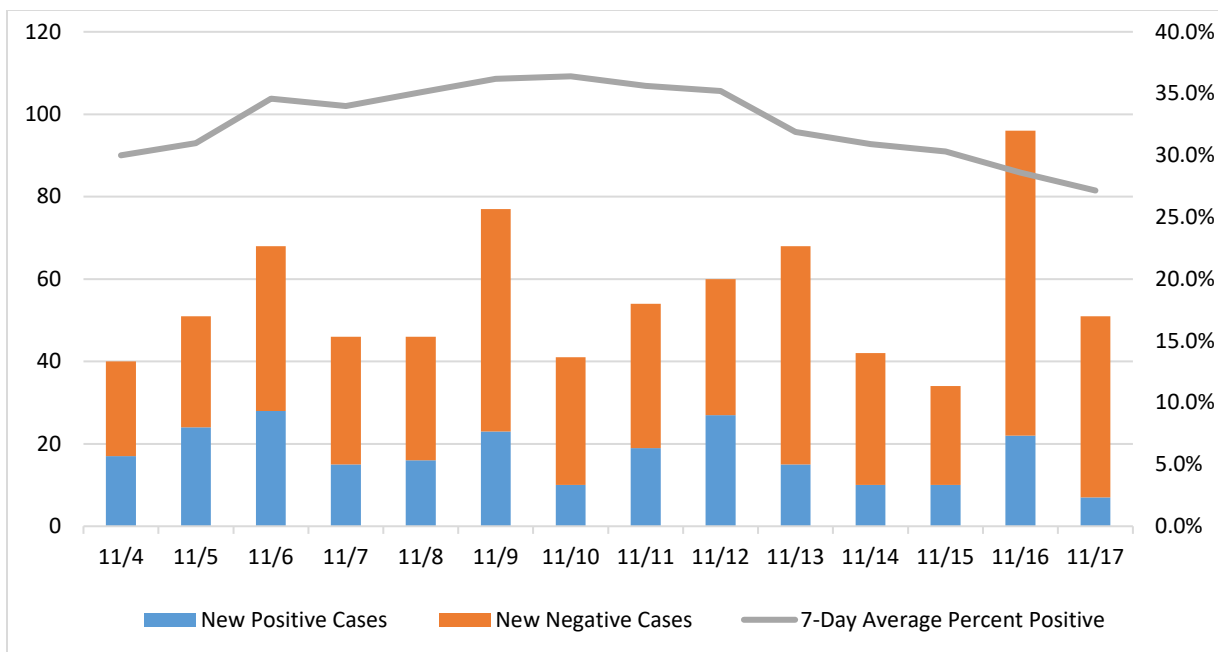

Number of confirmed COVID-19 cases by day in the City of Menasha in the past two weeks (Nov 4 – Nov 17) and the 7 day average



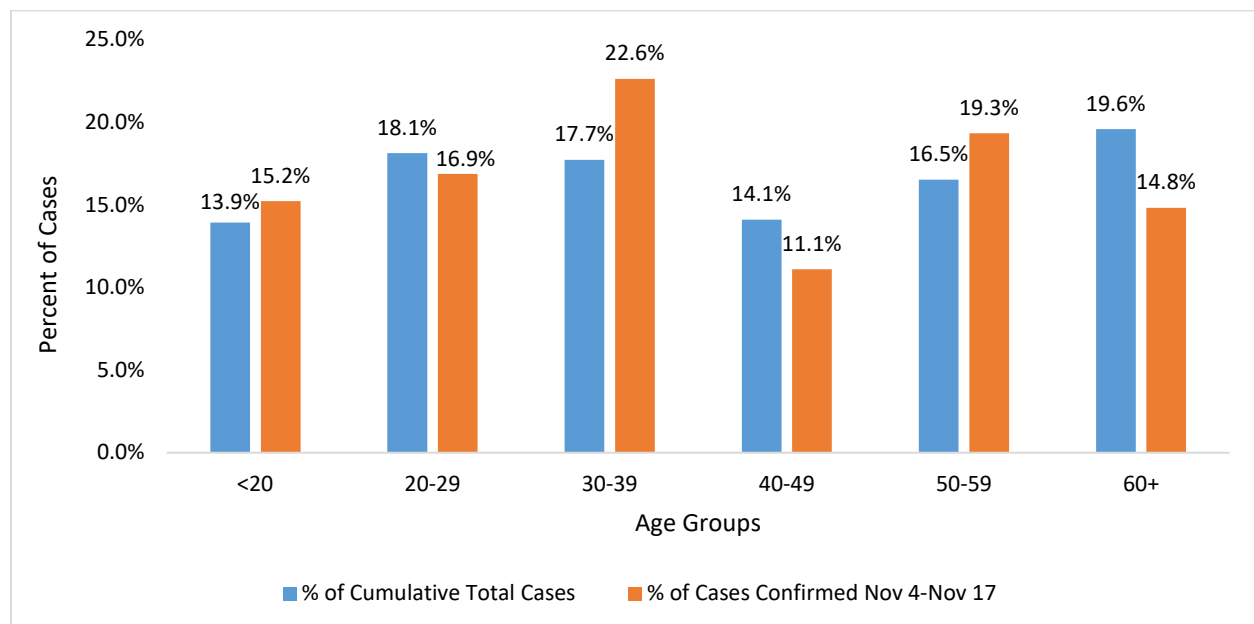
Total COVID-19 tests, positive and negative, by day and 7-day average percent positive tests (Nov 4 – Nov 17)

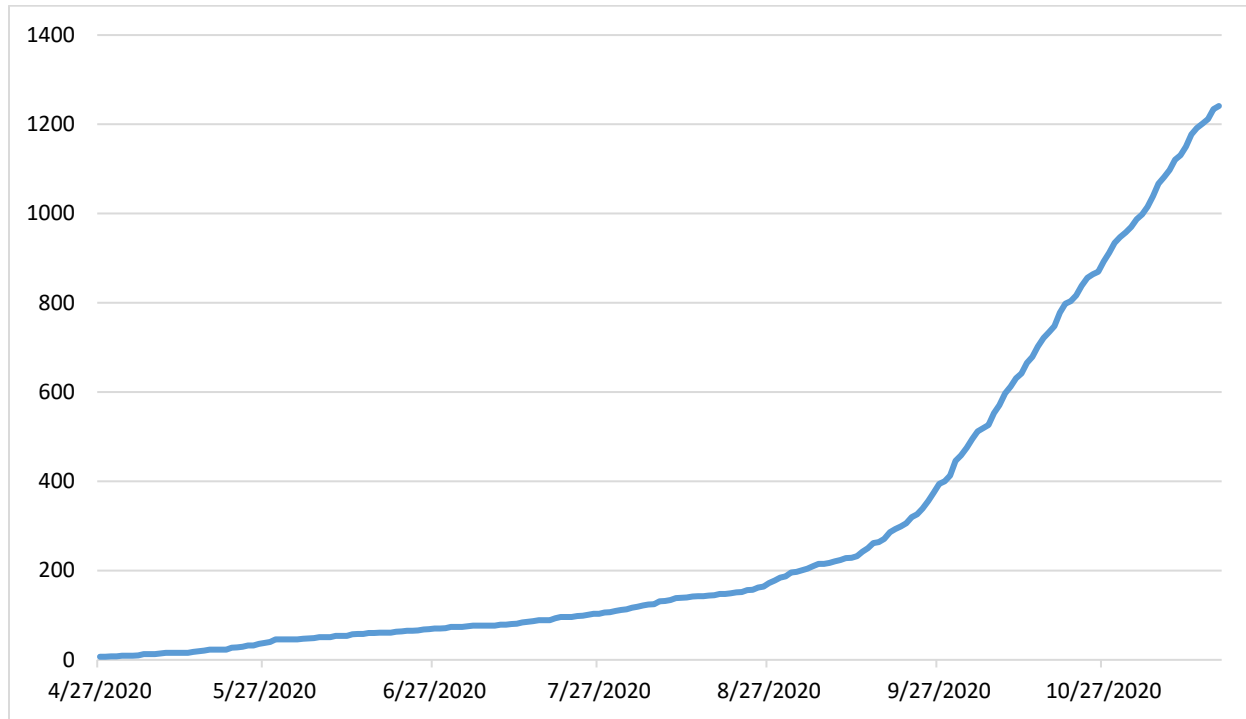
Percentage of laboratory confirmed cases of COVID-19 by age: cumulative and in the past two weeks (Nov 4 – Nov 17)
