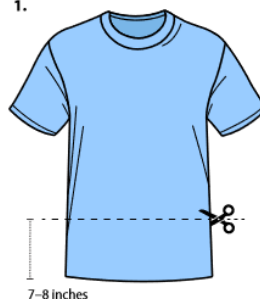
Quick Cut T-shirt Cloth Face Covering (no sew method)

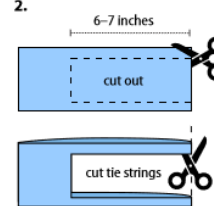

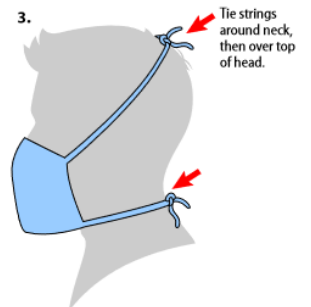

We would like to take this opportunity to talk about Public Health and our role in the current COVID-19 Public Health Emergency.

When public health is working best, we rarely see it working. Our work includes promoting healthy lifestyles, researching disease and injury prevention, and detecting, preventing and responding to infectious diseases. Public Health is concerned with protecting the health of entire populations.

What is the City of Menasha Public Health Department's role in the COVID-19 Public Health Emergency?

- Identify, monitor and investigate data to control the spread of COVID-19. This is also called disease surveillance.
- Conduct contact tracing to help identify people who may have been infected and determine appropriate isolation strategies.
- Educate the community through a variety of outreach methods.
- Collaborate with a wide variety of partners to share resources and information.
- Continuously learn about COVID-19 from state and national partners in order to provide the best guidance we have at the time to keep our community healthy.

COVID-19 FAQ

Will warm weather stop the outbreak of COVID-19?

- * It is not yet known if weather and temperature affect the spread of COVID-19. Some other viruses, like those that cause the common cold and flu, spread more during cold weather months but that does not mean it is impossible to become sick with these viruses during other months. There is much more to learn about the transmissibility, severity, and other features associated with COVID-19 and investigations are ongoing.
