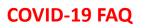
DHS has launched a new data dashboard

The data dashboard consists of maps and tables that toggle between counties and Healthcare Emergency Readiness Coalition (HERC) regions. The counties and regions are color-coded to indicate overall COVID-19 activity status: low, medium, or high.

Overall activity status is a summary indicator based on two data points: the burden of cases and the trajectory of cases.

- Burden, also defined as case rate, is the total number of cases a county or region has per 100,000 Wisconsin residents in the past two weeks, and is described as low, moderate, moderately high, or high.
- Trajectory, also defined as case change, refers to the percent change of cases in the past two weeks, and is described as shrinking, growing, or having no significant change.

Can I end my 14 day guarantine early if I have a negative COVID-19 test?

No. It may take up to 14 days for the illness to surface. Also, if a test is taken immediately after exposure, it will most often show up negative.
