



Who benefits from Teen Court?

JUVENILE OFFENDERS:

Youth who successfully complete Teen Court can have the charge removed from their record. Youth are given the opportunity for a chance to prove that mistakes can be turned into positive choices.

PARENTS OF OFFENDERS:

Parents are no longer held totally accountable. The juvenile becomes responsible for his/her actions. Peers will be delivering the message that the behavior of the offender is not acceptable.

COMMUNITY:

The community receives the benefits from projects and community service work. Citizens are able to see teens being held accountable for their actions.

YOUTH VOLUNTEERS:

Youth gain a sense of responsibility as they encourage peers to stop behaviors that reflect on all teens. Volunteers also get a chance to participate in the juvenile justice system and examine possible career opportunities.

ADULT VOLUNTEERS:

Adults who choose to become involved with the Teen Court process are given a chance to help make a difference in the lives of young people.

Why Teen Court?

Teen Court offers eligible youth an opportunity to receive a meaningful sentence from a jury of their peers. This experience provides youth with an alternative to appearing in court and paying a fine. Teens will also be required to return to Teen Court to serve on the jury for other youth who have violated the law. The Teen Court experience will provide a more lasting impression for the youth involved.

Teens who successfully complete the program will have the charge dismissed. Nation-wide, 80% of all youth participating in Teen Court Programs have successfully completed their sentences.

Who qualifies for Teen Court?

Youth who are eligible for Teen Court must be between the ages of 11 and 17. They must admit to the offense they have been charged with. They also must have a parent or adult who will accompany the youth to the Teen Court proceedings.

Youth typically can only participate in Teen Court once; however, multiple admittance is allowed on a case by case basis.



HOW CAN I SIGN UP?

1. Youth has committed an ordinance offense for possession of a vape device, product, part, etc.
2. Youth **MUST** admit to committing the offense that he/she has been charged with.
3. Youth must be willing to participate in Teen Court.
4. Youth must have a parent or adult who is willing to accompany you to Teen Court.
5. **You must pay a mandatory fee of \$10.00**

Timeline of modified Teen Court:

The modified version of Teen Court for vaping offenses was created to handle the increasing amount of offenses while still maintaining the integrity of the program.

Youth admitted to this version of Teen Court can expect to have to complete the following tasks:

1. Intake meeting with County worker
2. Essay on vaping
3. Online instructional video/questions
4. Teen Court jury term(s)
