**Menasha Officers arrest motorcyclist on 4<sup>th</sup> Offense OWI after he drove through a building**

Menasha, WI (April 9<sup>th</sup>, 2019) Menasha Officers were called by employees of Alliance Industries at 320 Appleton St. to investigate a motorcyclist who drove his Harley Davidson motorcycle up an access ramp and through the factory.

Just before 10 PM on April 9<sup>th</sup>, a 29 year old man from Neenah was talking to an Alliance employee outside the building. The motorcyclist, a former employee, drove his motorcycle through the production areas of the building at speeds reaching 35-40 mph. About 14 workers were in the building at the time which stretches nearly two blocks from Appleton St. to Racine St. Employees immediately contacted 911. After parking his motorcycle, the man took to driving a fork lift for a few seconds until directed to get down by a worker. “This was a very dangerous situation that our people handled very well,” said Andy Kemp who is the general manager of the plant.

Officers arrived just after the man left the fork truck to find him about to leave on his motorcycle. After detecting the odor of intoxicants about him, and refusing field sobriety tests, he was arrested for felony 4<sup>th</sup> offense operating while intoxicated and reckless driving. He was later transported to the Winnebago County Jail awaiting a bond hearing.
