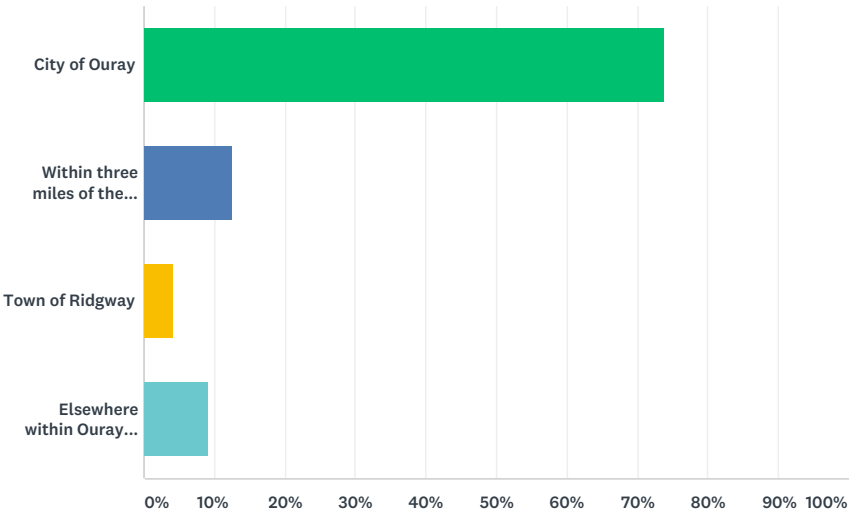


Q1 Where do you live?

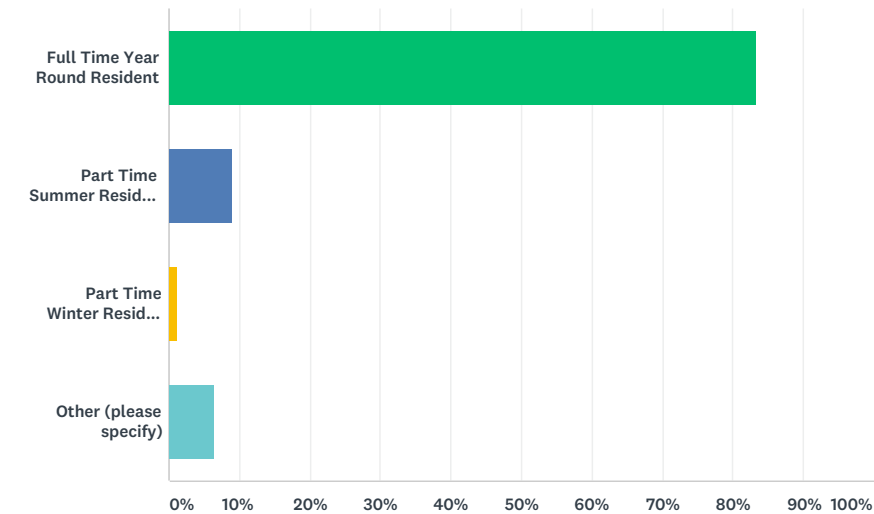

Q2 If you are a resident of the City of Ouray, what is your residency in the city?

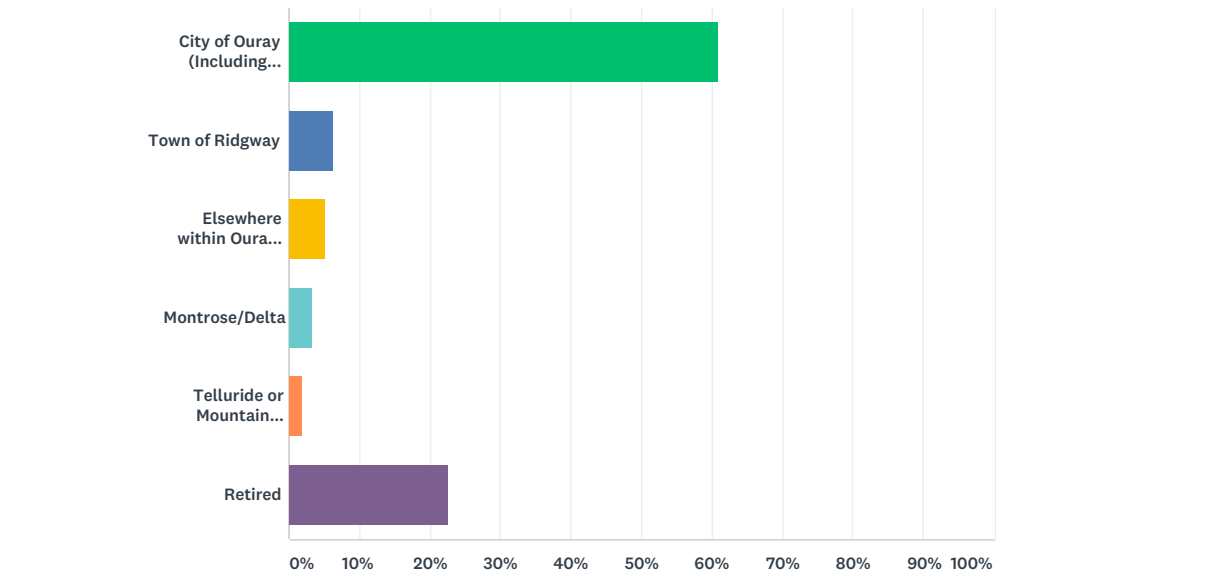

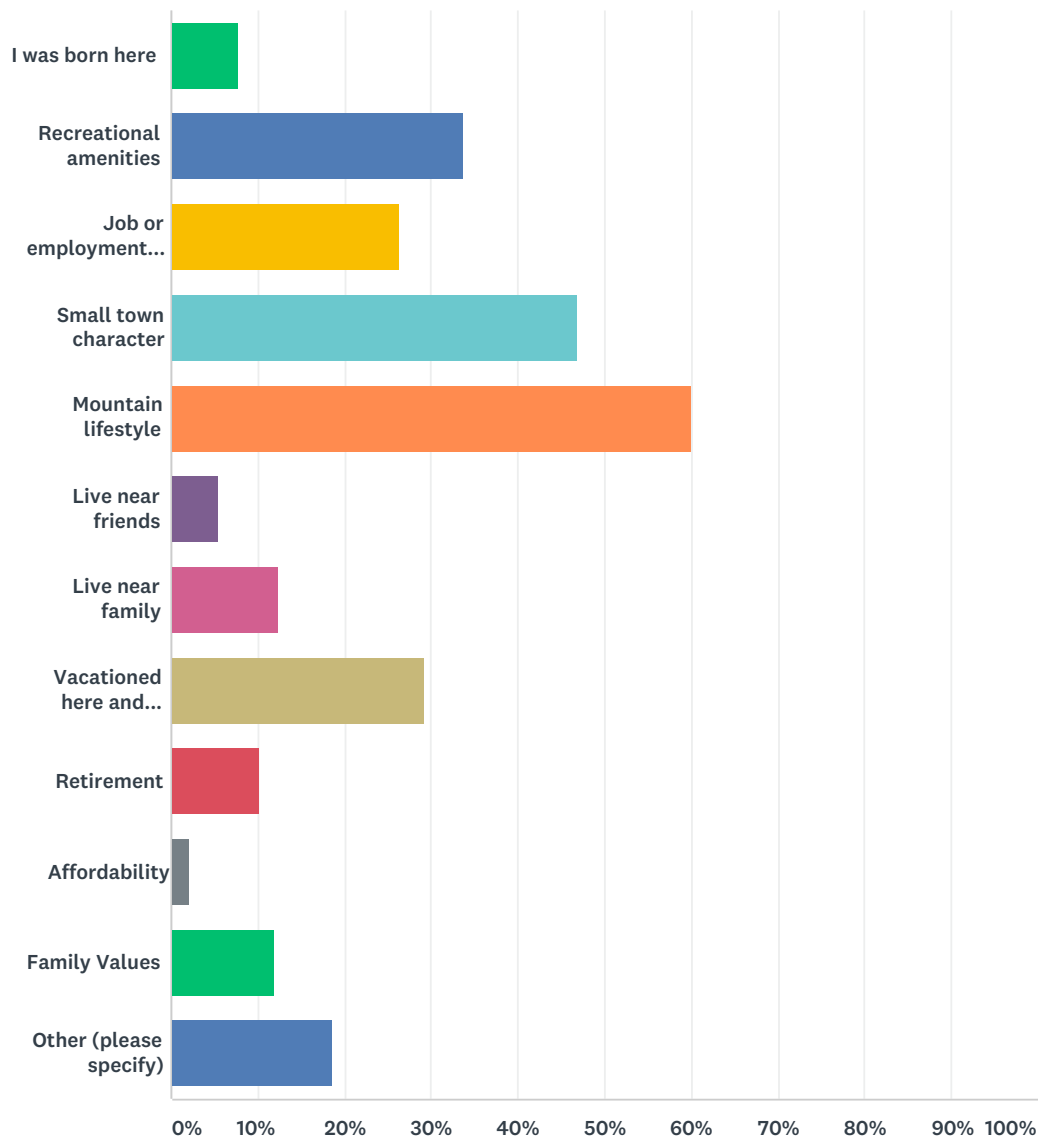

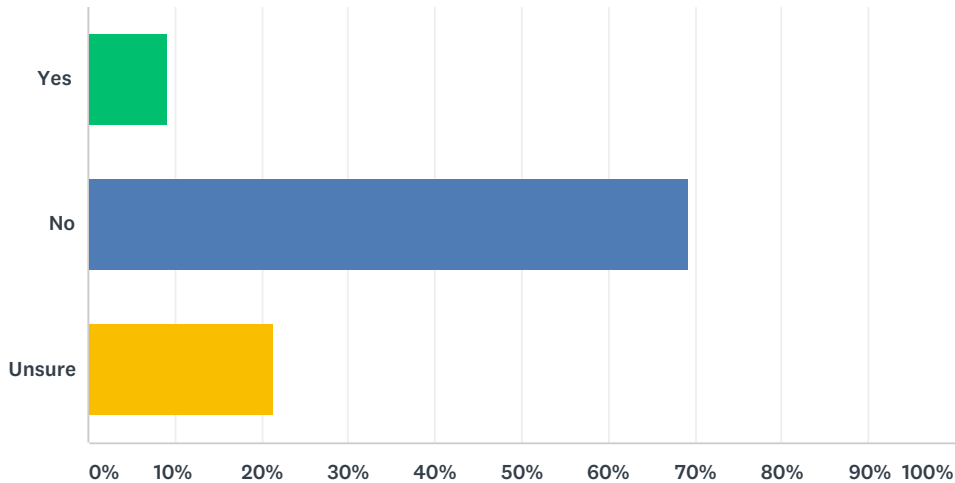

Q11 Do you plan to move outside of the City of Ouray within the next five years?

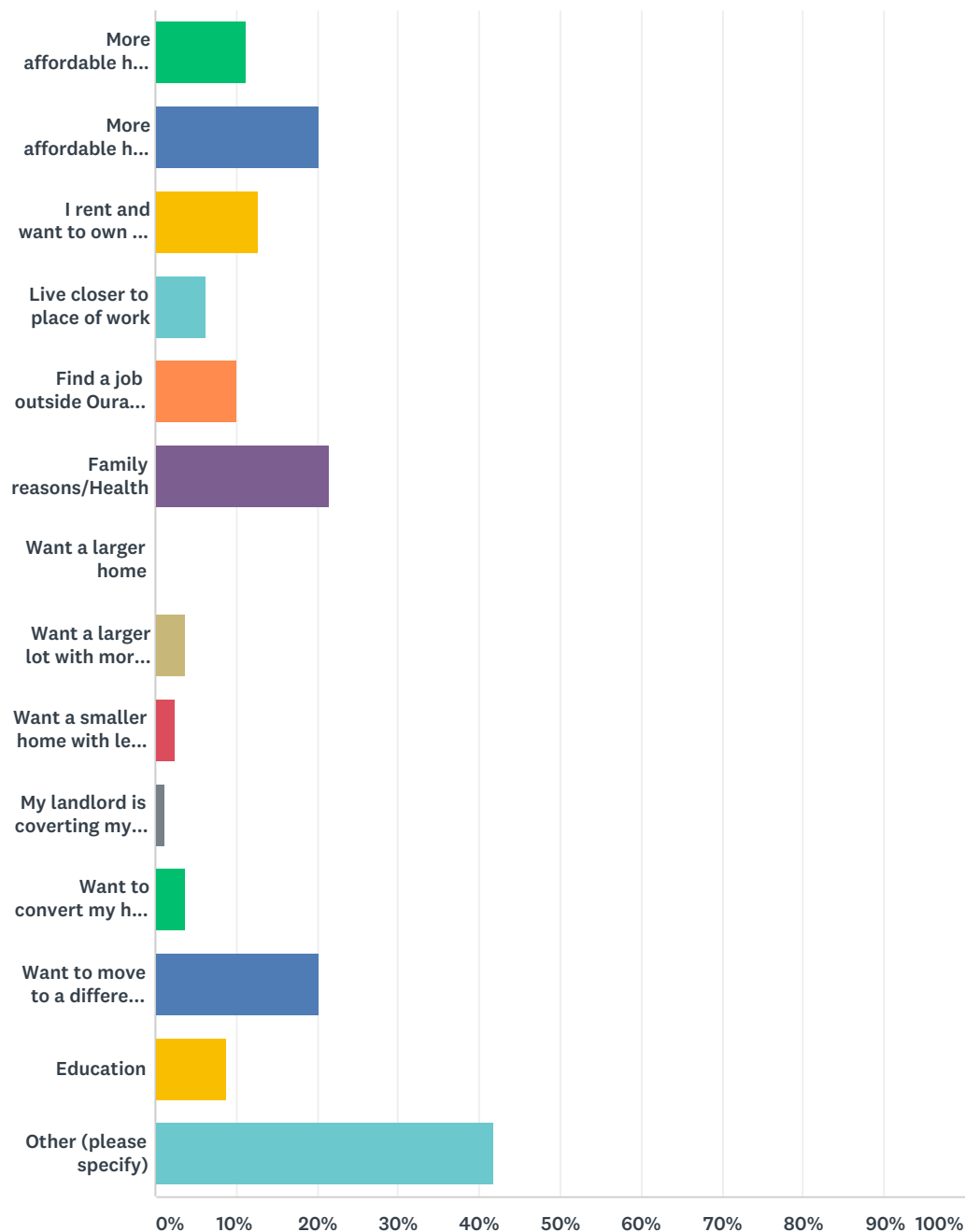

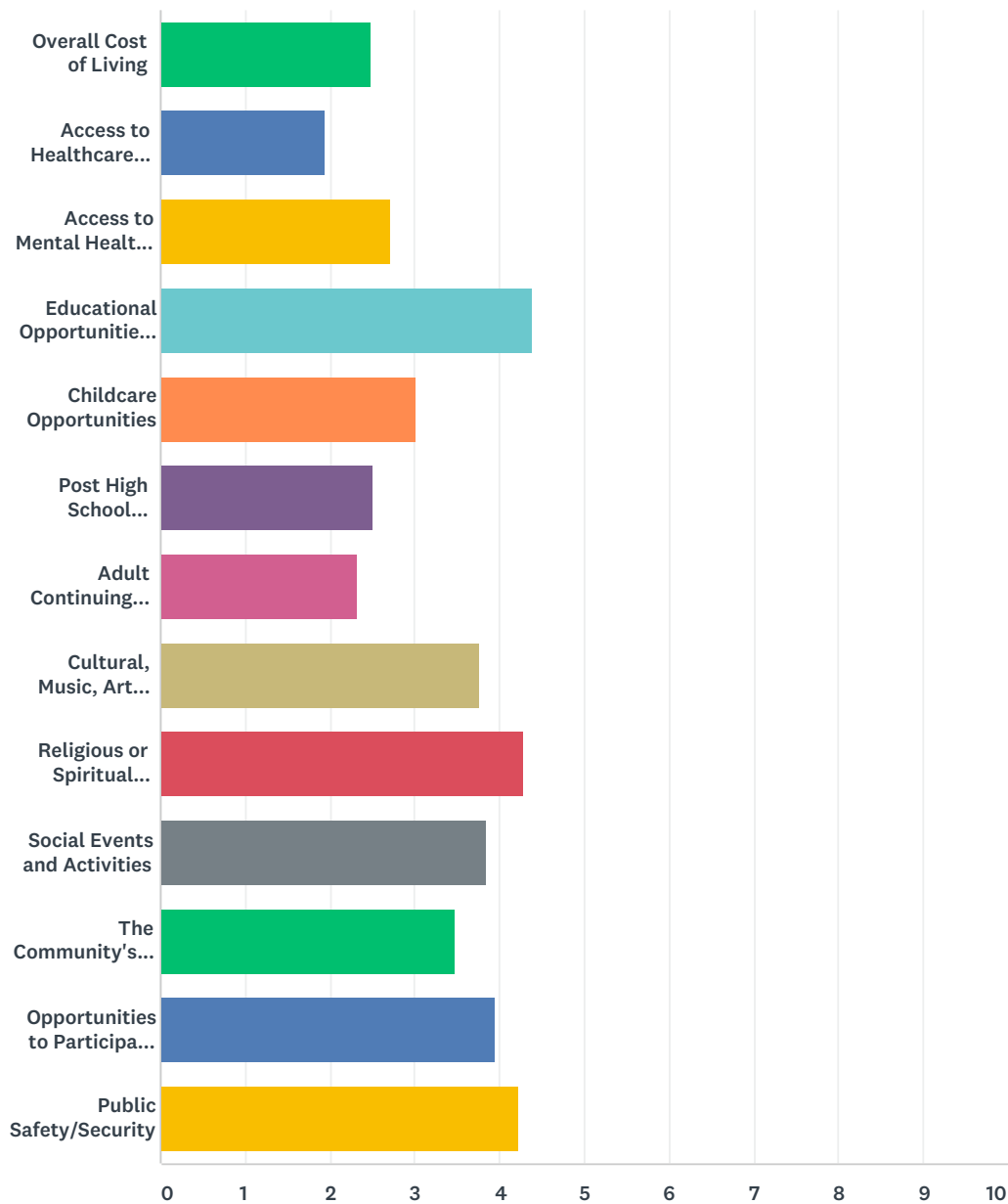

So the big picture is always important not to ignore the details, and change is always hard to plan around. We are encountering a lot of changes and not all of them seem very happy or welcome so we definitely agree on that.

We chatted a bit about a few thoughts I have on some of our growth issues and some would seem to apply to city issues and county.

there is perpetual chatter about affordable housing and we are really probably on the brink of creating a crisis as many of our limited long term rentals get usurped by the more profitable short term venture. Some potential solutions to ease this growing problem 1) permit accessory dwellings/allow existing ones to be rentable 2) say yes to a mobile home park with reasonable regulations to ensure that it stays neat and tidy and allow those structures to be rented not required to be owned 3) allow for development which allows modular homes which are more affordable.

We also talked a little about what a problem summer parking can be for locals workers etc. Perhaps the jeep rental places would be interested in providing a pick up option for their renters in town? It may also be true that meters will be a longer term solution for summer parking but we really need to consider if 3 months of parking meters and the staff to do the enforcement is an economically viable situation.

I also share your concern that Ouray be willing to embrace diverse business opportunities so that we do not hang our hat solely on tourism. I am sure I forgot some things. Please feel free to share and include me in info or dates of upcoming planning where input would be helpful.
