PRESS RELEASE UPDATE

05/05/2022

Effective at 5:00 P.M. on the Cooks Peak Fire, Colfax County Sheriff's Office in consultation with Colfax County Emergency Management is removing all communities off Evacuation status. The containment of the Cooks Peak Fire is at 97 % with 59,359 acres burned. The Southwest Area Incident Management Team 5 will transfer command to a type 3 team at 5:00 pm tonight. We will continue to stay in contact with SWIMT 1 for updates on the Hermit's Peak/ Calf Canyon fire. **State Road 21** will be open to local traffic only and closed to thru traffic.

As fire season has begun early and with current extremely dry conditions it is important to have a good understanding of **READY, SET, GO** procedures. READY – Prepare Now Prepare for the hazards that can threaten your community. Meaning get prepared now just in case.

~ Assemble an emergency supplies kit (Go Kit). Start with the five P's: people and pet supplies, prescriptions, papers, personal needs and priceless items.

~ Check with your neighbors, family, friends, and elders to ensure they are READY.

~ Keep up to date on local news, weather watches and warnings.

SET – Be Alert There is significant danger in your area. Simply put, Load Up the Truck.

~ Residents should consider voluntarily relocating to a shelter or with family/friends outside the affected area.

~ Grab your emergency supplies kit.

~ Keep in mind unique needs for your family or special equipment for pets and livestock.

~ Stay aware of the latest news and information from public safety officials. This might be the only notice you receive. Emergency services cannot guarantee they will be able to notify everyone if conditions rapidly deteriorate. Be SET to GO.

GO – Evacuate Danger in your area is current and life-threatening. GET OUT NOW!

~ Residents should evacuate immediately to a shelter or with family/friends outside of the affected area.

~ If you choose to ignore this advisement, you must understand emergency services may not be able to assist you further.

~ Follow instructions from emergency personnel, stay on designated evacuation routes and avoid closed areas.
