City Hall GRAND OPENING

The City of Columbia Heights officially opened its new City Hall location with a grand opening event on Aug 17. Attendees were able to enjoy music from the band Astronomy Town, dine on food from Adama Restaurant, Jasmine Thai, and Pizza Man, and have a refreshing mocktail from The Central Mix. Attendees were also able to tour the new facility and view art inspired by the City's iconic poster series.

City Hall is located at 3989 Central Ave NE and its operating hours are 8 am to 4:30 pm Monday through Friday excluding government holidays.

The new City Hall location has three options for parking, all of which are free. Visitors are reminded that they are not allowed to park on 40th Ave along City Hall or across the street in the lot north of the new City Hall, violators will be towed at their own expense.

- **City Hall Garage** - There is a parking garage located at 3989 Central Ave NE. Visitors will have to enter off 40th Ave NE to enter. The garage is only open during business hours and for scheduled City meetings.
- **Van Buren St NE Ramp** - The Van Buren St NE Ramp is located north of 40th Ave NE between Van Buren St NE and Central Ave NE.
- **Municipal Parking Lot** - The Municipal Parking lot is located south of 40th Ave NE between Van Buren St NE and Central Ave NE.

Visitors were able to explore beyond the lobby and tour city offices, Council Chambers, and the Central Place Community Room.

Sora Coming to the Columbia Heights Public Schools This Fall

The Columbia Heights Public Library and School District have partnered to provide access to the MELSA: Twin Cities Metro eLibrary via Public Library Connect (PLC). PLC allows secondary level students to borrow eBooks and eAudiobooks from local public library digital collections via the Sora app (the school version of Overdrive's Libby.) Sora makes it quick and easy for students to read age-appropriate eBooks and eAudiobooks on any device. St. Anthony/New Brighton, Spring Lake Park, Roseville, Hopkins, Edina, Orono, and Falcon Heights are some of the other public schools in the metro area currently using Sora.

Metro-area public libraries are currently purchasing thousands of dollars of digital content from Overdrive, much of it for children and teens. Columbia Heights Public School students will be able to borrow those eBooks and downloadable eAudiobooks for free. Students won't need a separate public library card; they simply use their student credentials to access age-appropriate material. Sora works with the Chromebooks issued to each student, either via the app or on an Internet browser.




Sora opens a world of reading to students and is one of the many ways the city library and the school district work together to create worlds of opportunity for every learner.

Former Rainbow Site Redevelopment

The mostly vacant strip mall located at 4300 Central Ave NE was recently demolished by its owner Alatus LLC. Alatus acquired the property with financial assistance from the City in 2021. Since acquisition by Alatus, global supply chain issues, rising construction costs, and rising interest rates have slowed development. Despite these challenges, Alatus and the City remain committed to moving the project forward in a manner consistent with the original redevelopment vision for the site.

The preliminary plans for the site include a mix of high-density residential housing, medium density residential housing, commercial/retail space, and public open space. The final site plans have not been approved by the City. The City and Alatus plan to introduce more detailed plans in the late fall and seek feedback from residents. Alatus and the City would like to have the land-use approval process completed by early 2024, with the intent of breaking ground on phase one of the redevelopment project in the summer of 2024.



Get Ready for Cold Weather with Home Energy Squad


As we start creeping into fall, it's time to start bracing ourselves for colder weather. This year, make sure your home is braced for the cold, too. With a Home Energy Squad (HES) visit, you can have peace of mind knowing your home is properly insulated, your furnace is working well, and that your home is as energy efficient as possible. After a HES visit you will be staying warm and saving money all winter long.

During a HES visit, an Energy Auditor will come out to inspect your house, then create a customized report with recommendations to make your home more energy efficient. They will also provide instant energy savings by installing free materials like LED lights, door and attic weather stripping, and high efficiency water fixtures.

Plus, thanks to the City of Columbia Heights' partnership with HES, you can get a visit for a discounted rate! There are two types of HES visits available, the Energy Saver Visit (for homes built in or after 2000) and the Energy Planner Visit (for homes built before 2000). 2024 Budget Update

The city manager’s proposed 2024 City Budget is available for review online at www.columbiaheightsmn.gov. Click on “Finance” under “Department” and then click on “Budget and Financial Reports”. This is a working draft that goes through a series of reviews and possible revisions throughout the remainder of 2023, until a final version is adopted by the City Council at a public hearing on December



11, 2023. Prior to that public hearing, the Anoka County Auditor will mail to each property owner a Truth-in-Taxation notice listing the proposed 2024 property taxes for their specific property. In addition to providing the proposed City tax amount for 2024, that notice includes the proposed tax amounts for all other applicable districts, including county, school district, and any special districts.

PAY ONLINE – In 2021, the City of Columbia Heights launched a new utility billing website with pay online tools. Just visit www.columbiaheightsmn.gov/billing. The City of Columbia Heights bills quarterly for water, sewer, storm sewer, garbage, recycling, and yard waste. Water and sewer charges are a combination of fixed quarterly fees, plus a variable charge for the volume of water passing through the meter installed at your property.

This volume data is automatically transmitted to the City’s billing system by a radio attached to your meter.

Fall and Winter Parking Reminder

As we approach the colder months, the CHPD would like to remind residents of the City's winter parking rules. From Nov 1 to March 31, vehicles cannot be parked on City streets from 2 am to 6 am, per City ordinance. This ensures streets can be plowed on short notice and guarantees enough space for emergency vehicles to pass through.

Don't Let Your Car Run Unattended

Leaving your car running unattended, even for a few seconds, is an open invitation to auto theft. The majority of stolen vehicles in the City involve vehicles that were left running with keys in the ignition. Leaving your vehicle running unattended is also an ordinance violation (remote start features exempt). Please help the CHPD combat auto theft. Take the keys out of your vehicle, lock your car, and remove any valuables from inside.

The Columbia Heights Fire Department will host its annual Fire Prevention Open House on Oct 14 as part of Fire Prevention Week, Oct 8-14. This year's FPW campaign "Cooking safety starts with YOU. Pay attention to fire prevention" works to educate everyone about simple but important actions they can take when cooking to keep themselves and those around them safe. According to the National Fire Prevention Association, 49% of home fires are caused by cooking, showing there is still much work to do when it comes to educating the public about how to stay safe when cooking.

To promote fire safety, Columbia Heights Fire would like to invite you to the Public Safety Building's fire station Oct 14. Kids, young and old, can spray a real fire hose, meet dalmatians, enjoy free ice cream, watch a fire demonstration, meet local firefighters, and more!



Recreational Fire Safety

Having a recreational fire this season? Don't forget your permit! You are required to obtain a permit from the Fire Department prior to burning in Columbia Heights.

Permit Requirements

Permits may be obtained from the Fire Department located at 825 41st Avenue NE between the hours of 8 am and 4:30 pm, Monday through Friday. Residents are allowed nine (9) FREE Daily Recreational Fire Permits per year or an Annual Recreational Fire Permit can be purchased for \$25.

- Fires are allowed only between 11 am and 11 pm. All fires must be extinguished by 11 pm and should never be allowed to smolder.
- Only burn dry firewood. Burning of yard waste, construction materials, or trash is not allowed.
- Be considerate of neighbors. Be aware of the Air Quality Index (AQI) and never burn on windy days.

The Public Works Department would like to shed light on an issue that requires our collective attention: the increasing problem of trash in our parks.  - Volunteer Clean-up Events:** Organizing regular park clean-up days can foster community engagement and instill a sense of pride in our surroundings. By dedicating a few hours of your time, you can make a significant impact and inspire others to follow suit.
- 4. Reporting Violations:** If you witness littering or illegal dumping in our parks, we urge you to report it to the relevant authorities. By taking swift action, we can discourage such behavior and hold offenders accountable.

Fall Street Sweeping Begins Soon, Refrain from Street Parking When Possible

The Street Department will begin street sweeping in late September and continue as long as weather permits. A reminder to all property owners: **it is against City ordinance to deposit litter, including leaves and other yard waste, and snow, into public streets.** Please avoid parking on streets if you can.

Yard Waste Reminders and Deadline

Please be aware of your yard waste collection day

- Yard waste collection may not be on the same day as other refuse services, please visit www.columbiaheightsmn.gov/yardwaste to see the daily schedule. Bags & bundles of yard waste must be out by 6 am. Yard waste services end the week of Thanksgiving or prior if there is permanent snow cover.
- Yard waste should be placed on the street curb in compostable bags. No other containers are allowed. Brush should be cut in 3-foot lengths and bundled in no larger than 18" rolls. Branches cannot be too woody i.e., more than 4" in diameter. For these woody branches contact the Anoka County tree waste site at **(763) 324-3400**.
- Please don't wait until the end of the season to bag leaves as it may overload the contractor's ability to stay on schedule.
- Compost carts are available, note there is a \$20 cart removal fee when canceling compost service.
- Bagged and bundled yard waste is collected by College Hunks Haul Junk. Visit www.columbiaheightsmn.gov/refusesupport to report yard waste issues, request other refuse services, and ask questions, or call **763-706-3727**.
