It's Not Just Books, You Can Now Check Out Park Passes

The Columbia Heights Public Library is participating in a DNR program allowing library patrons to check out a seven-day park pass just like checking out any other item with their library card. The library has three passes it can check out at any given time, one per patron. Checked-out passes become available again after seven days.

These passes allow for access at any Minnesota state park without having to pay a fee. Just make sure to display the pass on your dashboard in a visible location when you're at the park before the pass expires. No need to return expired passes.

The Columbia Heights Public Library is one of 117 participating libraries in this program, which is currently funded through 2025.

"This exciting new partnership with the DNR advances the library's mission," said Columbia Heights Library Director Renee Dougherty. "And being, playing, and learning outdoors has tremendous health and educational benefits."

Give Your Storefront a Face Lift! Fill Out an Application For Facade Improvement Grant Funding and Submit to City Hall



Lowell's Auto Repair, at 4457 University Ave NE, was a participant in the 2022 Façade Improvement Grant Program. The business, with assistance from the grant funding, replaced siding, painted the building, added an awning, and replaced windows. Above are before and after photos. The purpose of the grant program, funded by the Economic Development Authority in collaboration with the Police and Community Development departments, is to encourage businesses and commercial property owners within the City to revitalize, rehabilitate, and restore exterior storefronts. In an effort to reduce crime and enhance safety, the CHPD will also use the grant program to provide monitored surveillance adjacent to participating businesses.



The grant reimburses commercial property owners for eligible improvements up to 50 percent of the total project cost for a maximum reimbursement of \$5,000. If determined by the Police Department that an exterior surveillance system is warranted, the EDA will install surveillance equipment to monitor participating businesses and properties, as well as parks and open spaces. Applicants must be an owner of a commercial property, a commercial tenant with approval from the property owner(s), or a 501(c) (3) organization in the City of Columbia Heights, located along 37th Ave NE, 37th Place NE, 40th Ave NE, University Ave NE, or Central Ave NE. Applications can be found at www.columbiaheightsmn.gov/facade, or at the Community Development office in City Hall during business hours.

Updated Timeline for City Hall, Apartment Complex Mixed-Use Development at Central and 40th

Construction continues on the mixed-use development project at the corner of 3989 Central Ave NE. It will include 266 apartments, a café space, and a new City Hall. Construction began in November 2020 shortly after the former office building on the lot was demolished.

Due to supply chain material and permitting delays, the

opening of the new City Hall has been pushed back from November 2022 to March 2023. City staff will continue to operate out of the existing building at 590 40th Ave NE until then. The new apartments are still on track to open this fall. The City Hall space in the new development is owned by the City, like a condo, and, along with the cafe, will take up nearly the entire first floor of the building.

The Columbia Heights City manager's proposed 2023 budget is available for review online at www.columbia-heightsmn.gov. Click on "Finance" under "Departments" and then click on "Budget and Financial Reports." The proposed budget and tax levy will be provided to the Columbia Heights City Council at its Aug 22 meeting, as required by the



City's Charter. After a proposed 2023 budget is initially approved by the City Council in September, it will go through a series of reviews before a final budget is ratified by the council at a public hearing Dec 12. Prior to that public hearing, the Anoka County Auditor will mail each property owner a Truth-in-Taxation notice of the proposed 2023 property taxes for their specific property.

PAY ONLINE — Last year, the City of Columbia Heights launched a new utility billing website with pay online tools. Just visit **www.columbiaheightsmn.gov/billing.** The City of Columbia Heights bills quarterly for water, sewer, storm sewer, garbage, recycling, and yard waste. Water and sewer charges are a combination of fixed quarterly fees, plus a variable charge for the volume of water passing through the meter installed at your property.

Fall and Winter Parking Reminder

As we approach the colder months, the CHPD would like to remind residents of the City's winter parking rules. From Nov 1 to March 31, vehicles cannot be parked on City streets from 2 am to 6 am, per City ordinance. This ensures streets can be plowed on short notice and guarantee enough space for emergency vehicles to pass through.

Don't Let Your Car Run Unattended

Leaving your car running unattended, even for a few seconds, is an open invitation to auto theft. The majority of stolen vehicles in the City involve vehicles that were left running with keys in the ignition. Leaving your vehicle running unattended is also an ordinance violation (remote start features exempt). Please help the CHPD combat auto theft. Take the keys out of your vehicle, lock your car, and remove any valuables from inside.

Free Smoke Alarms for Columbia Heights and Hilltop Homeowners

Working smoke alarms cut the risk of dying in reported home fires by almost half. When smoke alarms fail. it's often because batteries were missing or disconnected. Test all alarms monthly, replace batteries once a year, and replace any alarm that's over 10 years old. Smoke alarms should be installed inside each



bedroom, outside bedrooms, and on every level of the home. The Columbia Heights Fire Department has partnered with the American Red Cross to offer FREE smoke alarms and alarm installation for Columbia Heights and Hilltop residents. Help Columbia Heights Win the Adopt-A-Drain Challenge!

Columbia Heights is currently winning the Community Adopt-a-Drain Challenge! The challenge, now in its second year, is a competition from March to October among Andover, Blaine, Columbia Heights, and Fridley. The cities compete to see which one can get the most storm drain adoptions and drain cleaning reports submitted to mn. adopt-a-drain.org. Cities and individuals win prizes. Debris removal is especially important in September and October because of fallen leaves. Leaves contain nutrients that fuel destructive algal blooms the next summer. Removing leaves from drains keeps our waters healthy and prevents street flooding. Adopt a drain at mn.adopt-a-drain.org.

Fall Street Sweeping Begins Soon, Refrain from Street Parking When Possible

The Street Department will begin street sweeping in late September and continue as long as weather permits. A reminder to all property owners: it is against City ordinance to deposit litter, including leaves and other yard waste, and snow, into public streets. Please avoid parking on streets if you can. Watch for "No Parking" signage.

Waste Management Update and Online Request Form

City Offers Temporary Alternative Options During Ongoing Service Delays

Early this summer, Waste Management informed the City that curbside bagged and bundled yard-waste service would be halted indefinitely due to driver shortage. This also affected St. Paul, Stillwater, Vadnais Heights, Little Canada, St. Anthony, and Robbinsdale. Compost carts should still be emptied as sched-



uled. For the time-being, the City arranged alternative curbside pick up of yard waste, allowing for weekly yard waste collections for properties that notify the City.

Residents must request the service at www.columbiaheightsmn.gov/refusesupport, or call 763-706-3727 by noon on Mondays prior to the Tuesday or Wednesday pick ups. Additionally, a yard waste roll box at 3735 Madison St is available for residents to drop yard waste bags and bundles into for the next few weeks. These alternative options are temporary. Two Candidates Running for Mayor, Four in the Race for Council Nov 8

For the Nov 8 General Election, two candidates are running for the open Columbia Heights mayoral seat, and four are running for the two at-large council openings. The mayoral term lasts two years and council terms last four years. Mayoral candidates are Cliff Johnson and Amáda Márquez Simula. The four candidates running for council are Rachel James, John Murzyn, Nick Novitsky, and Justice Spriggs. The top two vote getters in that race will fill the two atlarge council positions. A mayor and council candidate forum sponsored by the League of Women Voters, ABC, is scheduled for 6 pm, Sept 19. It will be broadcast live on channels 16 and 19, streamed online, and recorded for playback. A recording will also be available on YouTube later that week.
