

1. Do you feel the Cottonwood County Sheriff's Office should use body worn video cameras in our community?




2. Do you generally believe that body worn video cameras could help increase community trust in law enforcement?




- 4. Do you believe the behavior of the deputy would be improved if the deputy is wearing a body camera?


5. In your opinion, do you believe most members of the community are in favor of deputies using body worn video cameras in Cottonwood County?




6. Do you believe most deputies are in favor of using body worn video cameras in Cottonwood County?




7. When do you feel a deputy should activate a body worn camera? 172 responses

8. Do you feel that body worn video footage should be primarily? 172 responses




- Public. Able to be released and viewed by anyone.
