## Fairness Ordinance and Human **Rights Commission**



City Council recently passed Ordinance 2021-2, a Fairness Ordinance intended to prohibit certain discriminatory practices within the city, to create an o f atmosphere u t u a 1

understanding and respect between all residents and to promote fair treatment and equal opporrtunity for all. The ordinance prohibits discrimination in regards to race, color, religion, national origin, sex, disability, sexual orientation, age, gender identity or familial status in matters related to public accomodation, employment and housing. This ordinance also set forth the establishment of a Human Rights Comission, consisting of three of our residents and an alternate. Commision shall be of appointed by the Mayor and approved by Council.
