### A Message from Villa Hills Police Chief Bryan Allen

Residents and Community of Crescent Springs:

Hello! My name is Bryan Allen and I am the Chief of Police for the City of Villa Hills. Crescent Springs has recently contracted with us for Police Services for you. The people of this department are committed to providing police service of the highest level possible to your community. We are excited to serve the citizens of Crescent Springs!

Please note that we are an accredited department! This means that we pass an inspection from the Kentucky Association of Police Chiefs every five years. Villa Hills is one of only six agencies in the state to have received accreditation six times! In addition, our officers are sworn law enforcement officials and must complete yearly training in excess of 40 hours at the Department Of Criminal Justice Training, located at Eastern Kentucky University. Training covers a wide variety of skills and techniques, including hostage negotiations, drug enforcement and traffic control.

Our wish is to make a positive difference in your community by providing effective and efficient police services. We recognize that to be successful, we must maintain a positive relationship with the citizens and the community. We place value in finding ways to include everyone in our community events. We will work with the school to provide programs and a safe environment for the students.

You have many upcoming community events, such as Music Fest and Christmas in the Park! We will work diligently to provide a safe and positive atmosphere. Please remember that it will not truly be a community event unless the community itself joins in, one and all.

We feel that we are all one community. This will be reflected on our cruisers. Instead of the words, "Also

Serving", you will see "Villa Hills/Crescent Springs Police" emblazoned on the side of our vehicles. We do this to show inclusiveness and to demonstrate our commitment to Crescent Springs.

We ask that you assist us in this transition. Please call to report any issues or concerns that arise, no matter how small. No matter is unimportant! The members of our agency ask for feedback to help us continue to improve.

Please note that the change of agencies happens officially on June 27th at 10:00am. The number for emergencies is **911**, just as it always has been. For non emergencies, contact the Kenton County Emergency Communications Center at (859) 356-3191. For all administrative needs, please contact our office at (859) 341-3535. The office is located at 719 Rogers Road. Contact us at any time! In addition, you can request a police report from the Crescent Springs city office as well.

Our job is not limited to preventing and deterring crime. Community based programs are the heartbeat of any modern department! As an example, we are hoping to begin self defense courses for women. 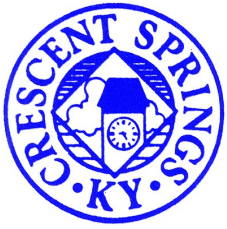
I hope this will be the beginning of a great time in our community. I thank you all for welcoming us!

Please note that shelter occupancy is 80 persons maximum. We cannot accommodate larger parties. Also, music is permitted but the volume needs to be maintained at a level not to disturb the surrounding residents. Saturdays and Sundays are quite popular and slots are taken quickly.
