Summer Safety for Your Swimming Pool

As summer heats up, getting a chance to cool off and have some fun at a pool or lake may be your first thought! If so, please keep these tips in mind!

- Be aware of the dangers of stray voltage
- Always swim with a buddy
- Have children take swimming lessons as soon as possible
- Avoid drains, pipes or holes in pools and spas
- No "horseplay or rough housing"
- Have a designated swim monitor
- Don't dive in shallow or murky water
- When available, swim near a lifeguard
- Learn CPR and stay up to date on certification
- Avoid alcohol or use it responsibly
- Don't leave inflatable toys in the pool (they tempt little ones!)
- Remember, sunblock saves lives, too!

Clean Up

There will no longer be monthly Clean Up events!

Kenton County will have a Spring Clean Up event on May 2nd, 3rd and 4th. Throughout the year, you can get a voucher to take your items to the Bavarian Landfill, 12764 McCoy Fork Road, Walton, at no cost. There is an additional fee of \$5.00 for mattresses. To get a voucher, you will need a valid Kenton County ID and a copy of your trash bill. The addresses must be the same! For condo residents, your refuse bill will most likely be in your HOA bill. As always, materials such as oil or antifreeze can be taken to the Kenton County Public Works garage, located at 420 Independence Station Road during normal business hours. Please note that these services are NOT available for commercial use; residential only! If you have questions about dates, times or materials that will be accepted, please call the Kenton County Public Works Solid Waste Coordinator at (859) 392-1920. Locations for recycling drop off in Kenton County include Pioneer Park located on Madison Pike, Lincoln Ridge Park located at 420 Independence Station Road and at the Ryland City Building on Decoursey Pike. Community Improvement Survey

In February, residents were asked what projects or improvements they would like to see for the city. We have received many responses and would like to share this information with you and provide some feedback.

Anderson & Bromley-Crescent Springs Roads

One of the biggest concerns from the survey responses appears to be Anderson and Bromley Crescent Springs Roads. Please realize these roads belong to the State of Kentucky and are maintained by Kenton County. The City shares your concerns and we are working with Kenton County to ensure road improvements are close at hand. Kenton County has received federal grant money for the "Bromley-Crescent Springs Road Project". This will include a new road and an eight foot wide multiuse path that will run from Amsterdam to Short Amsterdam on the left side of the road. The County has partnered with the cities of Crescent Springs and Fort Mitchell in order to fully fund the project. Right-of-way acquisition should begin in mid-July and the county is hoping this as well as utility relocation may occur at the same time. Roadwork, plus the addition of a sidewalk, is scheduled to begin in 2020.

Requested Projects

There were many requests for what the city would consider large projects. Suggestions included public meetings rooms or a community center, new streets and infrastructure in the old part of town and more outdoor recreational areas such as a dog park or walking trails.

Smaller project ideas included more attractive street signs, benches/shelter at bus stops and more beautification efforts such as the large flower planters.

The City has been considering some of these ideas and it helps to see that the residents are in favor of them.

Economic Development

The City's Economic Development Committee has been given your wish list for new restaurants and businesses. While the City cannot control which businesses come to Crescent Springs, we can definitely communicate the interests of the residents to developers and property managers.

Litter/Blight/Recycling

Litter, blight and recycling were mentioned quite a bit in the responses.

Your Public Works Department works diligently to clean up litter in our park and the right-of-ways along Buttermilk Pike. It is the owners responsibility to maintain and keep their property litter free. Please help us in keeping our city clean by insuring your residence or business is free of litter as well.

The City now has a code enforcement officer. His job is identify any blight and bring it to the attention of the property owner for resolution. Unresolved issues are turned over to Kenton County Planning and Development Services (PDS) where a lack of compliance can lead to liens placed on the blighted property. The City is aware of major blight issues and these issues are being handled by PDS. If an owner will not comply with cleaning up their property, there is a certain legal process that must be followed. This can be a very lengthy process, so please bear with us and PDS while we take the steps necessary to resolve the issues.

Rumpke Waste & Recycling provides trash and recycling services for our residents. Apartment and condo residences currently have the option of taking their recyclables to any of the Kenton County drop off locations listed on the other side.
