1. Ratification of Physical Inventory for Fiscal Year 2023

Ms. Holguin addressed Council and read a memorandum into the record, requesting Council's ratification to complete all requirements of the City's inventory certification process.

2. Resolution: To Approve the FY23 Final Quarter Financial Report

Ms. Holguin read the resolution for the record and explained that the report reflect the actual figures for fiscal year 2023. Ms. Holguin placed an emphasis on the ending cash; noting that cannabis tax received was \$89,000; Gross Receipts Tax was a total of \$16 million; noting also on page 1, fund 27000 stating that it is a special fund which was created and that there hasn't been a decision made on what it will be expended on.

Mayor Pro Tem Topham asked Council if they had any questions of if they were prepared to make a motion.

Councilor Rodriguez made a motion to approve the resolution, as submitted; motion second by Councilor Milo; motion carried by the following roll call vote:

3. Resolution: To Approve the FY 23 Final Budget Adjustments

Ms. Holguin read the resolution for the record and explained that she keeps the City's budget the same and if there is a need to adjust, funds are moved between line items, if possible. Ms. Holguin stated that line item transfers do not require approval all changes are presented at fiscal year end for the consideration of approval.

Ms. Holguin highlighted the gas fund on page 7, stating that the adjustment was due to the City absorbing the elevated gas bill costs for city residents.

Mayor Pro Tem Topham asked if Council had any questions or if they were prepared to make a motion.

Councilor Milo motioned to approve the resolution approving the final budget adjustments for FY23, as presented; motion second by Councilor Rodriguez; motion carried by the following roll call vote:

4. Resolution: To Approve the FY24 Final Budget

Ms. Holguin read the resolution for the record and presented the budget recap for council. Ms. Holguin reminded council that the budget includes the items that were reviewed during the budget workshop. Ms. Holguin discussed the decreases and increases in funds with an emphasis on the following funds:

There was an increase in transfers out from the general fund to EDC under community building, due to beginning cash balance at year end; transfer of \$100,000.00 to airport, due to cash balance; and addition of \$200,000 for land acquisition in the executive budget; decrease of \$250,000 on water park detail as it was completed in FY 23; increase of \$5,000 for police overtime for driving tests; an increase for full time positions by \$330,952 for the difference in cash balance in the American Rescue Act Fund, this would be the final year; and an increase of \$200,000 for lighting at the Kmart building.

Mayor Pro Tem Topham asked if Council had any questions or if they were prepared to make a motion.

Councilor Rodriguez motioned to approve the resolution approving the final budget for fiscal year 2024, as presented; motion second by Councilor Milo;

Mr. Sera asked Council to also approve that the Mayor and City Administrator have the authority to sign all necessary documents to purchase property approved within the proposed budget.

Councilor Rodriguez made a friendly amendment to her motion, to add that the Mayor and City Administrator be authorized to sign all necessary documents related to the purchase of property included within the presented budget; friendly amendment second by Councilor Milo; motion carried by the following roll call vote:

5. Intent to Adopt Solar Energy as Additional Source of Power for City of Deming Power Consumption

Mr. Sera stated that the letter will be sent to a consultant company that will find vendors to get funded in doing so.
