#### PARTICIPATION IN MUNICIPAL ARTERIAL PROGRAM ADMINISTERED BY NEW MEXICO DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION

**WHEREAS**, the City Of Deming and the New Mexico Department of Transportation enter into a Cooperative MAP Agreement.

**WHEREAS**, the total cost of the project will be \$240,000 to be funded in proportional share by the parties hereto as follows:

- a. New Mexico Department of Transportation's share shall be 75% or \$180,000 and
- b. City Of Deming's proportional matching share shall be 25% or \$60,000

TOTAL PROJECT COST IS \$240,000

The City of Deming shall pay all costs, which exceed the total amount of \$240,000.

**NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** in official session that The City of Deming\_determines, resolves, and orders as follows:

- That the project for this Cooperative agreement is adopted and has a priority standing.
- The agreement terminates on **June 30, 2024**, and the *City of Deming* incorporates all the agreements, covenants, and understandings between the parties hereto concerning the subject matter hereof, and all such covenants, agreements and understandings have been merged into the written agreement.

# CITY OF DEMING RESOLUTION NO. 22-20

### A RESOLUTION IN SUPPORT OF A PARTNERSHIP BY MOU WITH DEMING-LUNA COUNTY MAINSTREET

WHEREAS, the City of Deming supports the revitalization and economic re-development of its historic commercial core; and

WHEREAS, the City desires to maintain an economically vital and vibrant town center for its residents, visitors and tourists; and

WHEREAS, the City sees an economically healthy downtown as one of its critical assets; and

WHEREAS, the City realizes that a sustainable town center economy contributes to the community's economic health; and

WHEREAS, the City recognizes its traditional commercial core as representing the unique history and culture of our community; and

WHEREAS, the City wishes to maintain a livable, walkable town center with opportunities to shop, work, live and discover recreational, cultural and heritage opportunities; and

WHEREAS, the City wishes to pursue a partnership with a local MainStreet non- profit economic re-development organization through the NM Economic Development Department's New Mexico MainStreet Program (NMMS), to invest in enhancing the quality of life for the community's citizens via the implementation of asset-based economic development strategies under the Main Street Four Points Approach®, and

WHEREAS, the City partnership with the Deming-Luna County MainStreet Program may leverage technical assistance and other resources through the New Mexico NMMS (the nationally licensed and accredited state coordinating program in the state of New Mexico), to support the economic re-development and revitalization of the Deming MainStreet district, then

### BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL/COMMISSION/TRUSTEES, THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF DEMING:

- 1. The City of Deming agrees to work with the New Mexico Economic Development Department's New Mexico MainStreet Program dedicating resources and financial support to create a successful downtown economic development program through strategies established by the National Main Street Center's Economic Transformation Strategies and the Main Street Four-Point Approach®.
- 2. The City of Deming commits to work collaboratively with the Deming MainStreet Program and the New Mexico Economic Development Department's MainStreet Program to meet the standards and principles of revitalizing and re-developing the core commercial district of the

community, contracting with the local MainStreet organization to coordinate and administer activities for the City of Deming as set forth in biennial MOU and a separate "services contract" with the local MainStreet organization.

- 3. The City of Deming commits to provide philosophical, financial, planning and coordination assistance for the Deming MainStreet Program to support operations and projects under the specifications of the biennial MOU and a separate "services contract" with the local MainStreet organization.
- 4. The term of this resolution shall be deemed effective for the life of the MOU, for a two-year period commencing July 1, 2022.

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED,** that the Mayor and Council of the City of Deming, New Mexico, support the reasonable efforts of the local MainStreet organization; and

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the City Administrator/Clerk or his duly authorized officers and agents are hereby authorized and directed to take all steps necessary to carry out the purposes and intent of this resolution.

### RESOLUTION NO. 22-

CALLING A BOND ELECTION TO BE HELD IN THE CITY OF DEMING ON NOVEMBER 8, 2022, IN CONJUNCTION WITH THE GENERAL ELECTION FOR THE PURPOSE OF VOTING ON THE ISSUANCE OF GENERAL OBLIGATION STREET IMPROVEMENT BONDS IN AN AGGREGATE PRINCIPAL AMOUNT OF \$5,000,000, DESCRIBING THE PURPOSE TO WHICH THE BOND PROCEEDS WOULD BE PUT; PROVIDING THE FORM OF THE BOND QUESTION; PROVIDING FOR NOTICE OF THE ELECTION; PRESCRIBING OTHER DETAILS IN CONNECTION WITH SUCH ELECTION AND BONDS; AND RATIFYING ACTION PREVIOUSLY TAKEN IN CONNECTION THEREWITH.

WHEREAS, the City Council (the "Governing Body") of the City of Deming (the "City") in Luna County and State of New Mexico, hereby determines that it is necessary and in the best interests of the City and its inhabitants to incur indebtedness in the principal amounts and for the purposes provided herein; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with the provisions of Sections 6-15-1, 1-22-3(C) and 1-16-3(B) NMSA 1978, the Governing Body acting by and through the City Clerk has forwarded in writing to the County Clerk, Secretary of State and Local Government Division of the Department of Finance and Administration a notice of the bond election as described herein; and

WHEREAS, the Governing Body has the power to call a bond election to be held in conjunction with the general election on November 8, 2022 for the purpose of submitting one question of incurring indebtedness to the qualified electorate of the City pursuant to applicable laws of the State of New Mexico, and pursuant to Article IX, Section 12 of the New Mexico Constitution; and

WHEREAS, the Governing Body hereby determines and declares that the project (the "Project") for which the question of issuing the City's general obligation bonds (the "Bond Election Question") as set forth herein, are for public purposes and no bond election has been held on the Bond Election Question during the year immediately preceding the date established for the election.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF DEMING:

Section 1. All action, not inconsistent with the provisions of this Resolution, heretofore taken by the Governing Body and the officers of the City directed toward the Project described in the Bond Election Question, including, without limiting the generality of the foregoing, the calling and holding of a bond election to authorize the issuance of general

obligation bonds (the "Bonds") to finance the Project, is ratified, approved and confirmed.

- Section 2. The bond election (the "Election") shall be held in the City of Deming on November 8, 2022, as part of the statewide general election scheduled for that date.
- Section 3. At the Election the following question shall be submitted to the City's qualified electors:

STREET IMPROVEMENT BONDS - Shall the City of Deming issue up to \$5,000,000 of general obligation bonds, to be repaid from property taxes, for the purpose of installing and repairing street lights, constructing, repairing, and otherwise improving municipal alleys, streets, public roads and bridges, or any combination thereof?

Section 4. The polls for the Election will open at 7:00 a.m. Mountain Standard Time on Tuesday, November 8, 2022, and will close at 7:00 p.m. Mountain Standard Time on the same day. All of the precincts shall be consolidated, and any voter (except absentee voters) may vote in any consolidated precinct. The polling places for such consolidated precinct shall be as follows:

- Section 5. Absentee Ballots will be available for this Election and can be obtained by contacting the Office of the County Clerk. Absentee voting in person will be conducted in the Office of the County Clerk at 700 S. Silver Ave., Deming, beginning on Monday, October 11, 2022, and ending at 5:00 p.m. on Friday, November 5, 2022. Voting is conducted during regular business hours, which is Monday through Friday, 8:00 a.m. 5:00 p.m.
- Section 6. The casting of votes by qualified electors at the polling places, including the Absentee polling place, shall be cast on a marksense ballot used on optical-scan vote-tabulating machines.

- Section 7. The City's qualified electors are eligible to vote on the Bond Election Question. No judge or clerk of the election shall allow a person to vote unless he or she is duly registered as a voter.
- Section 8. All persons desiring to vote at the Election must be registered to vote. Any person who is otherwise qualified to vote and who is not currently registered may register at the Luna County Clerk's Office on or before 5:00 p.m. on Friday, October 11, 2022 or in person during early voting and on election day.
- Section 9. The vote shall be canvassed as provided in the Election Code Chapter 1 of NMSA 1978, and Sections 6-15-1 et seq. NMSA 1978, the County Clerk shall certify the results of the Election, Secretary of State issues certificate of election, and the County Clerk shall file the certificate of canvass in the official minute book of the County.
- Section 10. This Resolution shall be submitted to the County Clerk for certification of the local government ballot question to the Secretary of State. The Secretary of State shall issue and file a proclamation in the English and Spanish languages calling for the general election. After receipt, the County Clerk shall publish those portions of the proclamation relevant to the City at least once not less than seventy-five days before the day of the Election in a newspaper or newspapers which maintain an office in and are of general circulation in the City and which otherwise qualify as legal newspapers in the City. The portions of the proclamation relevant to the City shall be posted not less than seventy-five days before the day of the Election on the City's website. The County Clerk shall post the entire proclamation on the County Clerk's website along with the notice of which municipalities in the county are conducting elections. The City Clerk is hereby instructed and authorized to carry out this provision. The County Clerk is hereby instructed and authorized to carry out this provision.
- Section 11. The officers of the City are hereby authorized and directed, for and on behalf of the City, to take all action necessary or appropriate to effectuate the provisions of this Resolution, including, without limiting the generality of the foregoing, the preparation of affidavits, instructions, purchasing election supplies, and the publication of notices.
- Section 12. If any section, paragraph, clause or provision of this Resolution shall for any reason be held to be invalid or unenforceable, the invalidity or unenforceability of such section, paragraph, clause or provision shall not affect any of the remaining provisions of this resolution.
- Section 13. All bylaws, orders, resolutions and ordinances, or parts thereof, inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed to the extent only of such inconsistency. This repealer shall not be construed to revive any bylaw, order, resolution or ordinance, or parts thereof, heretofore repealed.

# 7. Quasi-Judicial Public Hearing: To consider a Special Use Permit to Build a Solar Facility on Skyview Rd by John Smith, within the city limits

Mayor Jasso conducted a quasi-judicial public hearing to consider a Special Use Permit to Build a Solar Facility on Skyview Rd by John Smith, located within the City limits.

Mayor Jasso asked if all hearing notices were posted properly. Ms. Valdez confirmed.

Mayor Jasso called the hearing to order and asked if Council had any conflicts of interest; they did not.

Mr. Camfield, City Planner, presented the item to Council stating that the applicant, on behalf of Bowlin South PVC I, LLC, wishes to build a 5 MW solar facility on 45 acres of private land. Mr. Camfield stated that after further review and receiving the dust control plan from the developer, staff is requesting that Council consider the following conditions listed should the approval be granted which would warrant the revocation of the special use permit.

- 1. A violation of zoning ordinances and/or the special use permit
- 2. Should the project be abandoned, the land must be returned to the original state at onset
- 3. Non-compliance with the submitted dust control plan which identifies control measures to be used

Mayor Jasso asked if staff or Council had any questions. They did not.

Mayor Jasso asked if the applicant would like to make a statement.

Mr. Luxenburg addressed Council on behalf of the applicant and stated that there will be discounts offered to the subscribers; stated that the dust control has been addressed with the plan; and stated that they are in agreement with all standards.

Mayor Jasso asked if Council had any questions for the applicant's agent; they did not. Mayor Jasso asked if there were any affected parties that would like to speak.

Mr. Reedy addressed Council stating he is opposed; adding that there is no way to reduce the dust pleading with Council to vote on the item as if it were their property adjacent to the proposed location. Mr. Reedy stated that he had conferred with two brokers who informed that property value would be affected. Mr. Reedy stated that he has consulted with an attorney who stated that the City did not have to approve the special use permit for a solar project.

Mr. Holdridge addressed Council stating his support for the project.

Mayor Jasso asked if there were any other parties that would like to speak.

Ms. Schiffner addressed Council stating she was opposed to the project; concerns included animal habitats.

Ms. McDonald addressed Council stating she was opposed to the project; concerns included recycling of materials.

Mr. Dirk addressed Council stating he was opposed to the project; concerns included dust.

Ms. Harman addressed Council stating she was opposed to the project; concerns included property values and destruction of the beauty of the land.

- Looking to install cameras downtown through grant funding; PNM grant was applied for by Cassie and the City matched it with \$5,000; Police Dept. is also working on obtaining grants
- The speed stop signs have been placed out and are deterring speeding; they were obtained with grant funds
