3. Presentation of Certificate of Appreciation to James Teeter

Mayor Jasso presented a certificate of appreciation to Mr. Teeter and thanked him for his service to the community.

4. Swearing in of Deming Fire Department Personnel

Chief Owen asked to have this postponed for now due to the uprise in Covid cases and the exposure to department personnel and their families.

5. Mayoral Appointment of Assistant Chief/Chief of Police

Mayor Jasso announced the resignation of Chief Alex Valdespino thanking him for his years of service to the City of Deming and the community. Mayor Jasso requested City Council's approval to appoint Clint Hogan as Assistant Chief of Police until September 30, 2021, during which time he would mirror Chief Valdespino to become better prepared to fulfill the requirements of the position; Mayor Jasso also requested Council's approval to appoint Clint Hogan as the Chief of Police upon Chief Valdespino's retirement date of October 1, 2021.

Councilor Cruz motioned to approve the Mayor's appointment of Clint Hogan to Assistant Chief of Police through September 30, 2021 and the appointment to Chief of Police to be effective on October 1, 2021, as submitted; Mayor Pro Tem Milo second the motion; motion carried by the following roll call vote:

6. Resolution: To Approve the 2023-2027 Infrastructure Capital Improvement Plan (ICIP)

Mr. Sera stated that there had been staff meetings to discuss projects including, an inflatable water park at Trees Lake; budgeting for a property purchase on the west side of town; recreational trails; continued work at Tulip Drive landfill in which funding would be sought for the projects that are listed on the ICIP.

Mayor Pro Tem Milo asked if legislation has helped with prior projects. Mr. Sera stated that there is a great working relationship between the City and State Representatives and Senators which have resulted in attaining funding for many projects. Mr. Sera stated that the top five (5) projects will be discussed with Senator Diamond and State Representative Sweetser for possible funding opportunities; adding that there is a lot of Capital Outlay funding.

8. Public Hearing: To Consider the Amendment of Title 6, Section 1D-8 of the Municipal Code Pertaining to the Possession of Marijuana/Cannabis

Mayor Jasso conducted a public hearing to consider the amendment of Title 6, Section 1D-8 of the Municipal Code pertaining to the possession of marijuana/cannabis.

Mr. Sera explained that this ordinance and the following two are presented to be aligned with the Cannabis Act which the State of New Mexico passed.

Councilor Cruz asked if the possession was for those under 21. Mr. Sera confirmed.

B. PRECOLLECTION/COLLECTION PRACTICES:

2. The front of the cart should face the street with the cart's handle facing the residence. Place cart(s) curbside no later than seven o'clock (7:00) A.M. on the designated collection day, unless otherwise directed by the public works department or its duly authorized agent.

C. COLLECTION DAY:

1. On the day curbside collection is scheduled for any premises, poly cart may be placed according to the setbacks noted under subsection B, "Pre-collection/Collection Practices", of this section or unless otherwise specified by the public works director or duly authorized agent. Residents shall place the poly cart at the designated location no earlier than twelve (12) to sixteen (16) hours prior to the scheduled collection day. When there is more than one poly cart at a residence, poly carts must be separated a minimum of thirty-six inches (36") for ease of operation. Poly carts stacked side by side will not be picked up and an additional pick-up charge will be applicable. Poly cart(s), when placed at the designated location, shall not interfere with pedestrian or vehicular traffic. Place cart(s) curbside no later than seven o'clock (7:00) A.M. on the designated collection day. It shall be the responsibility of the resident to deliver the poly carts to such point for collection and return the empty containers from such points to the usual place of storage, within twenty- four (24) hours of collecting. No items, bagged, bundled or otherwise, may be placed for pick up outside, adjacent to, or on top of the poly cart.

6-1D-8: POSSESSION OF CANNABIS / MARIJUANA:

DEFINITIONS As used in this chapter:

CANNABIS/MARIJUANA – All parts of the plant genus Cannabis containing a delta-9-tetrahydrocannabinol concentration of more than three-tenths percent of a dry weight basis, weather growing or not; the seeds of the plant; the resin extracted from any part of the plant; and every compound, manufacture, salt, derivative, mixture or preparation of the plant, its seeds, or its resin.

CONSUMER: means a person twenty-one years of age or older who purchases, acquires, owns, possesses, or uses a cannabis product for a purpose other than resale.

A. Prohibition: In accordance with the "Cannabis Regulation Act", It is unlawful for any person that is not a consumer to possess, consume, sell and/or purchase cannabis/marijuana within the city limits.

AMENDING TITLE 12, CHAPTER 4 "USE DISTRICT REGULATIONS" WITH THE ADDITION OF SUBSECTION Q. "CANNABIS ZONING REGULATIONS" OF THE CITY OF DEMING MUNICIPAL CODE

An ordinance amending the City Code of Deming, New Mexico, providing for certain zoning restrictions.

WHEREAS, in accordance with the New Mexico State Cannabis Regulation Act, signed into legislation by Governor Michelle L Grisham on April 12, 2021, the City Council of the City of Deming provides certain zoning and use restrictions concerning cannabis/marijuana.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Deming, New Mexico, as follows:

12-4-01: DEFINITIONS:

As used in this chapter:

CANNABIS – All parts of the plant genus Cannabis containing a delta-9-tetrahydrocannabinol concentration of more than three-tenths percent of a dry weight basis, weather growing or not; the seeds of the plant; the resin extracted from any part of the plant; and every compound, manufacture, salt, derivative, mixture or preparation of the plant, its seeds or its resin; and does not include the mature stalks of the plant; fiber produced from the stalks; oil or cake made from the seeds of the plant; any other compound, manufacture, salt, derivative, mixture or preparation of the mature stalks, fiber, oil or cake; or the sterilized seed of the plant that is incapable of germination; or the weight of any other ingredient combined with cannabis products to prepare topical or oral administrations, food, drink or another product.

ANNABIS CONSUPTION AREA: means an area where cannabis products may be served and consumed so long as the establishment is not licensed to serve alcoholic beverages.

HOMEGROWN: means grown or made for purposes that are not dependent or conditioned upon the provision or receipt of financial consideration

HOUSEHOLD: means a housing unit and includes any place in or around the housing unit at which an occupant of the housing unit produces, manufactures, keeps, or stores homegrown cannabis or homemade cannabis products

IMMATURE CANNABIS PLANT: means a cannabis plant that has no observable flowers or buds.

POSSESSION: The state of having, owning, or controlling something; an item of property; something belonging to an individual.

PUBLIC PLACE: means a place to which the general public has access and includes hallways, lobbies and other parts of apartment houses and hotels that do not constitute rooms or apartments designed for actual residence; highways; streets; schools; places of amusement; parks; playgrounds; and places used in connection with public passenger transportation.

12-4-Q2: POSSESSION AND GROWING OF PERSONAL PLANTS:

A. Pursuant to the Cannabis Regulation Act, a person is allowed a limited amount of 6 mature plants and 6 immature cannabis plants that are homegrown, with a household limit of 12 plants, not to be exceeded.

12-4-Q2: CONSUMPTION IN PUBLIC AND WITHIN ESTABLISHMENTS

- A. Consumption will only be allowed for establishments that meet the following criteria
 - 1. Areas that are strictly limited to persons over 21 years of age
 - 2. Establishment is located at a minimum distance of 300 feet from a daycare center or school; and
 - 3. The establishment is not licensed to sell alcoholic beverages.
- B. In compliance with the Dee Johnson Clean Air Act
 - 1. Establishments, that meet the criteria in Section A, shall establish a smoke free area that extends a reasonable distance from any entrances, windows and ventilation systems to any enclosed areas where smoking is prohibited. The reasonable distance shall be a distance sufficient to ensure that persons entering or leaving the building or facility shall not be subjected to breathing tobacco smoke and to ensure that tobacco smoke does not enter the building or facility through entrances, windows, ventilation systems or any other means." NMSA24-16-13, 2007
- C. Consumption in Public Places, as per the definition above, shall be prohibited.

AMENDING TITLE 3 WITH THE ADDITION OF CHAPTER 14 "MEDICAL AND RECREATIONAL CANNABIS ESTABLISHMENT REGULATIONS" OF THE CITY OF DEMING MUNICIPAL CODE

An ordinance amending the City Code of Deming, New Mexico, provision for medical and recreational cannabis establishments.

WHEREAS, in accordance with the New Mexico State Cannabis Regulation Act, signed into legislation by Governor Michelle L Grisham on April 12, 2021, the City Council of the City of Deming provides regulations for the operation of cannabis/marijuana establishments.

3-14-1: DEFINITIONS As used in this chapter:

CANNABIS – All parts of the plant genus Cannabis containing a delta-9-tetrahydrocannabinol concentration of more than three-tenths percent of a dry weight basis, weather growing or not; the seeds of the plant; the resin extracted from any part of the plant; and every compound, manufacture, salt, derivative, mixture or preparation of the plant, its seeds, or its resin.

CANNABIS ESTABLISHMENT – Includes medical producers, producers, consumption areas, testing and research laboratories, couriers, producers, manufacturers, microbusinesses, training programs, retailers, integrated cannabis microbusiness, and vertically integrated cannabis. A business organization, whether for profit or not for profit dealing with the production, sale, or distribution of cannabis.

CONSUMER: means a person twenty-one years of age or older who purchases, acquires, owns, possesses, or uses a cannabis product for a purpose other than resale.

CANNABIS CONSUPTION AREA: means an area where cannabis products may be served and consumed so long as the establishment is not licensed to serve alcoholic beverages.

CANNABIS COURIER: means a person that transports cannabis products to qualified patients, primary caregivers or reciprocal participants or directly to consumers

3-14-2: LICENSE PROCESS

- A. Retail establishments will be allowed to operate within the limits of the City of Deming once approved through a special use permit process, which requires a public hearing.
 - 1. Special Use Applications shall include the following information:
 - a. NM State Permit Application and/or approval
 - b. Security Plan as submitted to the State of New Mexico
 - c.A map of proposed business location identifying surrounding retail and/or dispensary establishments and their distance; and the distance from the nearest daycare centers and schools to be at a minimum distance of 300 feet.

d.A fee of \$225.00 pursuant to Municipal Code 12-13-1

- B. Once an establishment is approved, the following applies:
 - 1. An approved State of New Mexico License is required, annually, to continue in operation.
 - 2. The location of the establishment remains the same; if location should change, a subsequent special use permit will be required.

3-14-3: APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS AND FEE

- A. Application provided by the City of Deming to include, NM Business Tax ID Number, location of proposed business, detailed description of the nature of business.
- B. NM State Permit Application and/or approval
- C. Map of proposed establishment location
- D. Security plan
- E. Business Registration Fee of \$35.00 is required per location

3-14-4: CONSUMPTION IN PUBLIC AND WITHIN ESTABLISHMENTS

- A. Consumption will only be allowed for establishments that meet the following criteria
 - 1. Areas that are strictly limited to persons over 21 years of age
 - 2. Establishment is located at a minimum distance of 300 feet from a daycare center or school; and
 - 3. The establishment is not licensed to sell alcoholic beverages.
- B. In compliance with the Dee Johnson Clean Air Act
 - 1. Establishments, that meet the criteria in Section A, shall establish a smoke free area that extends a reasonable distance from any entrances, windows and ventilation systems to any enclosed areas where smoking is prohibited. The reasonable distance shall be a distance sufficient to ensure that persons entering or leaving the building or facility shall not be subjected to breathing tobacco smoke and to ensure that tobacco smoke does not enter the building or facility through entrances, windows, ventilation systems or any other means."
