DPW, UTILITIES, MECHANIC REPORTS:

Utilities Foreman: He stated that the shut off policy needs to be discussed and possibly changed. He said one fire hydrant has been changed but that several others still need changing as well. He said that they are in the process of winterizing everything.

Mechanic: He said that he received the parts for the street sweeper so that is running again. He also stated several other items that were maintained this month.

DPW Foreman: He stated that most of the library has been finished. He replaced the water heater at City Hall and the skate park has been sealed. Mayor McDonough stated that the golf cart is too fast and we need to clean out the catch basins after heavy rains.

ITEMS OF BUSINESS:

Presentation: Daniel Harris and Alexander Keiswetter introduced themselves as co-founders of The Woods which is a marijuana business. They gave a brief overview of what they feel are the benefits of allowing a marijuana retail store in the City.

Presentation: Josh Hicks regarding 209 S. Oak Street property. He and his partners with J&J Ag Equipment, LLC explained how they would like to acquire the property at 209 S. Oak Street and bring in their business of repairing/making tractor parts etc. They explained that they would need the cooperation of the City in order to obtain funds for clean-up of the site.

O'Connor moved, Cobley supported to move to submit a Brownsfield letter on behalf of J&J Ag Equipment, LLC to be submitted to the County Coordinator and the Brownfield Board.

Paula Brooks, 104 W. Summit. She commented on housing prices going down, right of way at the 209 S. Oak Street location and cannabis.

Deb White, She commented on cannabis, the sale of 209 S. Oak Street and the edible landscape.

DEPARTMENT HEAD REPORTS:

Fire Chief: He said they had a good turnout at the Harvest Fest. He said that this Wednesday is Safety Day and the Fire Department will be at the elementary schools. October 17th will be the training day in the downtown area.

DPW Director: He said that Rob touched on the Water Shut off issue, more information to come at a later date. Council approved the purchase of 25 trees and he has found homes for most of them. He said that the trees will cost between \$4,000 to 4,500 with the Consumers Energy grant providing \$2,500 of that cost.

Police Chief: He told the Council that the AED's were delivered today and all are up and running. He thanked Riverside Market, Graff Chevrolet and the Mason Lodge for their donations that made this purchase possible.

City Engineer: O'Connor moved, Mayor McDonough supported to close Vinewood Street, open to through traffic, to be maintained in the winter by the City with the contractor supplying materials, with paving to take place in the spring, to include a tap of 60 feet of sanitary sewer off Oak Street.

City Manager: He told the Council that he would be attending the MERS Conference later this week in Grand Rapids with the Treasurer/Clerk and Deputy Clerk.

CITY COUNCIL COMMENTS:

Boggs: He stated that if Light of Faith were to have issues getting into their parking lot due to the Vinewood Street closure that they could use the basement of City Hall. He also stated that when the Council meetings run longer than one and half hours there should be a five minute break.

Cobley: She said that she is pleased with J&J Ag Equipment, LLC. She said that she would volunteer to help get residents to agree to take a tree in their right of way.

O'Connor: He said that the J&J presentation was good. Congratulations to the supervisors for their union contract.

Brands: He said "nice job on the presentation". He asked if a port-a-john could be placed behind the clock tower from spring thru fall for those people who either walk or are helping with the landscape downtown. He asked that the DPW Director give residents extra time to mow their lawns due to all the rain that we have been getting. He thanked the DPW for getting the rocking chairs assembled so quickly.

Folaron: He thanked the guys for their presentation.

Schaefer: He thanked everyone for coming to the meeting.

Mayor McDonough: He said that the festival went well and he does like the idea of having a port-a-john in the downtown. He also said that the City should have a stricter policy on "shut offs". He said that there is a 19 million dollar grow house project coming to Webberville which is going to bring a lot of money to that city.

Boggs moved, Schaefer supported to go into closed session under section 8 subsection A of the Open Meetings Act to discuss the City Manger's evaluation as he has requested a closed session which is exept from disclosure under section 13.1 of the Freedom of Information Act.
