B) MEMORANDUM FROM COMPTROLLER RE: CHANGING TOWN ATTORNEY POSITION TO FULL TIME

Per a request from Comptroller Dawn Donovan, Supervisor Colavita offered a motion that was seconded by Councilman Dooley to approve a RESOLUTION authorizing the change in status and pay of the Town Attorney, effective May 6, 2022, at the annual salary of \$160,000.

On the roll call, all voted "AYE." Motion carried.

C) MEMORANDUM FROM SUPERINTENDENT OF PARKS AND RECREATION RE: REJECTION OF 2022 SUMMER CAMP BUS BID

Supervisor Colavita reviewed a memo submitted by Sally Veltidi, Superintendent of Parks and Recreation, in which she requests that the Town Board reject the bus BID which was received on April 22nd 2022.

Ms. Veltidi states the bus bid was drawn up and sent out to companies based on camp enrollment numbers from 2019, which was the last time we needed a bus bid for camp trips and pool usage. Enrollment numbers for Summer Camp 2022 are different then our traditional numbers such as in 2019 as we have a lot more campers at our younger grades and less campers at our older grades and travel camp. These shift in numbers change the number of buses we need for each camp; therefore, we need to reject the bus BID received on Friday, April 22nd, 2022.

Supervisor Colavita offered a motion that was seconded Councilwoman Marcotte to reject the Bus Bid received on Friday, April 22, 2022.

On the roll call, all voted "AYE." Motion carried.

D) MEMORANDUM FROM SUPERINTENDENT OF PARKS AND RECREATION RE: REQUEST PERMISSION TO RE-BID FOR BUSES FOR THE 2022 CAMP SEASON

Supervisor Colavita reviewed a memo submitted by Sally Veltidi, Superintendent of Parks and Recreation, in which she requests that the Town Board authorize the Eastchester Recreation Department to rebid for the buses for Summer Camp 2022.

Buses will be used for the following:

Three (3) 44-passenger air-conditioned school buses for daily shuttle. Tuesday, June 28th -August 5th, Mondays – Fridays (Not used on July 4th). The buses will be used to transport campers from Greenvale and Anne Hutchinson School to Lake Isle Country Club for daily swimming. Buses will be used between 9:30am-2:30pm.

Three (3) 44-passenger air-conditioned school buses for each of the camp trips for Camp Galaxy Jr. Trips which will depart from Anne Hutchinson School. There will be 9 trips in the tri-state area.

Two (2) 44-passenger air-conditioned school buses for each of the camp trips for & Sr. Trips will depart from Greenvale School. There will be 12 trips in the tri-state area.

Two (2) 44-passenger air-conditioned buses for Camp Quest A trips that will depart from Haindl Field to various locations in the tri-state area. Trips will take place June 27th-July 15th (No trip July 4). 10 trips will be school bus trips, 4 trips will be coach bus trips.

One (1) 44-passenger air-conditioned buses for Camp Quest B trips that will depart from Haindl Field to various locations in the tri-state area. Trips will take place July 18th -August 5th. 11 trips will be school bus trips, 4 trips will be coach bus trips.

Supervisor Colavita offered a motion that was seconded by Councilwoman Nicholson to approve a RESOLUTION authorizing the Town to rebid for buses for the 2022 Camp Season.

On the roll call, all voted "AYE." Motion carried.

E) MEMORANDUM FROM SUPERINTENDENT OF SENIOR PROGRAMS AND SERVICES RE: AGREEMENT WITH WESTCHESTER COUNTY DEPARTMENT OF SENIOR PROGRAMS AND SERVICES FOR PROGRAM YEAR 2022 III-C1, III-C2 AND NUTRITION SERVICES INCENTIVE PROGRAM (NSIP) CONTRACTS

Supervisor Colavita reviewed a memo submitted by Sally Veltidi, Superintendent of Parks and Recreation, in which she requests that the Town Board authorize the Eastchester Recreation Department to approve the III-C1, III-C2 and Nutrition Services Incentive Program (NSIP) contract. The periods covered are January 1, 2022 to December 31, 2022 for the III-C programs, and October 1, 2021 to September 30, 2022 for NSIP.

This contract between the Town of Eastchester and Westchester County Senior Programs and Services provides: funding for the Congregate Meals program at the Lake Isle Senior Center and for the Home Delivered Meals program for frail, homebound residents. The total aggregate amount to be paid to the Town of Eastchester is \$88,008 and the total aggregate amount for the contractor match is \$24,906 for the III-C programs.

Councilwoman Marcotte offered a motion that was seconded by Councilman Dooley to approve a RESOLUTION authorizing Supervisor Colavita to sign the Agreement with Westchester County Department of Senior Programs and Services for IIIC-1, IIIC-2 and NSIP, including Schedules A, B, C, D, G, and H.

On the roll call, all voted "AYE." Motion carried.

F) MEMORANDUM FROM SUPERINTENDENT OF SENIOR PROGRAMS AND SERVICES RE: AGREEMENT WITH WESTCHETSER COUNTY DEPARTMENT OF SENIOR PROGRAMS AND SERVICES FOR TITLE III-B TRANSPORTATION SERVICES FOR PERIOD JANUARY 1, 2022 – DECEMBER 31, 2022

Supervisor Colavita reviewed a memo submitted by Sally Veltidi, Superintendent of Parks and Recreation, in which she requests that the Town Board authorize the Eastchester Recreation Department to approve the Transportation Services contract for the period from January 1, 2022 to December 31, 2022.

This contract between the Town of Eastchester and Westchester County Senior Programs and Services provides an amount not to exceed \$7,247. This funding will support two of our daily transportation services for older residents: trips to and from the Senior Nutrition Center at Lake Isle and trips to and from medical appointments. The Town of Eastchester will contribute \$5,036 in matching funds to the Program.

The funding is awarded by the New York State Office for the Aging under Title III-B of the Older Americans Act.

Councilman Dooley offered a motion that was seconded by Councilwoman Marcotte to approve a RESOLUTION authorizing Supervisor Colavita to sign the Agreement with Westchester County Department of Senior Programs and Services for Title III-B Transportation Services, including Schedules A, B, C, D, E and F.

On the roll call, all voted "AYE." Motion carried.

G) MEMORANDUM FROM SUPERINTENDENT OF PARKS AND RECREATION RE: LINEN CONTRACT FOR COMMUNITY CENTER

Supervisor Colavita reviewed a memo submitted by Sally Veltidi, Superintendent of Parks and Recreation, in which she requests that the Town Board authorize the Eastchester Recreation Department to approve the start of linen service for the tables for the Seniors for lunchtime at the new Community Center.

The Community Center Director Peter Basha priced out many options and worked with the Town Attorney on the contract for linen services for the Center.

These services include supplying, washing and delivering items such as cloth napkins, tablecloths and mats with logos for the entrances to the Community Center.

This service will cost \$33,304.00 for the rest of 2022.

Supervisor Colavita offered a motion that was seconded by Councilwoman Nicholson to approve a RESOLUTION authorizing Supervisor Colavita to sign the contract with Coast Linen Services for Linens for the Community Center.

On the roll call, all voted "AYE." Motion carried.

H) MEMORANDUM FROM SUPERINTENDENT OF HIGHWAYS RE: AWARDING OF 2022 STREET RESURFACING CONTRACT

On Thursday, April 28, 2022 at 11:15 a.m., bids for the 2022 Street Resurfacing Project were opened. This bid includes the resurfacing of various roadways within the Town of Eastchester, Bronxville & Tuckahoe Villages.

There were FOUR bidders, and all bid totals have been incorporated into the summary below. The low bid, based on unit prices, for the total amount of \$1,156,260.00 was submitted by PCI Industries Corp, 550 Franklin Ave, Mt. Vernon, NY 10550. This bid was reviewed and is in accordance with the specifications.

Supervisor Colavita offered a motion that was seconded by Councilman Dooley to approve a RESOLUTION to award the 2022 Street Resurfacing Contract to PCI Industries Corp, 550 Franklin Ave, Mt. Vernon, NY 10550, at the unit prices bid, for the total amount of \$1,156,260.00.

On the roll call, all voted "AYE." Motion carried.

Councilwoman Marcotte announced the last day to register with the Recreation Department for Summer Camp is May 13th.

Mrs. Marcotte announced the Village of Bronxville will hold its 100th Annual Memorial Day Parade on May 30th and Bronxville High School will hold a ceremony commemorating the 80th Anniversary of the Doolittle Raid on May 29th at 7:00 p.m.

In closing, Mrs. Marcotte congratulated Harrison Bader #7 and John Doherty #12 on having their uniform numbers retired by Eastchester Little League. Both men started their baseball career with Eastchester Little League and went on to play professional baseball.

Supervisor Colavita reported a plaque was unveiled at homeplate of the Parkway Oval Field in remembrance of Terry Lalli, umpire for Eastchester recreation softball for over 20 years.

The Supervisor announced the upcoming Police Memorial Ceremonies to be held on Saturday, May 14th. The Tuckahoe PD Ceremony will be held at 9:00 a.m. followed by the Eastchester PD Ceremony at 11:00 a.m.

In closing, Supervisor Colavita extended Mother's Day wishes to all the moms in Eastchester, Tuckahoe and Bronxville.

IX. SECOND OPPORTUNITY TO ADDRESS THE BOARD

Kim Colasuonno and Samantha Bastone represented the CARE Coalition in inviting the community to the 5th Annual Candlelight Vigil on May 26th at 7:30 p.m. in Gazebo Park.
