ITEMS MUST BE PLACED CURBSIDE BEFORE 7:00 A.M. ON THE DESIGNATED COLLECTION DAY, BUT NO EARLIER THAN THE NIGHT BEFORE. PICKUP SCHEDULE MAY CHANGE DURING HOLIDAY WEEKS AND IN THE EVENT OF INCLEMENT WEATHER.

BULK TRASH – consists mainly of large, bulky items that will not fit into your residential garbage container. Examples: Non-Metal Furniture, such as recliners, table & chairs, mattress & box spring, carpet (rolled & tied, no longer than 4ft long and 2ft wide), couch, dried paint cans lid removed.

RECYCLING

Place recyclables in your recycling container bin or labeled container at curbside. Follow the recycling calendar on the reverse side. Place a weight on top of the newspapers to prevent their blowing away. In case of rain, cover the newspapers. **Rinse food and beverage containers thoroughly.**

<u>NEWSPAPER/CARDBOARD</u> – Recycle all newspapers, glossy inserts, magazines, junk mail, phone books, brown paper bags and corrugated and grey cardboard boxes, dry and free of contaminants. Cardboard must be flattened, bundled and placed curbside with newspapers. **Waxed cardboard is not accepted!**

<u>COMMINGLED</u> – All plastic containers coded 1 through 7 on the bottom, glass and aluminum or tin food and beverage jars or containers, detergent containers, empty aerosol cans and clean aluminum foil. Include food and beverage cartons. Recyclable cartons include both refrigerated "gable-top" and shelf-stable aseptic cartons often used to contain milk, juice, cream, egg substitutes, non-dairy milk beverages, soup and broth. **Rinse thoroughly.** Labels and caps need **NOT** be removed. **NO PLASTIC BAGS**, foam plastic materials, film plastic, vinyl, light bulbs, crystal, window glass, broken glass, ceramics, kitchenware, pesticide/herbicide bottles or any other containers containing potentially hazardous materials such as motor oil, pesticide or chemicals.

<u>METAL</u> – <u>Includes the collection of metal appliances and other items.</u> **NO** aluminum siding, paint cans or automotive parts.

<u>E-WASTE</u> (Electronics, Monitors, TVs) – Scheduled Curb Side Pickup day is Wednesday (Pickup is suspended during Holiday weeks and the month of November). **Acceptable Equipment** – Televisions, computers (desktops, monitors, and notebooks), computer mice and keyboards, printers, scanners, fax machines, Cell phones. <u>These items are recyclable, therefore cannot be mixed with household garbage</u>.

GRASS CLIPPINGS & LEAVES (ORGANIC YARD WASTE) – Pickup every Wednesday from April through October. These materials must be placed either in a container labeled "yard waste" or in biodegradable bags January through October. Residents may obtain "yard waste" labels from the Highway Department and Town Hall at no charge. PLASTIC BAGS ARE NOT ACCEPTED. AFTER OCTOBER LEAVES AND GRASS CLIPPINGS ARE PICKED UP ON AN UNSCHEDULED BASIS AND MAY BE RAKED TO THE CURB. FOR SAFETY REASONS PLEASE DO NOT PUT THESE MATERIALS ONTO THE ROADWAY.

ALL BRUSH AND BRANCHES MUST BE SEPARATED FROM THE GRASS AND LEAVES.

BRANCHES/BRUSH – Branches and brush must be placed at the curb and tied with string only in bundles not greater than 4 feet in length, or more than 40 pounds in weight and no more than 2-cubic yards (3'x 3'x6). Branches/brush is picked up on the same day as Organic Yard Waste.

RESIDENTIAL FOOD SCRAP RECYCLING

Food Scrap Recycling Drop-off is available 24/7 for Town Residents at the dead end of Farella Way. This program is for Residential use only. This voluntary program involves separating food scraps from your household trash. For sanitary purposes food scraps must be placed within a compostable BPI Certified bag, purchased by the resident. BPI certified bags are available for purchase at the Town Clerk's Office at 40 Mill Road. Please see Town website for guidelines and regulations on how to recycle food scraps or contact the Highway Department.

NON-COLLECTED MATERIALS

Tree Trunks (Logs), Stumps, Rocks, Dirt, Building Materials: Building Materials includes concrete, asphalt, plaster, tile, sheetrock, wood (including wood doors), windows (including glass inserts), insulation, roofing material, etc. Disposal of these items must be arranged with a private carter or contractor.

Tires, Car Batteries, Used Motor Oil: Tires and car batteries must be disposed of through their place of purchase. Used motor oil must be disposed of at a gas station.

Chemicals: Household chemicals may be disposed of through Westchester County. Please call (914) 813-5425.
