<b>Secretary Minutes</b>				
<b>ESF#8 Meeting</b>	Scott McCready, Saline County EMS Medical Officer, presented the most common street drugs currently being used; heroin or opioids, methamphetamines, marijuana and alcohol. Fentanyl is an opioid that is fatal in even small quantities. Methamphetamines cause a condition known as excited delirium, where the user will start out feeling euphoric, paranoid, rhabdomyolysis and finally death. Marijuana is the most common streetdrug we deal with in this area. Although marijuana users do not overdose, they drive under the influence endangering themselves and others. The most common drug that emergency responders must deal with is alcohol. Alcohol causes accidents and domestic violence.			
<b>Soft Targets</b>	Sheriff Murray Marston presented a condensed FEMA class on workplace security awareness. Always be aware of your surroundings, because security begins with you. If you see something, say something. Always report suspicious behavior; suspicious packages, unattended suspicious vehicles, anything that makes you think something is not right. Limit your access points with access keys or ID badges.
