Election News:

If you vote absentee, you should have received a dual absentee ballot application for the August 2 primary and the November 8 general election. Those that returned the signed application received their absentee ballot for the primary and will receive their ballot for the November election without taking any further action. We have one candidate running for mayor: current Mayor Chris Emerick. There are four candidates running for the two council positions that are open: incumbent Sandra Szeliga, Jim Schwab, Vanessa Jones and Shawn Pattee. Incumbent Dan Elliott has chosen not to run for re-election. There will be a ballot proposal asking voters to approve a charter amendment to appoint rather than elect the city clerk. The job has become increasingly complicated and there has been no interest in it from Evart voters for two election cycles. Council and staff believe that it is time to make this change in order to expand the applicant pool. Questions? Call or email the clerk as above.

Thank you to all of the residents who have contacted us to change out their water meters. We have made significant progress with the new cellular meter installations but there are still quite a few in need of replacement. Kindly understand this is a **required action.** All current water meters must be replaced per City Ordinance. If you are uncertain if your meter is new, we can look this information up for you. Please contact City Hall at your earliest convenience but no later than September 30, 2022.
