#### CITY OF EVART REGULAR COUNCIL MEETING OCTOBER 25, 2022 @ 7:30PM Community Room at the Depot, 200 S. Main Street

Mayor Chris Emerick called the meeting to order at 7:30pm, then led the assembly in the Pledge of Allegiance.

Present (via roll call): Sean Duffy, Dan Elliott, Chris Emerick, Matt Hildebrand, Sandra Szeliga

**Present (staff):** City Manager Pepper Lockhart, Finance Director/Treasurer Jennie Duncan, Director of Public Works (DPW) Don Duncan, Downtown Development Authority (DDA) Director Todd Bruggema, Chief of Police John Beam Jr., City Attorney James White, City Clerk Kathy Fiebig

Guests: Vanessa Jones, Jim Schwab

#### Citizens' Comments:

Jim Schwab: Since there are more pilots requesting the use of the airport courtesy vehicle, please consider buying a smaller vehicle for their use which would free up the current vehicle for the DPW Director's continued use. Reminder: the Meet the Candidate night for council and school board candidates is tomorrow.

#### Approval of Agenda

Motion by Mayor Emerick to approve the agenda with the addition of two items: an appointment to the Housing Commission and a proposed contract with Unifirst. Support by Mr. Hildebrand. Motion passed with all in favor.

#### Approval of Consent Agenda

**A.** Regular Council Minutes - October 11, 2022

**B.** Vendor's List \$77,217.89

Motion by Mayor Emerick to approve the consent agenda as presented. Support by Ms. Szeliga. Motion passed with all in favor.

#### **Unfinished Business**

**C.** Water Ordinance – Discussion of Meeting Dates

A meeting with all local landlords has been scheduled for November 1 at 10am at the Depot. Staff is trying to explain the issues via telephone to those landlords that will not be able to attend.

#### **New Business**

**D.** Motion to Amend Approved Minutes of May 16, 2022

Ms. Duncan noted an error in the minutes of May 16, 2022. Motion by Mayor Emerick to correct the minutes of May 16, 2022 to reflect the correct price for new fire hydrants. Support by Mr. Hildebrand. Motion passed with all in favor.

E. Cemetery Board – Request to purchase gate and temporary fence

On behalf of the Cemetery Commission, Ms. Duncan requested approval for a temporary fence behind the cold storage building that would run from east to west. People have been cutting through this field and dropping off brush and trash. They also requested a gate on the road just

east of the cold storage that leads into this area, and suggested that the fourth entrance, on the east end of the property, be improved and used for access for brush disposal. Motion by Ms. Szeliga to approve the installation of temporary fencing and a gate behind the cold storage building, and approval for DPW to improve the entrance road at the east end; funding will come from the general fund. Support by Mr. Duffy. Motion passed with all in favor.

**F.** Appoint Don Duncan as Airport Manager – Resolution 2022-14

Motion by Mr. Hildebrand to approve Resolution 2022-14, appointing DPW Director Don Duncan as airport manager. Support by Ms. Szeliga. Motion passed with a roll call vote: Elliott, Emerick, Hildebrand, Szeliga, Duffy in favor; none were opposed and none were absent.

**G.** Request Purchase of Truck

Mr. Duncan noted that the courtesy vehicle is requiring significant work to remain road worthy and that pilots are using it more frequently now. At the last regular meeting, council had approved the purchase of a new truck for the DPW Director, freeing up the courtesy vehicle, but staff has been unable to locate one for the amount approved. Motion by Mr. Hildebrand to approve the purchase of a new truck within the next three months for up to \$50,000. Support by Mr. Elliott. Motion passed with all in favor.

H. Request Approval of Playground Equipment Donation

The Middle School has asked DPW to assist with the removal of several items of playground equipment and has offered it to the city at no cost. Mr. Duncan would like to place the equipment on the city owned lots on Fair Street. Motion by Mayor Emerick to approve the acceptance of the Middle School playground equipment that will then be installed on city owned property on Fair Street. Support by Mr. Hildebrand. Motion passed with all in favor. **H1.** Unifirst Agreement

Ms. Duncan recently reviewed the contract between the city and Mauer's Textile Rental (rugs and DPW clothing/rags) and discovered that the city has been paying for several services that haven't been used. Our rate was considerably higher than other companies, as well. She suggested that the city terminate the contract with Maurer's and move forward with Unifirst. She presented a five-year contract. Mr. Duffy and Mr. Hildebrand requested that she ask for a shorter term on the contract, and she will do so. No action taken.

**H2.** Appointment of Patrick Tiedt to the Housing Commission

Motion by Mr. Hildebrand to appoint Patrick Tiedt to fill the remainder of Tammy Dellar's term to the Evart Housing Commission, which expires in 2024. Support by Mr. Elliott. Szeliga voted no; Duffy, Elliott, Emerick and Hildebrand voted yes. Motion passed.

## **City Manager Report/Comment**

Ms. Lockhart stated that SLC is scheduled to be in town to install more of the new commercial water meters. DPW will be installing "children at play" signs at the Housing Commission. The city received a refund from our insurance company for the McClellan building, as we had a second policy on that property. She has not put out an RFP for engineering services as she is still researching grant opportunities for W. Jefferson and N. River Street. Reed City recently received a grant for replacing lead service lines and she will research that, as well. The Housing Commission is very close to having their 501 (c)(3) status.

#### **Finance Director Report/Comment**

Ms. Duncan met with Reed City's Treasurer and received assistance with some of the regular reports that must be filed with the state. The city has made some errors on these in the past and Ms. Duncan is trying to get everything corrected. She's been working with the auditors and working with Mr. White on the water ordinance. She's trying to find better rates for employee health insurance, but our staff is too small to qualify for most discounts. She hopes to have quotes at the next regular council meeting.

Mr. Duncan gave a presentation on work that has been completed as well as work that has been scheduled.

L. Monthly Report – September 2022

Chief Beam presented the data from the new speed radar signs. He noted that on N. River, 110 vehicles were in excess of the 35 miles per hour limit. Jesse Hyden is doing well at the police academy and is looking forward to his graduation on December 3. Chief will make every effort to get Mr. Hyden out on the street as quickly as possible.

For the Agenda of November 1, 2022

<u>Background.</u> As previous mentioned during the October 25, 2022, council meeting, the city has had an agreement with Maurer's Textile Rental for floor mats, shop rags and coveralls for the DPW garage and jean service for full-time DPW and Water/Wastewater employees. The cost of the jean service is paid by each employee's weekly payroll. While reviewing costs and agreements, we found it more financially responsible to purchase our own rugs and eliminate the rug portion of the agreement. I met with Maurer's last month to discuss a new agreement and decided to get another quote after learning their rates were increasing. I then met with two representatives from Unifirst who offer the same services at a lower cost.

<u>Issues & Questions Specified.</u> During discussion at the last meeting, council was concerned with entering into a five-year agreement with Unifirst and I was asked to get other options. I emailed the representative the next day and was informed Unifirst will agree to a three-year agreement, however, their rates will be increased by 5% for each year down from the five, this would be a 10% increase from their original quote.

Within the agreement, Unifirst does offer a 60-day correction of deficiencies. Basically, if the city reaches out in writing to the company of any deficiencies, and Unifirst does not have it resolved in 60 days, the city has the right to terminate the agreement. Unifirst is also removing the auto renewal part of the agreement.

## Alternatives.

N/A

*<u>Financial Impact</u>*. The original five-year quote from Unifirst would cost the city approximately \$1,690.00 a year. With the 10% increase of a three-year agreement, this would cost the city approximately \$1,860.00 a year. This is still a cost saving from the previous company.

#### CUSTOMER SERVICE AGREEMENT TERMS

REQUIREMENTS SUPPLIED. Customer orders from UniFirst Corp. ("UniFirst") the rental garments and/or other items of the type specified in this Agreement ("Merchandise") and related pickup/delivery and maintenance services (collectively with Merchandise, "Services") for all of Customer's requirements therefor, at the prices and upon the terms and conditions set forth herein. Additional Services requested by Customer, verbally or in writing, will also be covered by this Agreement. All rental Merchandise supplied to Customer remains the property of UniFirst. Customer warrants that it is not subject to, and that this Agreement does not interfere or conflict with, any existing agreement for the supply of the Merchandise or Services covered.

PERFORMANCE GUARANTEE. UNIFIRST GUARANTEES TO DELIVER HIGH-QUALITY SERVICE AT ALL TIMES. All items of Merchandise cleaned, finished, inspected, repaired, and delivered by UniFirst will meet or exceed industry standards, or non-conforming items will be replaced by the next scheduled delivery day at no cost to Customer. Items of rental Merchandise requiring replacement due to normal wear and tear will be replaced at no cost to Customer, save for any applicable personalization and setup charges.

Customer expressly waives the right to terminate this Agreement during the initial term or any extension thereof for deficiencies in the quality of Services unless: (1) complaints are first made in writing to UniFirst which set forth the precise nature of any deficiencies; (2) UniFirst is afforded at least 60 days to correct any deficiencies complained of, and (3) UniFirst fails to correct those deficiencies complained of within 60 days. In the event Customer complies with the foregoing and UniFirst fails to correct such deficiencies, Customer may terminate this Agreement by written notice to UniFirst, providing that all previous balances due to UniFirst have been paid in full and that all other conditions to terminate have been satisfied. Any delay or interruption of the Services provided for in this Agreement by reason of acts of God, fires, explosions, strikes or other industrial disturbances, or any other cause not within the control of UniFirst, shall not be deemed a breach or violation of this Agreement.

TERM AND RENEWAL. This Agreement is effective when signed by both the Customer and UniFirst Location Manager and continues in effect for 60 months after installation of Merchandise (for new customers) or any renewal date. This Agreement will be renewed automatically and continueusly for multiple successive 60 month periods unless Customer or UniFirst gives written notice of nen renewal to the other at least 90 days prior to the next expiration date.

PRICES AND PAYMENTS. Prices are based on 52 weeks of service per year. Any increase(s) to Service Frequency could result in additional charges. On an annual basis, the prices then in effect will be increased by the greater of the annual percent increase in the Consumer Price Index - All Urban Consumers, Series ID: CUUROOOSAG, other goods and services, or by 5%. Additional price increases and other charges may be imposed by separate written notice or by notation on Customer's invoice. Customer may, however, decline such additional increases or charges by notifying UniFirst in writing within 10 days after receipt of such notice or notation. If Customer declines said additional price increases, UniFirst may terminate this Agreement. Customer also agrees to pay the other charges and minimum weekly charge herein specified. Charges relating to a wearer leaving Customer's employ can be terminated by (1) giving notice thereof to UniFirst and (2) returning or paying for any missing Merchandise isomer representative is not available to receive and acknowledge delivery of Merchandise, Customer authorizes UniFirst to make delivery and assumes responsibility for related charges/invoices.

If Customer fails to make timely payment, UniFirst may, at any time and in its sole discretion, terminate this Agreement by giving written notice to Customer, whether or not UniFirst has previously strictly enforced Customer's obligation to make timely payments. Customer agrees to pay, and will pay, all applicable sales, use, personal property, and other taxes and assessments arising out of this Agreement.

DEFE CHARGE. Customer's invoices may also include a DEFE charge to cover all or portions of certain expenses including:

D = DELIVERY, or expenses associated with the actual delivery of Services and Merchandise to Customer's place of business, primarily Route Sales Representative commissions, management salaries, vehicle depreciation, equipment maintenance, insurance, road use charges and local access fees.

E = ENVIRONMENTAL, or expenses (past, present, and future) UniFirst absorbs related to wastewater testing, purification, effluent control, solids disposal, supplies and equipment for pollution controls and energy conservation, and overall regulatory compliance.

F = FUEL, or the gas, diesel fuel, oil, and lubricant expenses associated with keeping UniFirst's fleet vehicles on the road and servicing its customers.

E = ENERGY, primarily the natural gas UniFirst uses to run boilers and gas dryers, plus other local utility charges.

MERCHANDISE. Customer acknowledges and agrees to notify all employees that Merchandise supplied is for general occupational use and, except as expressly specified below, affords no special user protections. Customer further acknowledges that. (1) Customer has unilaterally and independently determined and selected the nature, style, performance characteristics, number of changes and scope of all Merchandise to be used and the appropriateness of such Merchandise for Customer's specific needs or intended uses; (2) UniFirst does not have any obligation to advise, and has not advised, Customer concerning the fitness or suitability of the Merchandise for Customer's intended use; (3) UniFirst makes no representation, warranty, or covenant regarding the performance of the Merchandise (including without limitation Flame Resistant and Visibility Merchandise); and (4) UniFirst shall in no way be responsible or liable for any injury or harm suffered by any Customer employees while wearing or using any Merchandise, Customer's or damages to indemnify and hold harmless UniFirst and its employees and agents from and against all claims, injuries, or damages to any person or property resulting from Customer's or Customer's or Customer's or the Merchandise.

Flame Resistant ("FR") Merchandise supplied hereunder is intended only to prevent the ignition and burning of fabric away from the point of high heat impingement and to be self-extinguishing upon removal of the ignition source. FR items will not provide significant protection from burns in the immediate area of high heat contact due to thermal transfer through the fabric and/or destruction of the fabric in the area of such exposure. FR items are designed for continuous wear as only a secondary level of protection. Primary protection is still required for work activities where direct or significant exposure to heat or open flame is likely to occur.

Visibility Merchandise is intended to provide improved conspicuity of the wearer under daylight conditions and when illuminated by a light source of sufficient candlepower at night. It is Customer's responsibility to determine the level of conspicuity needed by wearers under specific work conditions. Further, Customer agrees that Visibility Merchandise alone does not ensure conspicuity of the wearer and that additional safety precautions may be necessary. The Visibility Merchandise supplied satisfied particular ANSI/ISEA standards only when they were new and unused and only if so labeled. Customer acknowledges that usage and laundering of Visibility Merchandise may adversely affect its conspicuity.

Healthcare/Food-Related Customer acknowledges that: (1) UniFirst does not guarantee or warrant that the Merchandise selected by Customer or that processed garments delivered by UniFirst will be appropriate or sufficient to provide a hygienic level adequate for individual Customer's needs; and (2) optional poly-bagging\* is recommended to reduce the risk of cross-contamination of Merchandise, and the failure to utilize such service may adversely affect the efficacy of UniFirst's hygienic cleaning process. (\* Poly-bag services incur additional charges.)

If any Merchandise supplied hereunder is Merchandise that: (1) UniFirst does not stock for whatever reason (including due to style, color, size or brand); (2) consists of non-UniFirst manufactured or customized FR Merchandise; or (3) consists of Merchandise that has been permanently personalized (in all cases known as "Non-Standard Merchandise"), then, upon the discontinuance of any Service hereunder at any time for any reason, including expiration, termination, or cancellation of this Agreement, with or without cause, deletion of any Non-Standard Merchandise from Customer's Service Program, or due to employee reductions (in each case a "Discontinuance of Service"), Customer will purchase at the time of such Discontinuance of Service all affected Non-Standard Merchandise items then in UniFirst's inventory (in-service, shelf, as well as any manufacturer's supplies ordered for Customer's use), paying for same the replacement charges then in effect.

Customer agrees not to contaminate any Merchandise with asbestos, heavy metals, solvents, inks, or other hazardous or toxic substances ("contaminants"). Customer agrees to pay UniFirst for all Merchandise that is lost, stolen, damaged or abused beyond repair. As a condition to the termination of this Agreement, for whatever reason, Customer will return to UniFirst all standard Merchandise in good and usable condition or pay for same at the replacement charges then in effect.

OBLIGATIONS AND REMEDIES. If Customer breaches or terminates this Agreement before the expiration date for any reason (other than for UniFirst's failure under the performance guarantee described above). Customer will pay UniFirst, as liquidated damages and not as a penalty (the parties acknowledging that actual damages would be difficult to calculate with reasonable certainty) an amount equal to 50 percent of the average weekly amounts invoiced in the preceding 26 weeks, multiplied by the number of weeks remaining in the current term. These damages will be in addition to all other obligations or amounts owed by Customer to UniFirst, including the return of Standard Merchandise items as set forth herein.

This Agreement shall be governed by Massachusetts law (exclusive of choice of law). If a dispute arises from or relates in any way to this Agreement or any alleged breach thereof at any time, the parties will first attempt to resolve the claim or dispute by negotiation at agreed time(s) and location(s). All negotiations are confidential and will be treated as settlement negotiations. Any matter not resolve the claim or dispute by negotiation at agreed time(s) and location(s). All negotiations are confidential and will be treated as settlement negotiations. Any matter not resolve the claim or dispute by negotiation at agreed exclusively by final and binding arbitration, conducted in the capital city of the state where Customer has its principal place of business (or some other location mutually agreed), pursuant to the Expedited Rules of the Commercial Arbitration Rules of the American Arbitration Association, and governed by the Federal Arbitration Act, to the exclusion of state law inconsistent therewith. The parties will agree upon one (1) Arbitrator to settle the controversy or claim. The successful or substantially prevailing party in any proceeding, including any appeals thereof (as determined by the Arbitrator/court) shall recover all of its costs and expenses including, without limitation, reasonable attorney fees, withess fees, and discovery costs, all of which shall be included in and as a part of the judgment or award rendered hereunder. This provision for Arbitration is specifically enforceable by the parties; the Arbitrator shall have no power to vary or ignore the provisions hereof; and, the decision of the Arbitrator in accordance herewith, may be entered in any court having jurisdiction thereof. Customer acknowledges that, with respect to all such disputes, it has voluntarily and knowingly waived any right it may have to a jury trial or to participate in a class action or class litigation as a representative of any other persons or as a member of any class of persons, or to consolidate its claims

MISCELLANEOUS. The parties agree that this Agreement represents the entire agreement between them. In the event Customer issues a purchase order to UniFirst at any time, none of the standard pre-printed terms and conditions therein shall have any application to this Agreement or any transactions occurring pursuant hereto or thereto. UniFirst may, in its sole discretion, assign this Agreement. Customer may not assign this Agreement without the prior written consent of UniFirst. Customer agrees that in the event it sells or transfers its business, it will require the purchaser or transferee to assume all obligations and responsibilities under this Agreement, provided that such assumption shall not relieve Customer of its liabilities hereunder and provided further that any failure by a purchaser or transferee to assume this Agreement. Neither party will be liable for any incidental, consequential, special, or punitive damages. In no event shall UniFirst's aggregate liability to Customer for any and all claims exceed the sum of all amounts actually paid by Customer to UniFirst. In the event any portion of this Agreement is held by a court of competent jurisdiction or by a duly appointed arbitrator to be unenforceable, the balance will remain in effect. All written notices provided to UniFirst' as used herein means. UniFirst Holdings, Inc. d.b.a. UniFirst.
