## Low Income Household Water Assistance Program

The Michigan Department Of Health And Human Services (MDHHS) has opened a new program for people who are un-able to pay their water bill by the due date. Some requirements you must have to receive this include: be under 150% federal poverty limit and or receiving temporary assistance for needy families (TANF), Food Assistance program/ supplemental nutrition assistance program FAP/SNAP, SER, or Social Security Supplemental income (SSI) .
