## City Wide Clean Up June 26th and June 27th!



The City of Evart will be holding our annual City Wide Clean Up on Saturday, June 26th, and Sunday, June 27th between the hours of 9:00 am and 5:00 pm. There will be dumpsters available at the Waste Water Treatment Plant located at 611 W. Tenth Street. Proof of residency will be required - this can be a water bill, tax bill, or driver's license. **Please note, the following materials will NOT be accepted:** yard waste, construction materials, demolition debris, concrete, liquids, paints, pesticides, chemicals, and tires. ## Forest Hill Cemetery: Reminders

Summer gives us many great opportunities to honor the loved ones in our lives who have passed. Many of us like to do so by cleaning up gravesites and placing flowers or monuments on them. When doing so, please consider the following guidelines:

- Solar lights are not permitted due to the "Glowing Tombstones" and will be removed;
- Any wooded crosses or wired decorations MUST be contained within an urn and all urns must be located near the headstone;
- Toys, stuffed animals, statues, personal items, and fencing are not allowed.

In part, these guidelines are in place to allow City staff to maintain the grounds and walkways without endangering the equipment. If you have any questions regarding these regulations, please contact City Hall at (231) 734-2181
