Trash Reminder

All household trash needs to be secured in bags and placed in the City provided blue bin. Please place the bin at the curb Tuesday night to ensure Wednesday pick up. The front of the bin must face the street. Alternative trash cans, commercial trash bags, or other non-approved receptacles will not be picked up. Each resident is allocated one large item per week; any mattresses or box springs must be wrapped in plastic. Extra trash bags can be purchased at City Hall for \$2.75 each. A second trash container costs \$12.00 per month.

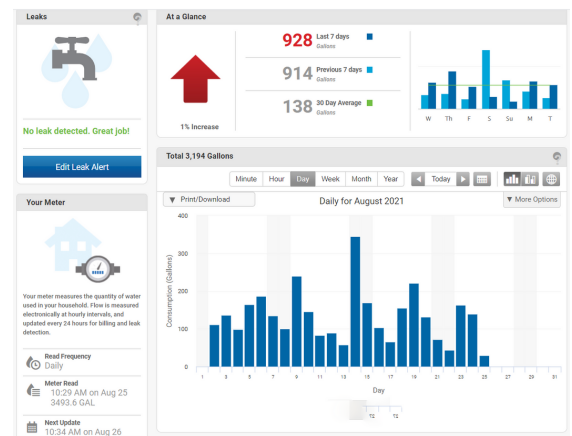
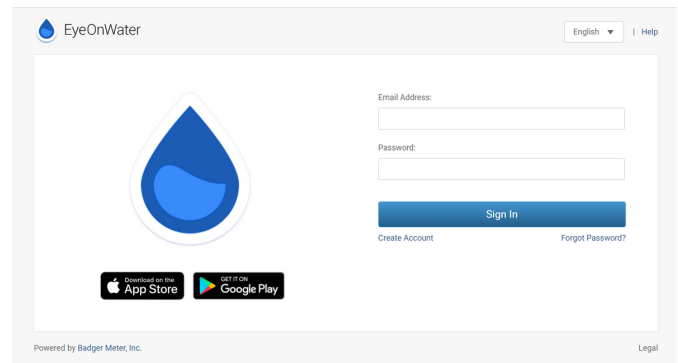
Has your water meter been replaced?

The new SLC meters have a client portal that monitors your system for leaks and allows you to track your usage on a daily, weekly and monthly basis. You can get the app on your phone or download it to your computer by searching for "EyeOnWater".

It's simple, it's free, and we are hoping that it will help everyone conserve water. There is a "help" button in the upper right hand corner that will answer most questions.

This is a great resource for when you vacation. The app will let you know if you left a hose running or a pipe bursts.
