## Dates and deadlines

**January 31** - Deadline to receive new voter registrations and voter updates online and by mail. **February 8** - 8:00 PM deadline for in-person voter registration and voter updates.

## Getting registered to vote

### To register to vote, you must be:

- A citizen of the United States.
- A legal resident of Washington State.
- At least 18 years old by Election Day. Not
- currently serving a Department of Corrections sentence in total confinement.

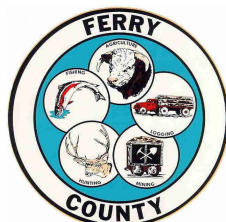

## Returning your ballot

### By mail

Postage is prepaid - no stamp is needed. Ballots must be postmarked on or before election day, February 8, 2022 in order to be counted.

## FAQ's

What is an explanatory statement?

*An explanatory statement is prepared by the district's attorney; it outlines the effect the ballot measure would have if it is passed by the voters.*

How are committees in favor of or in opposition to a measure formed?

*Districts that choose to participate in the local voters' pamphlet are responsible for appointing committee members who agree to write the statements. The statements are a way to persuade voters to vote for or against a measure. The Elections Office does not check statements for factual or grammatical accuracy.*

The Board of Directors of Keller School District No. 3 adopted Resolution No. 2021-722, concerning a proposition to finance educational programs and operation expenses. This proposition would authorize the District to meet the educational needs of its students by levying the following excess taxes, in place of an expiring levy, on all taxable property within the District, for support of essential educational programs and operation expenses not funded by the State of Washington:
