Dear voters,

Welcome to the 2024 Primary Election Local Voters’ Pamphlet. A great source for information on local candidates that will help assist you on making an informed vote. You can still check the online voter guide for information that is appropriate to your precinct.



In ensuring that you are getting the correct ballot and information please update any and all address changes by going online, filling out a new form, or calling the Ferry County Elections department at (509) 775-5225 extension 1139.

August 6, 2024 is the Primary Election. We have two commissioner races in this election, which will only be on the ballots for their districts in the Primary. They will be on all ballots for the General Election. Please vote and return your ballot as soon as possible. You can drop off your ballot into a ballot drop box which will stay open till 8:00pm Election Day, or return it by mail which has prepaid postage. You can also check your ballot status at www.votewa.gov.

Make sure your voice is heard as you help choose our local elected officials. You really can make a difference! It’s up to you to do so.

Accessible voting

An accessible voting unit (AVU) is equipped with visual and audio technology. Voters requiring reasonable accommodation or assistance may vote on the AVU in the Auditor’s Office starting July 19 through August 6.



About the 2024 Washington Primary

In each race, you may vote for any one candidate listed. The two candidates who receive the most votes in the Primary will advance to the General Election.

Each candidate for partisan office may state a

political party that he or she prefers. A candidate's preference does not imply that the candidate is nominated or endorsed by the party, or that the party approves of or associates with that candidate.

Primary-only voters

A registered voter who is 17 years of age on the day of the primary (August 6, 2024) and will reach the age of 18 on or before the date of the following November general election (November 5, 2024) is now eligible to vote in the primary election. Such voters are called "Primary-only voters." Primary-only voters are authorized to participate only in races in the primary election that are selecting candidates for the general election. If there are measures or other races in the primary election that will not go to the general election, Primary-only voters are not permitted to vote on those races, even if those elections are held on the same day as the other races.

Specifically, a Primary-only voter can vote on the following contests: nonpartisan candidate races that contain three or more candidates and partisan candidate races, regardless of the number of candidates, appearing on a primary election ballot.

"Primary" or "primary election" means a procedure for winnowing candidates for public office to a final list of two as part of general election.

A 17-year-old who will be 18 by the November General Election can vote in the August Primary.

To register to vote, you must be:

- A citizen of the United States;
- A legal resident of Washington State;
- At least 18 years old by Election Day;
- Not disqualified from voting due to a court order; and
- Not under Department of Corrections supervision for a Washington felony conviction



Register to vote

Go to VoteWA.gov on or before July 29 if you have a current Washington State driver license or I.D. card.

Complete and return a Washington State Voter Registration Form. Forms must be received in the Auditor's Office by July 29. Registration forms are available at post office, libraries, online, or by contacting the Ferry County Auditor's Office.

Come into the Ferry County Auditor's Office, Election Division, by 8:00 pm on Election Day.

Registration deadlines:

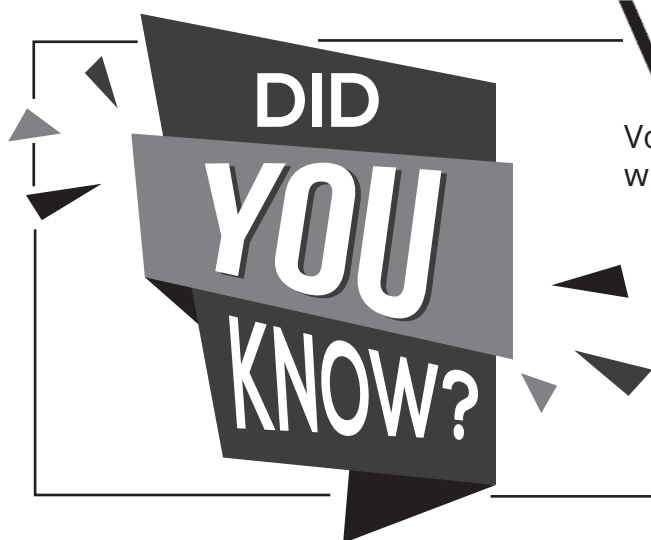
Voter registration and address changes online or by mail must be received by July 29. Starting July 30, visit our office to register to vote or change your address by 8:00 pm Election Day.

Military or overseas voters:

Maintain your voter registration while in the military or living outside the United States. To register, use your home of record (or that of a family member). You may receive your ballot by mail, email, or fax. Contact us for more information.

You are responsible for:

- Registering by the deadline;
- Updating your residential and/or mailing address; and
- Returning your ballot by 8:00 pm Election Day in an official ballot drop box, OR mailing your ballot with a postmark by Election Day.

Precinct Committee Officers

Candidates for Precinct Committee Officer (PCO) appear on your primary ballot if two candidates from the same party filed in your precinct. There is one precinct with a PCO race for 2024. The names appear in lot draw order. If only one person from a party filed in a precinct, that person is deemed elected at the close of filing, and the office will not appear on the ballot. For the limited purpose of voting in a precinct committee officer election, a voter affiliates with a major political party when he or she votes for a candidate of that party. State law doesn't allow write-in votes, and there are no PCO statements or photos presented in the voters' pamphlet.

Replacement ballots

You have a few options to receive a new ballot:

- You can request a new ballot online by visiting VoteWA.gov (log in and select Online Ballot)
- You can also call our office at 509-775-5225 ext. 1139 or e-mail delections@co.ferry.wa.us.

You are encouraged to request a replacement ballot online or by phone however you can still visit the Auditor's Office inside the Ferry County Courthouse and staff can print you a replacement.



Return your ballot on time!

- Mailing your ballot? The good news is you don't need a stamp! However, you do want to check USPS collection times to ensure that it will have a postmark on or before August 6. 
- Prefer to skip the post office? Use an official ballot drop box. Locations are listed on page 15. Drop boxes are open until 8:00 pm on August 6!
- Track to see if we have received your ballot at VoteWA.gov (select ballot status).

Top four reasons a ballot cannot be counted

- Ballot received with a late postmark.
- Signature on the ballot envelope doesn't match the signature we have on file.*
- Ballot envelope is not signed.*
- Someone other than the voter has signed the return envelope.

* If a ballot is not signed or the signature doesn't match the signature on your voter registration, the voter is mailed a form to correct the issue.

Candidate statements

Candidate statements are published exactly as submitted to the Ferry County Auditor's Elections Office. We do not make corrections of any kind or verify statements for truth or fact.

Ballot instructions

- The ballot packet for the August 6 Primary Election will be mailed to you on July 19. The packet will include your official ballot, a security envelope, and a postage-paid return envelope.
- To vote the ballot, fill in the oval next to your choice with a blue or black pen. Vote for only one in each contest or measure.
- Place your voted ballot into the security envelope. If you forget the security envelope, your ballot will still be counted.
- Put the ballot/security envelope into the return envelope and seal.
- Sign and date your return envelope that has your name printed on it. Your signature on the return envelope is required for your ballot to be counted.
- Return your ballot to the Ferry County Auditor's Office by ballot drop box or mail. See pages 3 and 4 for more information on returning your ballot.
- Ballot must be in the drop box or postmarked by 8:00 pm, August 6.



Primary election

In each race, you may vote for any one candidate listed. The two candidates who receive the most votes in the August Primary will advance to the November General Election.

Your signature matters!

Signature Information

- Sign and date the voter declaration on the return envelope that has your name printed on it.
- We compare the signature on your ballot envelope with the signature on your voter registration. This is how we know you voted the ballot. Every signature is reviewed and verified!
- How do we get your signature? If you register or update using a paper registration form, we capture your signature from the form. If you register or update through the Department of Motor Vehicles, we capture the signature from your Washington State Driver License or I.D. card.
- Do not sign for another registered voter.
- A Power of Attorney does not have authority to sign for the voter. If a voter is unable to sign, they should make a mark on the signature line and have their mark witnessed by two people. The two witnesses need to sign on the lines provided.
- Our office can have more than one signature on file for you. If you want to provide another signature, please contact us with that request (Signature Update request).

Frequently Asked Questions

My (spouse, roommate) signed my ballot envelope. What should I do?

This is a very common mistake! If someone has mistakenly signed your ballot envelope, draw a line through the incorrect signature and sign your name directly above the correction.

I forgot to put my ballot in the included security envelope. Is that ok?

Yes! Your ballot will count as long as you have signed the return envelope.

I reopened my ballot envelope and sealed it shut with tape/glue. Will my vote still count?

Yes! As long as the signature on your return envelope matches your registration signature, your vote will count.

I received two ballots, does that mean I get to vote twice?

Sorry you don't get to vote twice! If you have recently moved or changed your address multiple ballots may be mailed to you. Each ballot envelope has a unique barcode which prevents voting multiple times. Once a ballot has been received all other ballots become void.

I got a letter saying my signature did not match the signature on file with your election office. Is my ballot no longer accepted?

All signatures are verified by staff trained by the Washington State Patrol. Staff are trained to look for signature similarities and patterns. However, signatures often change and your signature may no longer match what is currently on file. If you received a signature update form, please sign the form and promptly return it to our office via mail or email as soon as possible. Your ballot will be

counted as soon as we receive your signed form. Your updated signature form will also be scanned and your new signature will be added to our database.

I lost/misplaced my original ballot. How do I get another one?

You have a few options to receive a new ballot:

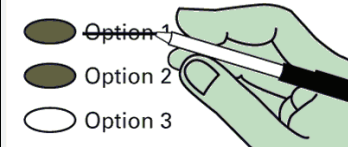
Instructions

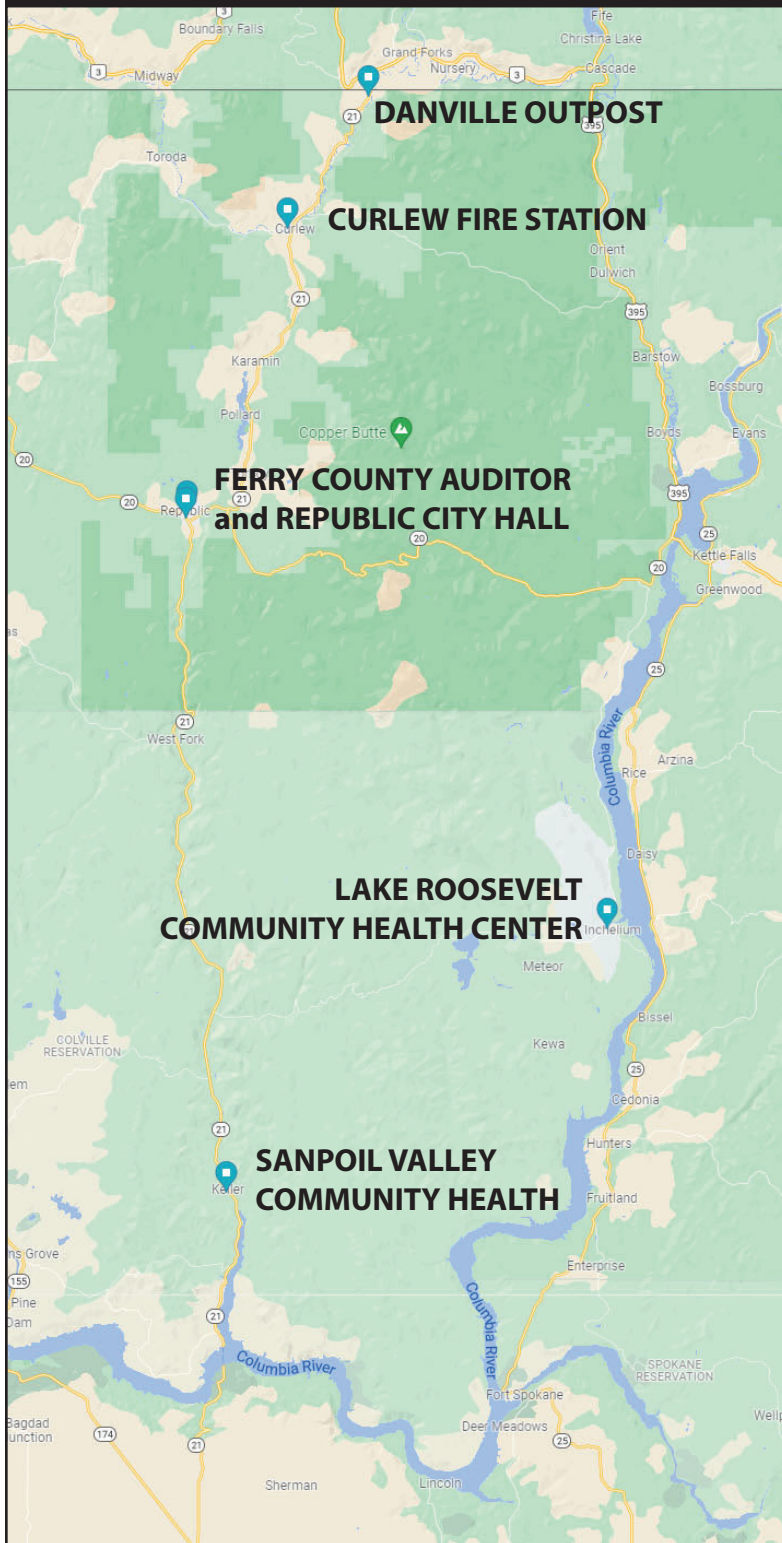

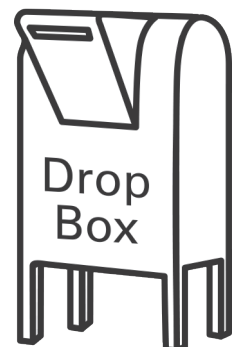
