OPEN MEETINGS PROTOCOL DURING COVID-19 OPERATIONS

In accordance with Senate Bill 150 and the Healthy at Work Guidelines issued by Governor Beshear, the City of Franklin's special called Board of Commissioners meeting scheduled for Monday, June 29, 2020 at 12:00 Noon will take place with the following protocols:

- The physical meeting will be closed to the public.
- The meeting will be broadcast live through the City's Facebook page.
- Public comments may still be accepted for the meeting by emailing comments to [cathy.dillard@franklinky.org](mailto:cathy.dillard@franklinky.org) by Monday, June 29 at 10:00 AM. However, the Commission may or may not be able to address the comments at the meeting due to time constraints or otherwise, but a City representative will respond to any email comments as soon as practicable.
- The meeting will be held at Franklin City Hall, 117 West Cedar Street, Franklin, Kentucky 42134.
- The meeting will be set up to allow for the recommended 6 feet of social distancing.
- All Commissioners and the Mayor will have the option to attend the meeting via video-conference rather than in person.
- Only staff deemed essential to the meeting will attend, and total attendance is limited to 10 persons or less.
- The meeting agenda will be advertised to the public through email, website, and social media.
- If the agenda includes presentations that need to be made by individuals or groups outside of City government, individuals or groups will present to the City Commission through a video feed or they may send a statement of the issues to be presented to be made in their absence.
