MON, 6/12, 12:40 PM	Regarding the found bicycle and man's watch reported on Monday, 6/5/2023, in the 700 block of Brownell Avenue, the items were returned to their rightful owner.

Berry Road, making it difficult for motorists to see southbound N. Berry Road traffic. No one was home at the time. Code Enforcement will continue to attempt to contact the resident to trim back the vegetation.
