RESOLUTION 2023-13

A RESOLUTION ADOPTING A POLICY ALLOWING THE USE OF AN EMPLOYEE DISHONESTY AND FAITHFUL PERFORMANCE OF DUTY DOCUMENT IN LIEU OF SURETY BONDS FOR PUBLIC OFFICERS, EMPLOYEES, OR APPOINTEES

WHEREAS,

The Village of Glendale, Hamilton County, Ohio is a member of the Public Entities Pool (PEP), a political subdivision risk pool established pursuant Ohio Revised Code (ORC) 2744.081; and

WHEREAS,

In accordance with ORC 3.061, the "political subdivisions", (meaning counties, townships, "municipal corporations," including villages and cities) may adopt a policy by resolution to allow the use of an "employee dishonesty & faithful performance of duty" coverage document, rather than a surety bond, to cover loss by fraudulent or dishonest actions of employees and failure of employees to faithfully perform duties; the following shall apply to the policy:

- 1. An officer, employee, or appointee shall be considered qualified to hold the office or employment, without acquiring a bond, on the date the oath of office is taken, certified, and filed as required by law.
- 2. An officer, employee, or appointee shall have the employee dishonesty and faithful performance of duty policy in effect before the individual's term of office or employment and the officer, employee or appointee shall not commence the discharge of duties until coverage is documented.
- 3. All officers, employees, or appointees who would be otherwise required to file a bond before commencing the discharge of duties shall be covered by and are subject to the employee dishonesty and faithful performance of duty policy instead of a surety bond requirement.
- 4. The coverage amount for an officer, employee, or appointee under an employee dishonesty and faithful performance of duty policy shall be equal to or greater than the maximum amount of the bond otherwise required by law.

Elected officials, prior to taking the oath of office and holding office, shall obtain approval of the intent to use the PEP coverage agreement and affirm that the public entity's coverage complies with ORC 3.061. Said approval shall be obtained by the Village of Glendale, in Hamilton County; and

WHEREAS, The Village of Glendale's "employee dishonesty and faithful performance of duty policy" through the PEP coverage document complies with ORC 3.061;

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of the Village of Glendale, State of Ohio, a majority of all members thereof concurring, that:

SECTION I The Village of Glendale is hereby authorized to purchase and use a "employee dishonesty and faithful performance of duty policy" through PEP in the place of individual surety bonds for officers, employees, and appointees who are otherwise required by law to acquire a bond before entering upon the discharge of duties.

RESOLUTION 2023-15

A RESOLUTION DECLARING THE NECESSITY AND INTENTION TO APPROPRIATE INTERESTS IN PROPERTY FOR THE SHARON ROAD SIGNAL REPLACEMENT PROJECT AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS,	the Council of the Village of Glendale, Ohio has determined the necessity for traffic signal improvements at the corner of Sharon Road and Route 4 (hereinafter "Project"); and
WHEREAS,	Council has determined that it is necessary to acquire a certain easement to make the improvements needed to complete the Project; and
WHEREAS,	the property upon which such necessary easement is located is 210 West Sharon Road, a.k.a. Hamilton County Parcel Identification Number 596-4-203, shown to be currently under the ownership of Richard C. Gross per the Hamilton County, Ohio property records; and
WHEREAS,	the property which is being appropriated shall be used for the purpose of improving the traffic signals at the intersection of Sharon Road and Route 4, such road being open to the public, without charge, and the property interest shall be appropriated under the procedure of Ohio Rev. Code §163.06(B) and Ohio Constitution Art. I §19;
BE IT RESOLVE	D, by the Council of the Village of Glendale, State of Ohio, a majority of all members thereof concurring, that:
SECTION I	It is the intent of the Village of Glendale to appropriate for public use the real property, listed and identified on Exhibit A, plat, and Exhibit B, legal description, and incorporated herein by reference, appropriating such interests and various easements described, which are necessary in the public interest to accomplish the construction of the Project.
SECTION II	The purpose of said taking of interests in the real estate described hereinabove is for the public use, to wit: construction of a road improvements which will be open to the public without charge.
SECTION III	The Village Administrator is hereby authorized and directed to cause a written notice of the adoption of this Resolution to be given to the owners, persons in

possession, or persons having an interest of record in the above-described

premises. Said notice shall be served according to law by persons so designated and such persons shall make return of service in a manner provided by law.


SECTION IV

The taking of the interest in the real estate described above shall be according to the procedure of Ohio Rev. Code §163.06(8), commonly known as the "quick take" procedure, as authorized by Ohio Constitution Art. I §19. Pursuant to such procedure, if the Village is unable to reach an agreement to purchase the necessary interests in the property prior to the passage of an ordinance to appropriate, the Village shall take immediate possession of the property described above at the time of filing a complaint for appropriation and deposit of the value of property structures at the earliest date provided by law.

SECTION V

At any time subsequent to the effective date of this Resolution and prior of the passage of an ordinance to appropriate, the Village Administrator is hereby authorized to acquire by purchase the real property interests herein described in this Resolution.

Legal Description Standard Highway Easement

Situated in Section 12, Town 3, Entire Range 1, M.P., Village of Glendale, Springfield Township, Hamilton County, Ohio, being part of 1.348 acre (deed) parcel of land conveyed to Richard C Gross in O.R. 14235 Pg. 1724 of the Hamilton County, Ohio Recorder's Office, the boundary of which being more particularly described as follows:

Beginning at the intersection of the north right of Way line of Sharon Road and the east right of way line of Springfield Pike;

Thence along said east right of way line, N35°28'26"W a distance of 72.89 feet to a point in the east line of a 4.672 acre (deed) parcel of land conveyed to MK Meadows Limited Partnership in O.R. 13289 Pg. 2522;

Thence along said east line, N05°27'04"E a distance of 9.16 feet;

Thence through the aforementioned 1.348 acre (deed) parcel the following three (3) courses:

- 1. S35°28'26"E a distance of 81.35 feet;
- 2. S82°04'26"E a distance of 34.99 feet;
- 3. S07°55'34"W a distance of 3.00 feet to a point in the aforementioned north right of way line of Sharon Road;

Thence along said north right of way line, N82°04'26"W a distance of 40.41 feet to the Point of Beginning.
