

OFFICIAL CITY COUNCIL PROCEEDINGS
REGULAR SESSION
MAY 3, 2010

A regular session of the Granite Falls City Council was called to order by Mayor David Smiglewski at 7:30 p.m., Monday, May 3rd, in the Council Chambers of City Hall. Council Members present: Bill Miller, Steve Schaub, Joe Fagnano and Scott Peterson. Council Members absent: DuWayne Galow and Steve Nordaune. Staff present: City Manager Bill Lavin, Finance Director Darcy Mulvihill and City Clerk Joan Taylor. Others in attendance were EDA Director Dennis VanHoof, City Attorney Greg Holmstrom, Advocate Tribune News Editor Scott Tedrick and a representative from the Marshall Independent.

MINUTES: M/S MILLER/SCHAUB TO APPROVE THE MINUTES OF THE APRIL 19TH REGULAR MEETING & APRIL 22ND BOARD OF APPEAL. Motion carried unanimously by those present.

BILLS: M/S FAGNANO/PETERSON TO APPROVE BILLS PRESENTED FOR PAYMENT. Motion carried unanimously by those present.

REPORTS: The Building Inspector's report was acknowledged at this time.

HAZARDOUS STRUCTURE: Council reviewed an update from the city's building inspector concerning various properties throughout the city. Council was advised that no progress has been made on a structure located at 1109 7th Street; and therefore Schaub introduced the following resolution and moved its adoption ordering an inspection of this structure.

RESOLUTION NO. 10-55

RESOLUTION ORDERING INSPECTION OF
STRUCTURE PER MINNESOTA STATUTE 463.15

WHEREAS, it has been reported to council that the structure located at 1109 7th Street, Granite Falls, Minnesota, may be a hazardous building due to disrepair and inadequate maintenance and constitutes a fire hazard or a hazard to public safety or health.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF GRANITE FALLS, MINNESOTA, ordering the City Building Inspectors and, if necessary, the State Fire Marshall or Fire Chief to make an inspection of said building and make a report of said inspection within thirty (30) days hereof to the City Council for purposes of making findings and determination of whether or not said building constitutes a "hazardous building" within the meaning of Minnesota Statutes 463.15.

ORDINANCE NO. 154, 2ND SERIES

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF GRANITE FALLS, MINNESOTA, AMENDING CITY CODE CHAPTER 9 ENTITLED "LAND USE REGULATIONS (ZONING) BY AMENDING ORDINANCE 9.51, SECTION 9.51, SPECIAL REGULATIONS, SUBDIVISION 4, LANDSCAPING, AND ADOPTING BY REFERENCE CITY CODE CHAPTER 1 AND SECTION 9.99, WHICH, AMONG OTHER THINGS, CONTAINS PENALTY PROVISIONS

The City of Granite Falls does ordain as follows:

Section 9.51, Special Regulations, Subdivision 4, Landscaping, is hereby amended to read as follows.

Subd. 4. Landscaping. In all but the I-2 and C-2 districts, all developed uses shall provide a landscaped yard along all street. Such yard adjacent to streets shall be kept clear of all structures and storage, except off street parking. Such yard adjacent to streets shall be at least eight feet in depth along all streets measured from the street right-of-way. Except for driveways, such yard shall extend the entire frontage of the lot and along both streets in the case of a corner lot. In addition to the foregoing, to the extent not otherwise occupied by structures legally placed or erected thereon pursuant to Code, or not otherwise defined and allowed pursuant to Ordinance Section 9.51, Subd 12, the remainder of all yards in all but the I-2 and C-2 districts shall have grass or other ground cover landscaping properly installed. No land shall remain distressed and exposed

without established grass or other ground cover or landscaping for a period exceeding six months. In the event that new construction occurs on the premises resulting in the ground being disturbed or exposed, and in the event that such construction is completed after the end of the growing season, such landscaping shall then be installed within 60 days of the start of the next growing season. If land filling or land reclamation or excavation is done in a residential area, the foregoing requirements for landscaping shall be followed so as to require that such property shall not remain disturbed or exposed for a period longer than six months. Silt fences and other methods to prevent soil erosion shall be installed and maintained on any portions of a lot that is not covered with growing grass or other proper ground cover or landscaping until a stable ground cover is established or landscaping completed. All areas disturbed by grading which surround the principal building and accessory buildings on a property which are not driveway, sidewalks or patios shall be landscaped with grass, shrubs, trees or other suitable landscaping materials, except as may be otherwise specifically authorized by Ordinance 9.51, Subd. 12.

Section 2. City Code Chapter 1 entitled "General Provisions and Definitions Applicable to the Entire City Code, including Penalty for Violation" and Section 9.99 entitled "Violation, a Misdemeanor" are hereby adopted in their entirety by reference as though repeated verbatim herein. The continued violation of any provisions of this ordinance shall constitute a separate offense for each and every day that such violation shall continue. Nothing in this ordinance shall be construed to limit the City's other available legal remedies for any violation of the law, including, without limitation, criminal, civil and injunctive actions.

This ordinance to become effective from and after its passage and publication according to law.

ORDINANCE: M/S PETERSON/MILLER TO HAVE THE SECOND READING OF AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF GRANITE FALLS, MINNESOTA, AMENDING CITY CODE CHAPTER 4.

ORDINANCE NO. 155, 2ND SERIES

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF GRANITE FALLS, MINNESOTA, AMENDING CITY CODE CHAPTER 4 ENTITLED "CONSTRUCTION LICENSING, PERMITS AND REGULATIONS, SECTION 4.21, ADDITIONAL CONSTRUCTION STANDARDS, BY ADDING SECTION 4.24, COMPLETION OF WORK, AND ADOPTING BY REFERENCE CITY CODE CHAPTER 1 AND SECTION 4.99, WHICH, AMONG OTHER THINGS, CONTAINS PENALTY PROVISIONS

The City of Granite Falls does ordain as follows:

Section 4.24, Completion of Work, is hereby added to read as follows.

Section 4.24. Completion of Work.

A. Any person or entity constructing, altering, repairing, remodeling or adding to any structure, including single family, multiple family dwellings or other structures located within the City limits and areas subject to the provisions of this Code, including an attached or detached garage or accessory structure, shall complete all work with respect to the same within 180 days after the date required for completion of such work as authorized by the terms of the original building permit. Completion of work includes completing the structure and all interior and exterior finishes, including, but not limited to, siding, windows, roofing, driveways, retaining walls, decks, patios, interior finishes, to include plumbing, wiring and all related matters. The City building official may extend the time for completion upon written request by the permittee establishing that circumstances beyond the control of the permittee prevented the completion of the work for which the building permit was initially authorized. In the event a building permit has initially been issued and expires or is revoked and the structure remains in the same condition for a period beyond 90 days after the expiration or revocation of such permit and the failure to obtain an extension, then in the event a complaint is filed, the structure may be declared by the City Building Inspector to be a public nuisance and in addition to any and all other remedies as may be provided by law, the structure may then be ordered removed or other actions taken.

B. Violation. The continued violation of this provision shall constitute a separate offense for each and every day that such violation shall continue. In addition to other remedies as may be provided by this Code and the State Building Code for violation, the City shall not be precluded from other criminal, civil or injunctive

relief, to include enforcement of each and every day that a violation continues as a misdemeanor pursuant to the terms of this Code.

Section 2. City Code Chapter 1 entitled "General Provisions and Definitions Applicable to the Entire City Code, including Penalty for Violation" and Section 4.99 entitled "Violation, a Misdemeanor" are hereby adopted in their entirety by reference as though repeated verbatim herein. The continued violation of any provisions of this ordinance shall constitute a separate offense for each and every such violation shall continue. Noting in this ordinance shall be construed to limit the City's other available legal remedies for any violation of the law, including, without limitation, criminal, civil and injunctive actions.

This ordinance to become effective from and after its passage and publication according to law.
