

OFFICIAL CITY COUNCIL PROCEEDINGS  
REGULAR SESSION  
JANUARY 18, 2011

A regular session of the Granite Falls City Council was called to order by Mayor David Smiglewski at 7:30 p.m., Tuesday, January 18<sup>th</sup>, in the Council Chambers of City Hall. Council Members present: DuWayne Galow, Steve Nordaune, Steve Schaub, Joe Fagnano and Scott Peterson. Council Member absent: Bill Miller. Staff present: City Manager Bill Lavin and City Clerk Joan Taylor. Others in attendance: Electrical Superintendent Don Reznechek, Utilities Commission members Keith Koerlin and Dennis VanHoof, City Attorney Greg Holmstrom, Steve Thompson – CMMPA, Ed Cain – Legislative Associates and Advocate Tribune News Editor Scott Tedrick.

MINUTES: M/S NORDAUNE/SCHAUB TO APPROVE THE MINUTES OF THE JANUARY 3<sup>rd</sup> REGULAR MEETING. Motion carried unanimously by those present.

BILLS: M/S NORDAUNE/GALOW TO APPROVE BILLS PRESENTED FOR PAYMENT. Motion carried unanimously by those present.

REPORTS: The following reports were acknowledged at this time, Airport Commission, EDA Board, Hospital Board and Police Chief.

DEER DEPREDATION: Council received a report from Assistant Police Chief Beninga relative to the special permit archery hunt held within the city limits in 2010. Ten permits were issued and a total of three deer were harvested. Following discussion, M/S GALOW/NORDAUNE TO OFFER THE ARCHERY DEER HUNT AGAIN IN 2011. Motion carried unanimously by those present.

PEDESTRIAN BRIDGE: Following discussion Schaub introduced a resolution authorizing the submittal of grant application to the Minnesota DNR for funding through the Federal Recreational Trail Program for restoration/rehabilitation of the pedestrian bridge.

RESOLUTION NO. 11-05

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING SUBMITTAL OF GRANT APPLICATION  
To MN DNR FOR FEDERAL RECREATIONAL TRAIL PROGRAM

WHEREAS, the City of Granite Falls supports the grant application made to the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources for the Federal Recreational Trail Program. The application is to restore/rehabilitate the Granite Falls Pedestrian Bridge. The bridge is of historical significance and also serves as the critical crossing of the Minnesota River for the proposed Minnesota River Trail Project; and

WHEREAS, the City of Granite Falls recognizes the fifty (50) percent match requirement for the Federal Recreational Trail Program, and is committed to secure the matching funds.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF GRANITE FALLS, MINNESOTA authorizing submittal of the grant application to the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources for Federal Recreational Trail Program funding; and if the city is awarded a grant by the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources, the city agrees to accept the grant award, and may enter into an Agreement with the State of Minnesota for the above referenced project. The City of Granite Falls will comply with all applicable laws, environment requirements and regulations as stated in the grant agreement; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the City Council of the City of granite Falls names the fiscal agent for the City of Granite Falls for this project as: Jennifer Ortloff, Finance Director, City of Granite Falls, 641 Prentice Street, Granite Falls, MN 56241.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City of Granite Falls hereby assures the Granite Falls Pedestrian Bridge will be maintained for a period of no less than 20 years.

ORDINANCE: M/S NORDAUNE/SCHAUB TO HAVE THE SECOND READING OF AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF GRANITE FALLS, MINNESOTA, AMENDING CITY CODE CHAPTER 6.

ORDINANCE NO. 157, 2<sup>ND</sup> SERIES

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF GRANITE FALLS, MINNESOTA, AMENDING CITY CODE CHAPTER 6 ENTITLED, "OTHER BUSINESS REGULATIONS AND LICENSING", BY AMENDING CERTAIN PROVISIONS CONTAINED WITHIN ORDINANCE 6.35, ENTITLED "TOBACCO", SUCH AMENDMENTS PROVIDING NEW DEFINITIONS OF "TOBACCO PRODUCTS" PROHIBITING THE SELLING OF TOBACCO PRODUCTS AND RELATED ITEMS IN OPEN OR SELF-SERVICE DISPLAYS, RESTRICTING YOUTH ACCESS TO SUCH PRODUCTS AND PROVIDING OTHER PROVISIONS AS REQUIRED BY THE TOBACCO MODERNIZATION AND COMPLIANCE ACT OF 2010.

The City of Granite Falls does ordain as follows:

Section 1. Section 6.35, Subd. 2A - Tobacco Products, is hereby amended to read as follows:

A. Tobacco Products: "Tobacco Products" means any products containing, made or derived from tobacco that is intended for human consumption, whether chewed, smoked, absorbed, dissolved, inhaled, snorted, sniffed or ingested by any other means, or any component, part or accessory of a tobacco product, including, but not limited to, cigars, little cigars, cheroots, stogies, periques, granulated, plug cut, crimp cut, ready rubbed and other smoking tobacco, snuff, snuff flour, cavendish, plug and twist tobacco, fine cut and other chewing tobacco, shorts, refuse scraps, clippings, cuttings and sweepings of tobacco and other kinds and forms of tobacco, but does not include cigarettes as defined in this section. Tobacco products excludes any tobacco product that has been approved by the United States Food and Drug Administration for sale as a tobacco cessation product, as a tobacco dependence product or for other medical purposes, and is being marketed and sold solely for such an approved purpose.

Section 2. Section 6.35, Subd. 6C - Prohibited Sales, is hereby amended to read as follows:

C. By means of self-service methods whereby the customer does not need to make a verbal or written request to an employee of the licensed premises in order to receive the tobacco, tobacco product or tobacco related device and whereby there is not a physical exchange of the tobacco, tobacco product or tobacco related device between the licensee or the licensee's employee and the

customer. No person shall offer for sale tobacco or tobacco related devices as defined in this ordinance in open displays which are accessible to the public without the intervention of a store employee.

Section 3. Section 6.35, Subd. 6 - Prohibited Sales, is hereby amended to add Paragraph G - Promotional Distribution, as follows:

G. Promotional Distribution. No person shall engage in the promotional distribution of smokeless tobacco products or cigarettes, cigars, pipe tobacco or other tobacco products as defined in this ordinance, except that single serving samples of tobacco may be distributed promotionally in tobacco stores.

Section 4. Section 6.35, Subd. 11 - Other Illegal Acts, is hereby amended to add Paragraph E - Nicotine Delivery Products, as follows:

E. Nicotine Delivery Products. It shall be illegal to sell nicotine or lobelia delivery devices to a minor unless such sale and delivery has been approved by the Food and Drug Administration for medical purposes.

Section 5. City Code Chapter 1 entitled "General Provisions and Definitions Applicable to the Entire City Code, including Penalty for Violation" and Section 5.99 entitled "Violation, a Misdemeanor" are hereby adopted in their entirety by reference as though repeated verbatim herein.

This ordinance to become effective from and after its passage and publication according to law.

COMMUNITY FOREST BONDING GRANT: Council reviewed correspondence received from the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources formally advising the city

that the 2010/2012 MN Community Forest Bonding Grant submitted by the city has been approved in the amount of \$25,000. The amount received will result in planting a total of 350 trees throughout the community. The planning, bidding and ordering will take place in 2011 with the planting to be completed in 2012.

MINNESOTA FALLS DAM: Council was advised that Yellow Medicine County will be hosting a meeting on Friday, January 28<sup>th</sup> at 9:00 a.m. in the YMC Board Room to discuss the planned removal of the Minnesota Falls dam.

FLOOD MITIGATION: Council reviewed an update which was recently sent to those properties along Prentice Street.

CHARITABLE GAMBLING: Council acknowledged receipt of a Minnesota Lawful Gambling Application for Exempt Permit from the Granite Falls Chamber of Commerce to conduct the Western Fest raffle. Council agreed to waive the 60-day time requirement of this permit application and took no further action indicating to the state that the local authority approves the application.

FIRE DEPARTMENT: The Fire Department has requested a liaison be appointed between the City Council and the Fire Department. Following discussion it was the consensus of council to appoint Council Member Scott Peterson as the liaison.
