A regular session of the Granite Falls City Council was called to order by Mayor David Smiglewski at 7:30 p.m., Monday, June 4th, in the Council Chambers of City Hall. MINUTES: M/S MILLER/NORDAUNE TO APPROVE THE MINUTES OF THE MAY 21ST REGULAR MEETING. Motion carried unanimously.

BILLS: M/S NORDAUNE/SCHAUB TO APPROVE BILLS PRESENTED FOR PAYMENT. Motion carried unanimously.

REPORT: The Building Inspector's report was acknowledged at this time.

HAZARDOUS BUIDING: As no work has been completed on a structure located at 735 9th Avenue Nordaune introduced the following resolution and moved it adoption ordering an inspection of this structure.

RESOLUTION NO. 12-77

RESOLUTION ORDERING INSPECTIONS OF STRUCTURE PER MINNESOTA STATUTE 463.15

WHEREAS, it has been reported to the City Council that the structure located at 735 9th Avenue may be a hazardous building and constitute a fire hazard or a hazard to public safety or health due to disrepair and inadequate maintenance.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF GRANITE FALLS, MINNESOTA, ordering the City Building Inspectors and, if necessary, the State Fire Marshall or Fire Chief to make an inspection of said building and make a report of said inspection within thirty (30) days hereof to the City Council for purposes of making findings and determination of whether or not said buildings constitute a "hazardous building" within the meaning of Minnesota Statutes 463.15.
