## OFFICIAL CITY COUNCIL PROCEEDINGS REGULAR SESSION FEBRUARY 4, 2012

A regular session of the Granite Falls City Council was called to order by Mayor David Smiglewski at 7:30 p.m., Monday, February 4<sup>th</sup>, in the Council Chambers of City Hall.
