OFFICIAL CITY COUNCIL PROCEEDINGS REGULAR SESSION AUGUST 19, 2013

A regular session of the Granite Falls City Council was called to order by Mayor David Smiglewski at 7:30 p.m., Monday, August 19th, in the Council Chambers of City Hall. Council Members present: DuWayne Galow, Sarina Otaibi, Steve Schaub, Joe Fagnano and Scott Peterson. Council Member absent: Steve Nordaune. Staff present: Finance Director Michael Betker and City Clerk Joan Taylor. Also in attendance was Advocate Tribune News Writer Kathy Velde.

- MINUTES: M/S SCHAUB/GALOW TO APPROVE THE MINUTES OF THE AUGUST 5TH REGULAR MEETING. Motion carried unanimously by those present.
- BILLS: M/S GALOW/SCHAUB TO APPROVE BILLS PRESENTED FOR PAYMENT. Motion carried unanimously by those present.
- REPORTS: The following reports were acknowledged at this time EDA Board, Fire Department, Hospital Board, Park Board and Police Chief.
- SALVATION ARMY HEATSHARE: Fagnano introduced the following resolution and moved its adoption authorizing execution of an agreement with the Salvation Army to continue participation in the HeatShare Program effective September 1, 2013 through August 31, 2014.

RESOLUTION NO. 13-101

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING EXECUTION OF AGREEMENT WITH SALVATION ARMY TO CONTINUE PARTICIPATION IN HEATSHARE PROGRAM

WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution No. 93-133, council authorized execution of an agreement with the Salvation Army to administer its HeatShare program which furnishes financial assistance to special needs residents with payment of residential energy bills through the combined efforts of the Granite Falls Municipal Utilities and the Salvation Army; and

WHEREAS, in future years council authorized execution of agreements with the Salvation Army to continue participating in the HeatShare Program;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF GRANITE FALLS, MINNESOTA, authorizing execution of an agreement with the Salvation Army to continue participation in the HeatShare Program as administered by the Salvation Army, effective September 1, 20013 to August 31, 2014.

RESOLUTION NO. 13-102

RESOLUTION WAIVING CALLING FOR QUOTES AND ACCEPTING QUOTE FOR AIR HANDLING UNIT – KILOWATT COMMUNITY CENTER

WHEREAS, the following quotes were solicited for the purchase and installation of an air handling unit for the pool area in the Kilowatt Community Center:

Corporate Mechanical \$7,510.00

Division Mechanical Services \$8,510.00 UHL \$9,000.00

WHEREAS, it being in the best interest of the city to expedite the purchase of the air handling unit at the KCC, it has been recommended that council waive calling for quotes and accepting the quote from Corporate Mechanical in the amount of \$7,510 for the replacement of the air handling unit in the pool area of the KCC.

With second by Schaub, the resolution was adopted unanimously by those present.

HIGHLAND PARK: Council reviewed correspondence received from Brett Almich explaining that he is raising funds to place an electronic scoreboard at the Highland Park ball field. He is inquiring if the city crew would be able to install the scoreboard. Following discussion M/S SCHAUB/GALOW RECOGNIZING THE DONATION OF AN ELECTRONIC SCOREBOARD FOR THE HIGHLAND PARK BALL FIELD AND AUTHORIZING THE CITY CREW TO INSTALL THE SCOREBOARD AT THE FIELD AFTER REVIEW OF THE PLANS AS PROPOSED BY BRETT ALMICH. Motion carried unanimously by those present.

PEDESTRIAN BRIDGE: Council reviewed correspondence received from MnDOT, Office of Environmental Services, which has determined that the proposed work minimizes the changes to the bridge while accomplishing the purpose and need and will lead to a "no-adverse effect". Now the Minnesota State Historic Preservation Office will have until September 6th to provide comments based upon the submittal of 60% of the plans. Council was also advised that a Corps of Engineers permit will be required for this project.

Regarding the sanitary sewer lift station, this project is also currently being reviewed by the Minnesota State Historic Preservation Office. Once their review is completed the architect and engineering documents will be submitted to the Federal EDA for review.

- WATER TREATMENT PLANT: Open House for the new Water Treatment Plant has been rescheduled for September 28th from 11:00 to 3:00. Council was also advised that the contractor continues to work on the final punch list.
- 2013 UTILITY/STREET IMPROVEMENTS: Council reviewed an update received from City Engineer Berryman relative to the 2013 Utility and Street Improvements.

- HYDRO REPAIRS: The bid opening dates for the repairs to the hydro turbines and the upgrades to the SCADA system have been changed to September 9th and September 5th respectively.
- PIONEERLAND LIBRARY SYSTEM: A final meeting will be scheduled for some time in September for the Granite Falls Library and Dawson Library to meet with Pioneerland Executive Director Mark Ranum to discuss issues of concern.
- PUBLIC HEARING: Mayor Smiglewski opened a duly advertised public hearing at 8:00 p.m. for the purpose of obtaining input concerning the city's intent to implement an adjustment to the sewer rates. Council was provided with an overview of the sewer fund's financial condition noting that with this increase would generate approximately \$30,000 of additional revenue on an annual basis. After discussion the hearing was closed at 8:12 p.m.
- SEWER RATES: Schaub introduced the following resolution and moved its adoption to adjust the sewer rates from \$3.10/100 cu.ft. to \$3.35/100 cu.ft and an increase from \$4 to \$5 in the monthly availability charge to become effective with the utility bills due November 15, 2013 and the increase from \$3.35/100 cu.ft. to \$3.60/100 cu.ft and an increase from \$5 to \$5.50 in the monthly availability charge to become effective with the utility bills due May 15, 2014.

RESOLUTION NO. 13-103

RESOLUTION INCREASING SEWER RATES EFFECTIVE WITH UTILITY BILLS DUE NOVEMBER 15, 2013 AND MAY 15, 2014

WHEREAS, the Granite Falls City Council did advertise in the Granite Falls Advocate Tribune August 7th, for a public hearing to be held Monday, August 19, 2013, at 8:00 p.m. to receive input from the public of a two-stepped adjustment in sewer rates from \$3.10/100 cu.ft. to \$3.35/100 cu.ft and an increase from \$4 to \$5 in the monthly availability charge to become effective with the utility bills due November 15, 2013; and

WHEREAS, the second step increase in the sewer rates from \$3.35/100 cu.ft. to \$3.60/100 cu.ft and an increase from \$5 to \$5.50 in the monthly availability charge to become effective with the utility bills due May 15, 2014; and

WHEREAS, City Code, Chapter 3, Section 3.02, requires a published notice of adoption of such resolution thirty days prior to the effective date thereof.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF GRANITE FALLS, MINNESOTA, approving the adjustment in sewer rates from \$3.10/100 cu.ft. to \$3.35/100 cu.ft and an increase from \$4 to \$5 in the monthly availability charge to become effective with the utility bills due November 15, 2013 and the increase from \$3.35/100 cu.ft. to \$3.60/100 cu.ft and an increase from \$5 to \$5.50 in the monthly availability charge to become effective with the utility bills due May 15, 2014.
