Also in attendance were Lucas Youngsma from the DNR and Advocate Tribune News Editor Scott Tedrick.

MINUTES: M/S NORDAUNE/SCHAUB TO APPROVE THE MINUTES OF THE JANUARY 6th REGULAR MEETING. Motion carried unanimously.

SOUTHWEST INITIATIVE FOUNDATION: Following discussion Galow introduced a resolution and moved its adoption authorizing the city's contribution to Southwest Initiative Foundation for 2014 in the amount of \$1,250.

DNR: DNR Area Hydrologist Lucas Youngsma was in attendance Tuesday evening to present to the city a plaque in recognition of the flood mitigation activities the city has undertaken over the past several years. As a result of the city's efforts the city's rating class for flood insurance improved thereby qualifying some residents for a 25% discount on flood insurance premiums and other residents a 10% discount on premiums.

- DEER DEPREDATION: Council reviewed a report from Assistant Police Chief Beninga relative to the special permit archery hunt held within the city limits in 2013. RENEWAL FUEL STANDARDS: Nordaune introduced the following resolution and moved its adoption opposes any reduction in the RFS and calls on the EPA to protect current targets for ethanol production.

RESOLUTION NO. 14-11

RESOLUTION SUPPORTING THE RENEWABLE FUEL STANDARD

WHEREAS, the Granite Falls community has greatly benefited by the construction of an ethanol plant at an estimated value of 65 million dollars creating thirty-eight well paying jobs with an annual payroll of \$2.7 million; and

WHEREAS: The Renewable Fuel Standard (RFS) has been a successful, forward-looking policy that drives down the price of gasoline, creates jobs, sparks new business and investment in our community and reduces our dependence on foreign oil; and

WHEREAS: The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) has recently proposed reducing the RFS targets for ethanol, which will have serious negative consequences for our local consumers, businesses and community; and

WHEREAS: The RFS drives down the price of gas, saving consumers an average of \$1.09 a gallon in 2011 and allowing our community members to keep more of their hard-earned money; and

WHEREAS: Ethanol can produced here in Minnesota, which creates jobs and sparks news businesses and investment in our community, supporting over \$5 billion in economic activity and 12,500 jobs in Minnesota each year according to an independent study by the Minnesota Department of Agriculture; and

WHEREAS: Using more Minnesota-made fuels reduces our dangerous dependence on foreign oil, keeping more of our money here at home instead of sending it overseas, often to countries hostile to the United States; and

WHEREAS: Ethanol is a cleaner-burning fuel than gasoline, reducing greenhouse gas emission and protecting our air, land and water; and

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED: That our community opposes any reduction in the RFS and calls on the EPA to protect current targets for ethanol production.
