# OFFICIAL CITY COUNCIL PROCEEDINGS REGULAR SESSION FEBRUARY 3, 2014

A regular session of the Granite Falls City Council was called to order by Mayor David Smiglewski at 7:30 p.m., Monday, February 3<sup>rd</sup>, in the Council Chambers of City Hall. MINUTES: M/S NORDAUNE/SCHAUB TO APPROVE THE MINUTES OF THE JANUARY 21<sup>ST</sup> REGULAR MEETING. Motion carried unanimously.

#### **RESOLUTION NO. 14-17**

## RESOLUTION OPPOSING DEMOLITION AND REMOVAL OF BUILDING ON MN WEST GRANITE FALLS CAMPUS

WHEREAS, the 300 building on the Granite Falls campus of Minnesota West Community and Technical College is a high quality academic building providing quality classroom space and quality shop space for hands-on instruction; and

WHEREAS, the 300 building is the newest instructional and academic building on the Granite Falls campus; and

WHEREAS, the 300 building at Granite Falls provides the necessary room for the nationally recognized Fluid Power Technology Program; and

WHEREAS, the 300 building at Granite Falls has some available space for locating greatly needed additional hands-on technical and trade program training; and

WHEREAS, the MnSCU Board of Trustees has requested the Minnesota Legislature include language in their Capital Investment Bill in the upcoming 2014 session that would provide capital expenditures at the Granite Falls campus; and

WHEREAS, those proposed capital expenditures for the Granite Falls campus would include funding for the demolition and removal of the 300 building at the campus; and

WHEREAS, the 300 building has a relatively low cost of operation and has a useful life expectancy of several more decades; and

WHEREAS, avoiding the high cost of demolishing the high quality masonry constructed 300 building at the Granite Falls campus would save the State of Minnesota more than \$1 Million in capital investment funds.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF GRANITE FALLS, MINNESOTA, urging the Minnesota Legislature to reject the proposal to demolish and remove the 300 Building at the Granite Falls campus of Minnesota West Community and Technical College and instead preserve the building and instead provide for a smaller more cost-effective capital investment amount that includes the necessary proposed upgrades to the Fluid Power Technology Program and;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City of Granite Falls does encourage the Minnesota West administration and MnSCU Board of Trustees to use available space in the 300 building for additional much-needed trade and technical programming.

WATER TREATMENT PLANT: Staff advised council that the city's response to questions raised by Rural Development concerning Change Order No. 4 should be completed by this week. Also Stantec will be in town on Tuesday to complete a more detailed review of the retaining wall adjacent to the river.

MEMORIAL PARK: Council reviewed a proposal received from the Regional Development Commission in the amount of \$2,080 to provide grant writing services to complete an application to the DNR's Outdoor Recreation Grant Program. Following discussion Norduane introduced a resolution and moved its adoption authorizing execution of a contract with the RDC to complete a grant application to the DNR for replacement of the restroom facilities and improvements to the large shelter house in Memorial Park.
