OFFICIAL CITY COUNCIL PROCEEDINGS REGULAR SESSION APRIL 21, 2014

A regular session of the Granite Falls City Council was called to order by Mayor David Smiglewski at 7:30 p.m., Monday, April 21st, in the Council Chambers of City Hall. Council Members present: DuWayne Galow, Sarina Otaibi, Steve Nordaune, Steve Schaub, Joe Fagnano and Scott Peterson. Staff present: City Manager Bill Lavin and Finance Director Michael Betker. Also in attendance were Hospital Administrator George Gerlach, City Engineer Dave Berryman, Tom Dye from Stantec, Dorian Gatchell and Advocate Tribune News Editor Scott Tedrick.

- MINUTES: M/S NORDAUNE/SCHAUB TO APPROVE THE MINUTES OF THE APRIL 7TH REGULAR MEETING AND APRIL 10TH BOARD OF APPEAL. Motion carried unanimously.
- BILLS: M/S NORDAUNE/GALOW TO APPROVE BILLS PRESENTED FOR PAYMENT. Motion carried unanimously.
- AMERICAN LEGION: Dorian Gatchell, on behalf of the American Legion, was in attendance requesting council approve the use of Sorlien Park for a dance to be held on Saturday, August 16th. They also requested the city extend their liquor license temporarily to the area to be blocked off for the dance. Following discussion M/S NORDAUNE/SCHAUB TO ALLOW THE AMERICAN LEGION THE USE OF SOLIEN PARK AND TO EXTEND ITS LIQUOR LICENSE TEMPORARILY FOR THIS AREA ON SATURDAY, AUGUST 16TH. Motion carried unanimously.
- 2014 STREET/UTILITY IMPROVEMENTS: City Engineer Berryman and Tom Dye from Stantec were in attendance to discuss with council the proposed 2014 Street and Utility Improvement Program. Following discussion Nordaune introduced a resolution and moved it adoption accepting the engineering report and calling for a public hearing on the proposed 2014 Street and Utility Improvement Program to be set for June 2, 2014 at 8:00 p.m.

RESOLUTION ACCEPTING REPORT AND CALLING FOR HEARING ON PROPOSED 2014 STREET AND UTILITY IMPROVEMENTS

WHEREAS, pursuant to council action a report has been prepared by City Engineer Berryman with reference to the proposed 2014 street and utility improvements described below:

<u>Utility Improvements</u>: projects to include replacement of the sanitary sewer, replacing the exiting 4" watermain with a new 8", and replacing storm sewer

- 5th Avenue from 2nd Street to 3rd Street
- 2nd Street from 5th Avenue north one block to baseball field concession stand (no water main on this project)
- 3rd Street from 5th Avenue north two blocks to 4th Avenue
- Sewer repairs south of American Legion

Street and Utility Improvements:

- Sanitary sewer, watermain and storm sewer extension to serve the new Granite Falls Manor site. Also extending Jordan Drive easterly and south aligning with East Skyline Drive.
- Landscaping Project at old Water Treatment Plant site
- City's share of walking bridge rehabilitation
- Handicap Ramp Construction

WHEREAS, the report provides information regarding whether the proposed improvement is necessary, cost-effective, and feasible; whether it should best be made as proposed or in connection with some other improvements; the estimated cost of the improvement as recommended; and a description of the methodology used to calculate individual assessments for affected parcels.

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING EXECUTION OF CHANGE ORDER NO. 1 – TURBINE REPAIR PROJECT

WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution No. 14-117 council accepted the bid received from Robert L. Carr Company for repairs to Generators 1 & 2 at the Hydro Electric Plant in the amount of \$1,346,000; and

WHEREAS, Change Order #1 has been submitted by Robert L. Carr Co. in the amount of \$397,097 to replace both draft tubes with the work being done behind the cofferdam, also generator #2 should be repaired and reinstalled; and

WHEREAS , total amount of Change Order #1 of \$397,087 will be reduced by the contingency of \$168,250 leaving a remaining balance of \$228,837 will be split evenly between the Public Utility Reserve and Lift Fund Depreciation Reserve.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF GRANITE FALLS, MINNESOTA, authorizing execution of Change Order No. 1 for a increase in the contract with Robert L. Carr Co in the amount of \$397,097 for a total contract price of \$1,743,097.
