# OFFICIAL CITY COUNCIL PROCEEDINGS REGULAR SESSION APRIL 2, 2018

A regular session of the Granite Falls City Council was called to order by Mayor David Smiglewski at 7:00 p.m., Monday, April 2<sup>nd</sup>, in the Council Chambers of City Hall. Council Members present: DuWayne Galow, Sarina Otaibi, Steve Nordaune, Joe Fagnano and Scott Peterson. Staff present: City Manager Crystal Johnson, Finance Director Neal Carstensen and City Clerk Joan Taylor. Also in attendance were EDA Director Cathy Anderson, Sherry Mathiowetz and numerous residents for a public hearing, Tom Kooiman, Chief Executive Officer of Granite Falls Hospital and members of the Hospital Board and Advocate Tribune News Editor Kyle Klausing.

- MINUTES: M/S NORDAUNE/PETERSON TO APPROVE THE MINUTES OF THE MARCH 19<sup>TH</sup> REGULAR MEETING. Motion carried unanimously.
- BILLS: M/S GALOW/NORDAUNE TO APPROVE BILLS PRESENTED FOR PAYMENT. Motion carried unanimously.
- REPORTS: The Kilowatt Community Center Board, Public Works and Utilities Commission reports were acknowledged at this time.
- UTILITY BILLING: Upon the recommendation of the Utilities Commission, M/S NORDAUNE/GALOW TO ADD A TENNESSEAN WARNING TO THE APPLICATION FOR UTILITIES WHICH WOULD ALLOW UTILITY INFORMATION TO BE SHARED WITH LANDLORDS AND MAKE THE LANDLORD ULTIMATELY RESPONSIBLE FOR ANY DELINQUENT UTILITY BILLS ALLOWING THE CITY TO ASSESS THESE AMOUNTS ONTO PROPERTY TAXES. Motion carried unanimously.
- FOOD SHELF: Following discussion, Nordaune introduced a resolution and moved its adoption approving a donation to Neighbors United Resource Center Food Shelf for 2018 of \$5,000.

ORDINANCE: Following discussion M/S NORDAUNE/OTAIBI TO HAVE THE SECOND READING AND SUBSEQUENT ADOPTION OF AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF GRANITE FALLS, MINNESOTA, REVISING, AMENDING, RESTATING, CODIFYING AND COMPILING CERTAIN EXISTING GENERAL ORDINANCES OF THE POLITICAL SUBDIVISION DEALING WITH SUBJECTS EMBRACED IN SUCH CODE OF ORDINANCES, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

ORDINANCE NO. 187, 2<sup>nd</sup> Series

AN ORDINANCE ENACTING A CODE OF ORDINANCES FOR THE CITY OF GRANITE FALLS, MINNESOTA REVISING, AMENDING, RESTATING, CODIFYING AND COMPILING CERTAIN EXISTING GENERAL ORDINANCES OF THE POLITICAL SUBDIVISION DEALING WITH SUBJECTS EMBRACED IN SUCH CODE OF

### ORDINANCES, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, American Legal Publishing Corporation of Cincinnati, Ohio, has completed the S-1, S-2 & S-3 supplements of the Code of Ordinances of the Political Subdivision, which supplements contain all ordinance of a general and permanent nature enacted since the prior supplement to the Code of Ordinances of this political Subdivision; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary to provide for the usual daily operation of the municipality and for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety and general welfare of the municipality that this ordinance take effect at an early date.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE LEGISLATIVE AUTHORITY OF THE POLITICAL SUBDIVISION OF GRANITE FALLS, MINNESOTA:

- Section 1. That the S-1, S-2 & S-3 supplements to the Code of Ordinances of the Political Subdivision as submitted by American Legal Publishing Corporation of Cincinnati, Ohio, be and the same is hereby adopted by reference as if set out in its entirety.
- Section 2. Such supplements shall be deemed published as of the day of its adoption and approval by Legislative Authority and the Clerk of the Political Subdivision is hereby authorized and ordered to insert such supplement into the copy of the Code of Ordinances kept on file in the office of the Clerk.
- Section 3. This ordinance is declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the peace, health, safety and general welfare of the people of this municipality, and shall take effect at the earliest date provided by law.

Adopted by the City Council of Granite Falls, Minnesota this 2<sup>nd</sup> day of April, 2018, by a unanimous vote of the council.

- MEMORIAL PARK IMPROVEMENTS: SHPO has now complete 60% review of the construction documents for the Phase 1 Improvements to Memorial Park.
- PUBLIC HEARING: A duly advertised hearing for the proposed development of Barber Circle and Daniels Drive was called to order by Mayor Smiglewski at 7:15 p.m. After allowing time for public comments and questions, the public hearing was closed at 7:53 p.m. Following the public hearing it was the consensus of council to consider different options and bring back for council consideration cost estimates for the different options.
- FEDERAL ID: Council was advised that it would be impossible to change its Federal ID number.
- CHARITABLE GAMBLING: A gambling license application was acknowledged at this time for the Granite Falls Chamber of Commerce to hold its annual Western Fest raffle.
- GRANITE FALLS HOSPITAL: Tom Kooiman was in attendance along with many Hospital Board members to request permission for the Hospital to purchase the CarrisHeath CentraCare Clinic for the sum of \$900,000. Following discussion Nordaune introduced a resolution and moved its adoption supporting the purchase of the CarrisHealth CentraCare Clinic.
