OFFICIAL CITY COUNCIL PROCEEDINGS REGULAR SESSION FEBRUARY 18, 2020

A regular session of the Granite Falls City Council was called to order by Vice President Steve Nordaune at 7:00 p.m., Monday, February 18th in the Council Chambers of City Hall. Council Members present: DuWayne Galow, Brad Peterson and Scott Peterson. Council Members absent: Mayor Smiglewski, Sharon PaziZea and Joe Fagnano. Staff present: Finance Director Neal Carstensen and City Clerk Joan Taylor. Also in attendance were Chris Kleven and Advocate Tribune News Editor Kyle Klausing.

CONSENT AGENDA: M/S/P GALOW/B. PETERSON TO APPROVE THE CONSENT AGENDA AS FOLLOWS: Minutes, Bills, Building Inspector's Report, Finance Report, Police Chief's Report, Correspondence and Meetings & Events.

REPORTS: The EDA Board report was acknowledged at this time. Council was advised that the Avera Granite Falls Board meeting minutes will not be shared with council but the hospital will update council a couple times a year on hospital's activities.

WASTEWATER TREATMENT PLANT: Following discussion and council's previous questions having been answered, B. Peterson introduced a resolution and moved its adoption accepting the quotes received to upgrade the sequencing batch reactors at the Wastewater Treatment Plant as follows:

And to add a contingency of \$5,000 to cover the costs of an electrician if necessary.

RESOLUTION ACCEPTING QUOTE FOR UPGRADE TO SEQUENCING BATCH REACTORS – WASTEWATER TREATMENT PLANT

WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution No. 20-1 council called for quotes to upgrade the Wastewater Treatment Plant sequencing batch reactors; and

WHEREAS, Integrated Controls, Inc. will furnish and install the hardware and software for the reactors and Parkson Corporation will provide recommendations to ICI for the control logic and will provide training for the operators; and

WHEREAS, the Utilities Commission is recommending accepting the quotes as follows:

WHEREAS, it is also recommended to have a contingency cost for an electrician on-call or on-site at the time of installation at a cost of approximately \$5,000.

HYDRO PLANT REPAIRS: B. Peterson introduced the following resolution and moved its adoption supporting funding by the State of Minnesota for the replacement of Hydro-Electric unit #3 and repairs to the Hydro-Electric Plant building.

RESOLUTION NO. 20-32

RESOLUTION SUPPORTING FUNDING BY THE STATE OF MINNESOTA FOR THE REPLACEMENT OF HYDRO-ELECTRIC UNIT NO. 3 AND REPAIRS TO THE HYDRO-ELECTRIC POWER PLANT BUILDING

WHEREAS, Xcel Energy has retired in place it's Minnesota Valley Generating Station in Granite Falls, and

WHEREAS, the retirement in place of Xcel Energy's power plant has reduced the tax capacity of the city of Granite Falls by over \$6 million, and

WHEREAS, the retirement in place of the Xcel Energy's power plant is resulting in a \$112,000 reduction of property taxes paid to the city by Xcel Energy, and

WHEREAS, the city of Granite Falls has a municipal electric utility, and

WHEREAS, in response to the significant reduction in taxes paid by the Xcel Energy plant, the city council of Granite Falls has increased the yearly transfer from the city's Electric Fund to the city's General Fund by \$100,000, and

WHEREAS, the city of Granite Falls operates a municipal electric utility that includes a hydro-electric plant on the Minnesota River with two recently rehabilitated turbine-powered generators which provides 10-15 percent of the city's power needs, and

WHEREAS, the hydro-electric plant's Unit Three is not workable and in need of replacement and, if replaced, could provide an additional 10-15 percent of the city's power needs (for a total of 20-30 percent) at an estimated cost of \$2.35 million, and

WHEREAS, the additional power gained from replacing turbine /generator Unit 3 will be carbon-free, pollution-free and fuel-free renewable energy, and

WHEREAS, the city's hydroelectric plant building is in need of an estimated \$400,000 in repairs,

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF GRANITE FALLS, MINNESOTA that the city supports efforts to gain funding from the State of Minnesota for the cost of replacing turbine /generator Unit 3 in the city's hydroelectric power plant and making imperative structural repairs to the hydro-electric plant building, as provided for in SF3115/HF3335 and in SF3062/HF3020.
