High-Risk Populations*

Continue to Stay Home, Stay Healthy

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Resume public interactions, with physical distancing

Recreation

Some outdoor recreation (hunting, fishing, golf, boating, hiking)

Outdoor recreation involving fewer than 5 people outside your household (camping, beaches, etc.)

- Outdoor group recreational sports activities (5-50 people)
- Recreational facilities at <50% capacity (gyms, public pools, etc.)
- Professional sports without audience participation (horseracing, baseball, etc.)

Resume all recreational activity

Gatherings (social, spiritual)

- None
- Drive-in spiritual service with one household per vehicle

Gather with no more than 5 people outside your household per week

Allow gatherings with no more than 50 people

Allow gatherings with >50 people

Travel

Essential travel and limited non-essential travel for Phase I permissible activities

Essential travel and limited non-essential travel for Phase I & II permissible activities

Resume non-essential travel

Continue non-essential travel

Business/Employers

- Essential businesses open
- Existing construction that meets agreed upon criteria
- Landscaping
- Auto/RV/Boat/ORV sales
- Retail (curb-side pick-up orders only)
- Car washes
- Pet walkers

- Remaining manufacturing
- Additional construction phases
- In-home/domestic services (nannies, housecleaning, etc.)
- Retail (in-store purchases allowed with restrictions)
- Real estate
- Professional services/office-based businesses (telework remains strongly encouraged)
- Hair and nail salons/barbers
- Pet grooming
- Restaurants <50% capacity table size no larger than 5

- Restaurants/taverns <75% capacity/ table size no larger than 10
- Bar areas in restaurant/taverns at <25% capacity
- Movie theaters at <50% capacity
- Customer-facing government services (telework remains strongly encouraged)
- Libraries
- Museums
- All other business activities not yet listed except for nightclubs and events with greater than 50 people

- Nightclubs
- Concert venues
- Large sporting events
- Resume unrestricted staffing of worksites, but continue to practice physical distancing and good hygiene

* High-risk populations are currently defined by CDC as: persons 65 years of age and older; people of all ages with underlying medical conditions (particularly not well controlled), including people with chronic lung disease or moderate to severe asthma, people who have serious heart conditions, people who are immunocompromised, people with severe obesity, people with diabetes, people with chronic kidney disease undergoing dialysis, and people with liver disease; people who live in a nursing home or long-term care facility.

County Variance Request from Stay Home, Stay Healthy Proclamation COVID-19: Moving from Phase 1 to Phase 2

Local Public Health Officer: Dr. John Bausher

Submit a signed recommendation to local board of health with one of the following recommendations:

- 1) Stay in Phase 1
- 2) Request Phase 2
- 3) Request a subset of Phase 2

Local Hospital: Grays Harbor Community

Submit a letter certifying that they have adequate bed capacity to serve their community and PPE to keep workers safe (includes N95 respirators, surgical masks, face shields, gowns, and gloves).

STEPS



Board of Health

If board chooses to move forward with variance, achieve a majority vote to either

- 1) Request Phase 2
- 2) Request Phase 2 (with implementation elements)

Board of County Commissioners

County Commission must vote on the local board of health's plan as is, cannot be altered

Grays Harbor County Variance Request Analysis

Testing

- No positive tests in the previous 3 weeks
- Sufficient PPE and availability of test kits;
 - 490 test kits/week burn rate,
- Testing Site Resources:
 - Grays Harbor Community Hospital**
 - Mon-Fri 0800-1700
 - GHCH: 30 tests per day – drive thru one tent; can expand
 - Summit Pacific Medical Center**
 - 7 days/week
 - SPMC: up to 3 tests per day – Respiratory Care Unit;
 - >3 tests set up drive thru testing 40 test per day
- Public Health
 - CBTS: 60 test /day - drive thru

Case & Contact Investigation

- 3 staff competently trained to provide case investigation
 - 9 case investigation in 24hrs
- 7 additional staff in training
- Bilingual capability
- 7 case investigation in 24hrs
- Contact Investigation Goal**
 - 100% of cases investigated within 24 hours
 - 100% of contacts reached within 48 hours of receipt of report

ISO/Quarantine

- Pre established support recourses: Econo Lodge, 62 rooms. Contract exp 05/31
- Case Management Services
 - Food Supplies
 - Behavioral Health
 - Transportation
 - Financial
 - Medical monitoring/oversight
- 8th Street Grays Harbor County ISO/ Quarantine Site:
 - 4 rooms quarantine
 - 12 rooms isolation
- Financial Sustainability
- Advanced Plan
 - **QIN Sweet Grass:** GHC/QIN Quarantine Site, 50 rooms
 - **8th Street:** GHC/QIN Isolation Sit , 16 rooms

Response Capability

- Infection control plans in place for each LTC facility, homeless shelter, and other congregate settings
 - Local Drop Teams/Strike Teams coordinated to respond within 24 hours of positive case reported
- Ability to quarantine individuals who can't ISO/Quarantine after being screened: homelessness, halfway houses, EMS/Fire
- Sufficient PPE and availability of test kits
