

## Grays Harbor County Employees Back to Work

### *Public Access to Facilities Remains Closed*

Commissioners approved Resolution No. 2020-046 amending prior Resolutions and bringing County Employees back to work on April 27, 2020. Government functions are listed as essential on the Governor's order and the County has continued to work during this time, at a limited capacity. The Commissioners have determined that employees need to be brought back to work in order for essential functions to continue long term, as long as social distancing and other health safety measures are in place. Most County staff have been working during this crisis, and the County's return to work resolution will only affect a small portion of county staff.

### **Safety and Planning**

The Commissioners individually held meetings with Department Administrators and Elected Officials to discuss safe work options. Telecommuting, social distancing, health screening and additional sanitation measures are in place. All Departments are required to submit and adherence to the Governor's Stay Healthy Order. Every effort is being made to keep employees safe during this time.

### **County Facilities Remain Closed to Public**

All County Facilities remain closed to the public until further notice. Up-to-date information is provided on the County's website and department pages for how business is being conducted during this time. The public may phone or email individual departments for assistance, every effort will be made to assist citizens remotely. Grays Harbor County remains committed to finding a way to balance essential business with people's health and safety.
