

Undetermined Tsunami Threat

Thursday, July 29 2021

At 11:37 PM last night, there was an 8.2 magnitude earthquake located 60 miles SE of Chignik, Alaska. A tsunami warning went into effect for parts of Alaska while a Tsunami advisory went into effect for other parts of Alaska.

Other US and Canadian Pacific coasts in North America were placed in an undetermined tsunami threat while the level of tsunami danger was being evaluated.

Grays Harbor County Emergency Management monitored this situation throughout the night and was prepared to make public notification, if needed.

At 02:34 AM this morning, the National Tsunami Warning Center issued an All Clear for the Washington Coast.

Why didn't you get an alert?

Since this was an Information Statement, Mass Public Notification (Tsunami Sirens [AHAB], NOAA Radios, Text/Phone Call Alerts, etc.) did not occur for this event. When an alert is greater than an Information Statement, Grays Harbor County Alerts are initiated. Please be familiar with the Tsunami Alerts Graphic.
