Recycling Schedule

GLASS, METAL & PLASTIC will be collected every Wednesday EXCEPT for the weeks of Christmas Day 2024 & New Year's Day 2025.

During those weeks glass, metal & plastics will be collected on Thursday.

PAPER & CARDBOARD will be collected every Wednesday EXCEPT for the weeks that include: Christmas Day 2024, New Year's Day 2025, Martin Luther King Day, Presidents' Day, Memorial Day, Labor Day, & Columbus Day.

During those weeks, papers will be collected on Thursdays.

DO NOT RECYCLE: paper plates, cups, towels, cardboard drink containers, cardboard with wax, styrofoam products, plastic bags and wraps, paint and solvent containers, aerosol cans, pesticides or chemicals, mirror, window, safety glass, light bulbs, ceramics, drinking glasses, six pack holders.

DO NOT put newspapers in plastic bags.

E-WASTE RECYCABLES PICK-UP REQUESTS

The Village collects e-waste (computers, monitors, printers, tv's, etc.) however a special pick-up is required. Please call 516-482-2000, extension 142 and leave a message. Be sure to include your name, contact number and items you are discarding. Items must be placed at the curb/end of your driveway. Pick-up will be actioned within 24/48 hours.

SPECIAL PICK-UP REQUESTS

If you require a special pick-up from the Department of Public works, please call 516-482-2000, extension 142 and leave a message. Be sure to include your name, contact number and items you are discarding. Items must be placed at the curb/end of your driveway. Pick-up will be actioned within 24/48 hours. An example of special pick-up items includes furniture, toys, appliances, mattresses, etc. Please note, New York State Law requires removal of the refrigerator door from the appliance and mattresses to be fully wrapped in plastic prior to putting these items out for pick-up.

Contractors are responsible, not the Village's Department of Public Works, for removal of all material and debris resulting from construction work done on the property.

2025 S.T.O.P PROGRAM

Under no condition should the following be put out for collection: gasoline, waste oil, **used or unused needles, medical waste, and pharmaceuticals**, oil-based paints, flammable liquids or toxic substances. The Town of North Hempstead's S.T.O.P. (Stop Throwing Out Pollutants) program offers residents the opportunity to dispose their household hazardous waste in an environmentally friendly manner.

SNOW & ICE ALERT

Garbage and recyclable collections may be delayed or canceled due to weather conditions. In the event of snow or ice, a clear path must be made from the street to the collection point. Failure to provide a clear path may result in a non-pickup.

Sidewalks must be cleared of ice and snow by property owner within 24 hours.

REMINDER: No motor vehicles may be parked on public streets and lots from 3:00a.m. to 6:00 a.m., except where signage otherwise permits.

STORM WATER SYSTEM

Leaves and other yard waste may not be put on the roadway as this could block our drainage system. Keep drains clear of all debris and do not discard any chemicals or pesticides down the storm drains. Contaminants can affect our drinking water and our environment.

Call 811 to request a mark-out several days **BEFORE** you plan to break ground to prevent utility damage.

WHAT CAN I RECYCLE?

PAPER AND CARDBOARD:

- Paper & cardboard
- Newspapers & inserts
- Magazines & newsletters
- Catalogs, junk mail & envelopes
- Construct & wrapping paper
- Index & greeting cards
- Paperback & hardcover books
- Clean pizza boxes
- Telephone books
- Cereal & food boxes (remove plastic bags)

Do Not Recycle

- Paper plates, cups & towels
- Cardboard drink containers
- Cardboard with wax or Styrofoam

GLASS, METAL AND PLASTIC:

- Empty plastic containers with **number 1, 2, 4, 5 or 6** in the recycle symbol on the container
- Empty food cans
- Empty beverage cans
- Clear & colored glass containers
- Clean aluminum pans

Do Not Recycle

- Styrofoam products
- Plastic bags & wraps
- Paint & solvent containers
- Aerosol cans
- Cans contaminated with pesticides or chemicals
- Mirror, window & safety glass
- Light bulbs
- Ceramics
- Drinking glasses & broken glass
- Six pack holders (cut before discarding)

Do not put newspapers in plastic bags. Put them in bins, paper bags or tie them with twine. Rinse all glass, plastic and metal.
