Phase II Activities Undertaken On Behalf of Member Municipalities March 10, 2022 to March 9, 2023 Permit Year

Water Quality Trends

- Completed a DEC-approved Quality Assurance Project Plan (QAPP) for the 2022 water quality monitoring season. Funding for this project was provided from the New York State Environmental Protection Fund as administered by the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation.
- Completed two DEC-approved Data Usability Assessment Reports (DUARs): one for the 2022 water quality monitoring season and the other for data collected from 2016 through 2021. Reports covering that data are forthcoming. Funding for this project was provided from the New York State Environmental Protection Fund as administered by the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation.

MCM # 1 – Public Education and Outreach

Distributing educational materials and performing outreach to inform citizens about the impacts polluted stormwater runoff discharges can have on water quality.

- Continued a quarterly e-newsletter with 162 subscribers. A link to sign-up is posted on the Committee's website and on the Facebook page and an archive of all past mailings is here: https://us17.campaign-archive.com/home/?u=df70a805d021557ae64c3aaa5&id=f7fd5c7f5f. The Committee also generated a QR code for use at tabling events and on literature to access the newsletter sign-up form digitally. - The Committee created a landing page, <u>manhassetbayprotectioncommittee.org/wqip.html</u>, to support the development of a Water Quality Improvement Plan. This work is funded by a grant from the New York State Department of State under Title 11 of the Environmental Protection Fund.
- The Committee and its consultant have started the process of preparing a Community Outreach/Participation Plan for the development of a Water Quality Improvement Plan. This plan will lay out the method and process to encourage community participation in the planning process. The purpose of the outreach plan is to enhance public understanding of the watershed planning project and to encourage early and continued public participation in selecting, designing, and implementing the management measures. This work is funded by a grant from the New York State Department of State under Title 11 of the Environmental Protection Fund.
- The Committee and its consultant have prepared an initial vision statement that expresses an idea of what the watershed will become. The vision will set the tone of the watershed plan and will be used throughout the planning process. In addition, an initial set of watershed goals and objectives were also created to provide a realistic framework for

achieving the vision as well as help focus limited resources. This was published to manhassetbayprotectioncommittee.org/wqip.html. This work is funded by a grant from the New York State Department of State under Title 11 of the Environmental Protection Fund.

- Continued enhancing the Committee's website in an effort to make the website more navigable and began exclusively using <u>manhassetbay.net</u> as the URL
- Continued to grow the Committee's Facebook presence (https://www.facebook.com/manhassetbay/) and again participated in the #DontTrashLIS social media campaign run this past summer by the Long Island Sound Study and the member organizations of its Citizens Advisory Committee, which highlighted the problem of plastic waste to wildlife and water quality in Long Island Sound and the oceans. The Committee's Facebook page has 440 followers (up from 379 last year).
- The Committee also maintains the following social media sites:

- Co-hosted a virtual public joint protection committee meeting with the Hempstead Harbor, Oyster Bay/Cold Spring Harbor, and Peconic Estuary Protection Committees, the Setauket Harbor Task Force, and Friends of the Bay which was held on May 12, 2022. A recording of the meeting is available on the Committee's YouTube channel. The next joint meeting is planned for May 11, 2023.
- Staffed informational tables with educational pamphlets, giveaways, an interactive watershed model, and kids' activities at the events listed below. This year's giveaways included a canvas tote with the MBPC logo on one side and cartoon fish to color on the other. The Committee also approved the purchase of their own coastal watershed model.
 - Port Washington Public Library Earth Day event at Sunset Park (April 24, 2022)
 - Science Museum of Long Island's "Live at Five" event (August 11, 2022)
 - Port Washington HarborFest (June 5, 2022)
 - Manhasset Al Fresco (September 18, 2022)
- The Children's Services Department of the Port Washington Public Library held a culminating event to wrap up its summer reading program, which was a marine life theme, on August 12, 2022. The Committee taught approximately 63 school-aged children about watersheds and watershed pollution and its impact on Manhasset Bay.
- The Committee purchased logo lapel pins to be used at various events as identifiers and as giveaways.
- Kept members and the general public apprised of updates and the existence of the Army Corps' New York New Jersey Harbor and Tributaries Focus Area Coastal Storm Risk Management Feasibility Study, portions of which could have serious deleterious effects on Manhasset Bay, the surrounding communities, and Long Island Sound if constructed. It is not wholly clear that the Bay would not be affected by the Tentatively Selected Plan, as the Army Corps is using outdated studies to determine impacts on this area. To that end, the Committee:
 - Provided a comment letter to the Army Corps on the NY/NJ HATS report;
 - Attended several virtual (and one in-person) Army Corps' public meetings and offered notes and perspective to Committee members and the general public.

- Forwarded numerous newspaper articles to municipal representatives and others on water quality and environmental issues important to Manhasset Bay. Some of these were also posted to the Committee's social media. Manhasset Bay and/or the Protection Committee were the subject of 12 news articles published during the reporting period. The list of news articles is attached.
- Planned and hosted the annual boat tour of Manhasset Bay for municipal officials on July 21, 2022. There were 27 attendees to this year's event. This annual event raises awareness of Manhasset Bay among participants.
- Distributed aluminum storm drain markers and glue to member municipalities for placement on storm drains.
- Started generating "Monthly Updates," which were sent out to interested members of the public about what the Committee had worked on in the month(s) previous.
- Responded to questions from both member municipalities and the public about the Army Corps' Feasibility Study, fish kills (summer 2022 was very hot), the MS4 program, where stormwater pollution comes from, why does the Bay smell, and other inquiries.
- Distributed educational brochures about stormwater pollution, watersheds, the Committee, feeding geese, organic gardening, impacts of pet feces on water quality, clean boating, storm drain markings, and other water quality related topics.
- Kept the municipalities up-to-date on trainings and other events.
- Monitored Nassau County sewage spill reports.

MCM #2 – Public Participation

Providing opportunities for citizens to participate in program development and implementation, including effectively publicizing public hearings and/or encouraging citizen representatives on a stormwater management panel.

- Held seven (7) Manhasset Bay Protection Committee meetings (open to the public) on March 24, 2022; April 28, 2022; June 9, 2022; October 20, 2022; November 3, 2022; January 19, 2023; and February 9, 2023. Meeting minutes were posted to https://manhassetbayprotectioncommittee.org/PDF_PUBLIC/Minutes/2022/ and https://manhassetbayprotectioncommittee.org/PDF_PUBLIC/Minutes/2023/
- Updated and distributed introductory folders for new committee member representatives in order to educate them on the Committee, stormwater, and regulations. The goal is to make new representatives comfortable in their new role.
- Expanded the annual volunteer beach clean-up into the spring and on two dates: April 3, 2022 at the Manorhaven Beach Town Park and May 7, 2022 at Bay Walk Park. A third event, scheduled in October, had to be cancelled on account of a hurricane. Despite rain at both events, all totaled, approximately 84 volunteers (adults, teens, and kids) picked up 100 pounds of trash. Additionally, this year's clean-up included a "fun patch" for all the children who participated and other giveaways, including informational brochures.
- Conducted a weekly water quality monitoring program (June through August) with North Hempstead Bay Constables and Nassau County Dept. of Health. The Committee's summer intern assisted in the collection and collation of this data. Funding for the 2022 water quality monitoring program was provided from the New York State Environmental Protection Fund as administered by the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation.
- The Committee created a landing page, <u>manhassetbayprotectioncommittee.org/wqip.html</u>, to support the development of a Water

- Quality Improvement Plan. This work is funded by a grant from the New York State Department of State under Title 11 of the Environmental Protection Fund.
- The Committee and its consultant have started the process of preparing a Community Outreach/Participation Plan for the development of a Water Quality Improvement Plan. This plan will lay out the method and process to encourage community participation in the planning process. The purpose of the outreach plan is to enhance public understanding of the watershed planning project and to encourage early and continued public participation in selecting, designing, and implementing the management measures. - Kept the general public apprised of updates and the existence of the Army Corps' *New York New Jersey Harbor and Tributaries Focus Area Coastal Storm Risk Management Feasibility Study* and public hearings. The Committee attended several public meetings and also provided comments to the Army Corps' on their tentatively selected plan.
- Distributed information on the Great Neck and Port Washington Water Pollution Control Districts' *Shed the Meds* collection programs, the Town of North Hempstead's STOP programs, and the Town's Sustainability classes and programs throughout the reporting period.
- Member of the Town of North Hempstead Waterfront Advisory Committee, whose meetings are also open to the public
- Served as the member representative for the Committee on the Long Island Nitrogen Action Plan's (LINAP) Nassau County Subwatershed Planning Advisory work group, Solute Transport Model Advisory work group, and Water Exchange Advisory Work Group.
- Assisted with the development of Nassau County's Nine-Element Watershed Plan
- Continued to provide representation to the Long Island Sound Study (LISS) Citizens Advisory Committee and the LISS Management Committee Watersheds and Embayments work group. In that role, continued work to establish water quality monitoring of embayments as a priority and to develop a mechanism for regular (nongrant) funding to support monitoring efforts. Additionally, the Committee was involved in several meetings with off-shore wind developers and expressed concerns on environmental impacts to Long Island Sound.
- Volunteered as a judge at the Envirothon competition for Long Island high school students on April 28, 2022. This competition was back in person after a hiatus due to the Novel Coronavirus pandemic.
- Began planning an upcoming joint protection committee symposium (public) with the Hempstead Harbor, Oyster Bay/Cold Spring Harbor, and Peconic Estuary Protection

- Committees, the Setauket Harbor Task Force, and Friends of the Bay to be held virtually on May 11, 2023.
- Monitored changes in regulations and advised member municipalities about the release of DEC's ANPRM saline waters reclassification. The Committee also provided DEC with comments and data in response to the ANPRM.
- Joined the Coastal Resiliency Network, which aims to share information on sea level rise and coastal resiliency to and among communities on the Long Island Sound shoreline of New York.
- Attended NEIWPCC's "LIS Seaweed Bioextraction Symposium" on May 18 & 19, 2022 to learn about possible techniques to reduce nitrogen pollution in Manhasset Bay.
- Advertised and attended various webinars, such as the MS4 Compliance & LID webinar on May 12, 2022,
- Advertised and attended the EPA webinar "Using Green Infrastructure to Prevent Flooding from Intensified Storms in NY/NJ area" on March 2, 2023
- Began planning for shellfish seeding of Manhasset Bay. This project is funded by a grant from the USEPA to the north shore protection committees.

MCM #3 – Illicit Discharge Detection and Elimination

Developing and implementing a plan to detect and eliminate illicit discharges to the storm sewer system (includes developing a system map and informing the community about hazards associated with illegal discharges and improper disposal of waste).

- Conducted a weekly water quality monitoring program (May through August) with North Hempstead Bay Constables and Nassau County Dept. of Health.
- Included removing illegal downspout hook-ups as a "What You Can Do" tip on several newsletters and other publications.

MCM # 4 - Construction Site Runoff Control

Developing, implementing, and enforcing an erosion and sediment control program for construction activities that disturb 1 or more acres of land (controls could include silt fences and temporary stormwater detention ponds).

- Monitored changes in regulations and advised member municipalities about the release of DEC's ANPRM saline waters reclassification. The Committee also provided DEC with comments and data in response to the ANPRM.
- Bay constables watched for unusual discharges or conditions while conducting weekly water quality monitoring

MC # 5 – Post Construction Runoff Control

Developing, implementing, and enforcing a program to address discharges of post-construction stormwater runoff from new development and redevelopment areas. Applicable controls could include preventative actions such as protecting sensitive areas (e.g., wetlands) or the use of structural BMPs such as grassed swales or porous pavement.

- Monitored changes in regulations and advised member municipalities of public comment periods as described previously.
- Watched for unusual discharges or conditions while conducting weekly water quality monitoring (summer)

MCM # 6 – Good Housekeeping

Developing and implementing a program with the goal of preventing or reducing pollutant runoff from municipal operations. The program must include municipal staff training on pollution prevention measures and techniques (e.g., regular street sweeping, reduction in the use of pesticides or street salt, or frequent catch-basin cleaning).

 Committee members have shared information on which good housekeeping practices work through Committee meetings as well as changes to their good housekeeping programs.

FUTURE PLANS

- The Seabin, floating trash receptacle, has not yet been operational. The Committee's plan now is to partner with a marina to get it into the water and begin full operation this summer. Then, the Committee will use citizen science to catalog what is collected, and will also be preparing educational materials.
- Due to work on the QAPP, the Manhasset Bay Protection Committee was set back on the goals to finalize and publish the water quality report based on weekly monitoring data collected 2016 to 2018 and a bacteria trend report. These reports will be completed, but an exact date is unknown.
- Prepare articles for Village and other newsletters.
- Other activities as described above.
