Invitation for Bid

IFB# 24-06 Greenfield City Hall Chimney Repair Project

The City of Greenfield is soliciting bids to reline the flue gas chimney at City Hall located at 14 Court Square in Greenfield, MA. The brick chimney is also in various stages of deterioration requiring the top of the chimney to be rebuilt and lower portions repointed. The existing clay tile lining inside the chimney has partially collapsed and will need to be removed before a new liner is installed.

SECTION 1

1.1 SCOPE OF WORK

The chimney at City Hall serves to remove flue gasses from a natural gas fired steam boiler. Moisture and flue gasses in the range of 300-500 degrees F have deteriorated the original clay tile liner to the point that it has partially collapsed inside the chimney. As well, constant expansion and contraction has caused mortar joints to fail on the chimney itself.

The work consists of total removal of any remaining clay liner and replacement with a 316T stainless steel insulated liner, complete with 20 gauge 316 stainless steel crown chase cover and rain cap to prevent further water infiltration. The transition section joining liner to boiler flue box shall be a custom 20 gauge stainless steel tee section with condensation drain and supports.

The proposal shall include rebuilding the top portion of the chimney and repointing the remaining brick as necessary above the roof line. Mortar used for repointing shall be Type O mortar conforming to ASTM C 270. If it is determined that the present condition of the chimney warrants a total rebuild above the roof line, the Contractor will quote this as a separate price

(See Section 4- MASONRY REPOINTING) (Attachment D).

The Contractor shall be responsible for all rigging and scaffolding. Debris netting shall be used where necessary to maintain public safety and property.

Debris generated during this work both inside and outside, shall be controlled during the work and removed daily. Dust containment must be maintained in the immediate work area inside the building with temporary walls and exhaust blowers.

1.2 BIDDERS TO INVESTIGATE

Bidders are required to submit their Bids upon the following express conditions which shall apply to and be deemed a part of every Bid received, specifically: Bidders must satisfy themselves by personal examinations of the site of the work and by such other means as they may wish, as to the actual conditions there existing, the character and requirements of the Work, the difficulties attendant upon its execution, and the accuracy of all estimated quantities stated in the Bid.

1.3 BID SUBMISSION

Bids marked **"IFB 24-06 Greenfield City Hall Chimney Repairs Project"** must be submitted to the Purchasing Department, Attn: Laura Phelps- CPO, 14 Court Square, Greenfield, Massachusetts 01301 by **11:00 AM on Thursday September 7, 2023.** All bids must be upon the blank form included in this Bid document, state the proposed total cost of the work, both in words and in figures, and be signed by the bidder with his business address and place of residence. Bid submissions must also include:

- A Certificate of Tax Compliance signed by the individual submitting the quote (Attachment A)
- OSHA Training Certification (Attachment B)
- A Certificate of Non-Collusion signed by the individual submitting the quote (Attachment C)
- Certificate of Insurance

• References (Section 3)

1.4 EXECUTION OF AGREEMENT

The bidder whose quote is accepted will be notified by letter and agrees to duly execute the AGREEMENT, after notification, for a period ending as specified on bid proposal forms.

1.5 TIME FOR COMPLETION

Materials for this Contract shall be ordered within ten (10) working days from date agreement and site work begin within fifteen (15) days from material delivery. A final completion date shall be determined once the material delivery schedule is understood. It will be the contractor's responsibility to have the site ready to install the equipment once it arrives, except as the work may be interrupted by weather or other adverse conditions as mutually agreed to by the City and the Contractor.

1.6 COMPARISON OF QUOTES

Bids will be compared and awarded to the responsible contractor offering the lowest-priced quotation.

In the event there is a discrepancy in the bid between the unit prices written in words and figures, the prices written in words shall govern. Contract to be awarded on lowest TOTAL cost of project.

The City agrees to examine and consider each bid submitted in consideration of the bidder's agreements, as hereinabove set forth and as set forth in the IFB.

1.7 DISPUTES

In the event of any dispute as to any of the terms and conditions of this Contract, it shall be determined in accord with the laws of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts and the Courts of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts shall have exclusive jurisdiction of the same.

1.8 PREVAILING WAGE RATES

This is a prevailing wage project as required under M.G.L. c.149. The prevailing wage schedule is Attachment E.

1.9 CANCELATION

The City reserves the right to revoke this contracted AGREEMENT in writing with two weeks' notice, if the Contractor is clearly not performing services required in the Contract in a timely or workmanlike manner.

This IFB may be rescinded by the City if lowest acceptable bid exceeds the amount budgeted for this project.

1.10 PRE-BID SITE VISIT

A pre-bid site visit is scheduled for Monday August 28, 2023 at 10:00 AM. Interested Bidders should meet in the parking lot behind City Hall, 14 Court Square, Greenfield, MA 01301.

1.11 RIGHT TO REJECT BIDS

It shall be the City's right to reject any bid that does not appear to meet the overall intent of these specifications. On the other hand, Contractors are encouraged to indicate where their proposal exceeds these minimum specifications.

In addition to meeting the minimum specifications, the successful Contractors shall be responsible for having complied with all applicable federal and state standards, regulations and laws governing these types of systems. This includes compliance with all applicable safety and environmental standards.

1.12 INSURANCE CERTIFICATES

The Contractor will not be permitted to start any construction work until they has submitted certificates covering all insurance called for, and has obtained approval in writing of such certificates from the City. Before starting, and until completion of the guarantee period, the Contractor shall procure, deposit, and maintain with the City, insurance satisfactory to the City as follows:

A. Workmen's Compensation and Employer's Liability Insurance as required by the Workmen's Compensation Laws of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

B. Comprehensive Commercial Liability Insurance covering Bodily Injury and Property Damage (Broad Form) as follows:

Limits of Liability* \$1,000,000 each occurrence \$2,000,000 aggregate

* or \$1,000,000 single limit combined Bodily Injury and Property Damage.

The Comprehensive Commercial Liability Policy shall provide insurance for the Contractor for Bodily Injury and Property Damage to third persons arising out of:

1. Work performed by the Contractor with their own employees, called "premises operations."

2. Work performed by their subcontractors, called "sublet work" or Independent Contractors (this is referred to as Contractor's Protective Liability).

3. The Contractor's liability assumed under this contract, called "Hold Harmless" clauses or indemnity agreement. (This is referred to as Contractual Liability Insurance).

4. Products liability coverage covering the completed building or installation or products furnished. (This is called Products Liability Insurance for the manufacturer and Complete Operations Liability Insurance for the Contractor).

5. If any work is to be performed below the surface of the ground, the coverage shall be extended to include protection against property damage caused by explosion (including blasting), collapse of structures and damage to underground pipes and utilities. (This is known as "XCU" coverage).

C. Comprehensive Automobile Liability Insurance covering Bodily Injury and Property Damage, as follows:

Limits of Liability

Bodily Injury \$ 500,000 each person

\$1,000,000 each accident

Property Damage \$1,000,000 each accident

* or \$500,000 single limit combined Bodily Injury and Property Damage.

This insurance is to apply with respect to all owned or hired vehicles of the Contractor and nonownership protection for all employees of the Contractor engaged in the performance of this contract.

D. All policies shall be so written that the City will be notified of cancellation or restrictive amendment at least 30 days prior to the effective date of such cancellation or amendment. Certificates from the insurance carrier stating the limits of liability and expiration date shall be filed in triplicate with the City before operations are begun. Such certificates not only shall name the types of policy provided, but also shall refer specifically to this Contract* and article and the above paragraphs in accordance with which insurance is being furnished and shall state that such insurance is as required by such paragraphs of this Contract and shall be sufficiently comprehensive as to permit the owner to determine that the required insurance coverage has been provided without the necessity of examining the individual insurance policies.

If the initial insurance expires prior to completion of the Work, renewal certificates shall be furnished by the date of expiration.

* If blanket coverage is furnished, this particular Contract need not be referred to.

E. The Contractor shall require each of their sub-contractors to procure and maintain until the completion of that sub-contractor's work, insurance of the types and to the limits specified in paragraphs A to C, inclusive, above. It shall be the responsibility of the Contractor to insure that all their sub-contractors comply with all of the insurance requirements contained herein relating to such sub-contractors.

No insurances required or furnished hereunder shall, in any way, relieve the contractor of, or diminish any of their responsibilities, obligations and liabilities under the Contract.

1.13 EQUAL EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITY ANTI-DISCRIMINATION AND AFFIRMATIVE ACTION

The successful bidder must comply with Chapter 151B as amended, of the Massachusetts General Laws and with the provisions of Executive Order No. 74, as amended by Executive Order No. 116 dated May 1, 1975 pertaining to Equal Opportunity Anti- Discrimination and Affirmative Action.

1.14 NOTICE TO PROCEED

A written Notice to Proceed shall be issued to the Contractor after receipt of proof of required insurance. No work shall be performed by the Contractor until they have received the Notice to Proceed.

1.15 OBLIGATIONS AND LIABILITY OF CONTRACTOR

The Contractor shall do all work and perform and furnish all the labor, services, materials, equipment, plant, machinery, apparatus, appliances, tools, supplies and all other things (except as otherwise expressly provided herein) necessary and as herein specified for the proper performance and completion of the Work in the manner and within the time hereinafter specified, in strict accordance with the Drawings, Specifications and other Contract Documents, in conformity with the directions and to the satisfaction of the City, and at prices herein agreed upon therefore.

The Contractor shall coordinate their operations with those of any other contractors who may be employed on other work of the City, shall avoid interference therewith, and shall cooperate in the arrangements for storage of materials and equipment.

The Contractor shall conduct their work so as to interfere as little as possible with private business and public travel. Wherever and whenever necessary or required, they shall maintain fences, furnish watchmen, maintain lights, and take such other precautions as may be necessary to protect life and property.

The Contractor shall indemnify and save harmless the City and its officers, agents, servants, and employees, from and against any and all claims, demands, suits, proceedings, liabilities, judgments, awards, losses, damages, cost and expenses, including attorneys' fees, on account of bodily injury, sickness, disease or death sustained by any person or persons or injury or damage to or destruction of any property, directly or indirectly arising out of, relating to or in connection with the Work, whether or not due or claimed to be due in whole or in part to the active, passive or concurrent negligence or fault of the Contractor, their officers, agents, servants or employees, any of their subcontractors, the City or any of its respective officers, agents, demands, suits or proceedings are just, unjust, groundless, false or fraudulent; and the Contractor shall and does hereby assume and agrees to pay for the defense of all such claims, demands, suit and proceedings.

The Contractor shall have complete responsibility for the Work and the protection thereof, and for preventing injuries to persons and damage to the Work and property and utilities on or about the Work, until final completion and final acceptance thereof. They shall, in no way, be relieved of their responsibility by any right of the City to give permission or directions relating to any part of the Work, by any such permission or directions given, or by failure of the City to give such permission or directions. The Contractor shall bear all costs, expenses, losses and damages on account of the quantity or character of the Work or the nature of the land (including but not limited to subsurface conditions) in or under or on which the Work is done being different from the indicated or shown in the Contract Documents or from what was estimated or expected, or on account of the weather, elements, or other causes.

The Contractor shall conduct their operations so as not to damage existing structures or work installed either by them or by other contractors. Any such damage resulting from their operations shall immediately be reported to the City, and the Contractor shall repair and make good as new the damaged portions at their own expense with the consent of the damaged party. In the event that consent is not given, the Contractor shall continue liable for the damage caused.

The Contractor shall be as fully responsible to the City for the acts and omissions of their subcontractors, their officers, agents, servants and employees as they is for their own acts and omissions and those of their own officers, agents, servants and employees.

Should the Contractor sustain any loss, damage or delay through any act or omission of any other contractor or any subcontractor of any such other contractor, the Contractor shall have no claim against the City therefore, other than for any extension of time, but shall have recourse solely to such other contractor or subcontractor.

If any other contractor or any subcontractor of any such other contractor shall suffer or claim to have suffered loss, damage or delay by reason of the acts or omissions of the contractor or of any of their subcontractors, the Contractor agrees to assume the defense against any such claim and to reimburse such other contractor or subcontractor for such loss or damage. The Contractor agrees to and does hereby indemnify and save harmless the City from and against any and all claims by such other contractors or subcontractors alleging such loss, damage or delay and from and against any and all claims, demands, suits, proceedings, liabilities, judgments, awards, losses, damages, cost and expenses, including attorneys' fees, arising out of, relating to or resulting for such claims.

The Contractor shall promptly pay all federal, state and local taxes which may be assessed against them in connection with the Work or their operations under the Contract, including, but not limited to, taxes attributable to the purchase of material and equipment, to the performance of services, and the employment of persons in the prosecution of the Work.

1.16 SUPERVISION OF WORK

The Contractor shall be solely responsible for supervision of the Work, shall give the Work the constant attention necessary to ensure the expeditious and orderly progress thereof, and shall cooperate with the City in every possible way.

Whenever the Contractor or their agent or superintendent is not present on any part of the Work where it may be necessary to give directions or instructions with respect to such work, such directions or instruction may be given by the City to, and shall be received and obeyed by, the foreman or any other person in charge of the particular work involved.

117 INTOXICATING LIQUORS.

The Contractor shall not sell and shall neither permit nor suffer the introduction or use of intoxicating liquors upon or about the Work.

1.18 SMOKING

Workers shall refrain from smoking while performing work at the project, except for designated areas authorized by the Owner. The Contractor shall remove from the project workers who consistently violate this provision.

1.19 ACCESS TO WORK

The City and its officers, agents, servants and employees may at any and all times and for any and all purposes, enter upon the Work and the site thereof and the premises used by the Contractor, and the Contractor shall at all times provide safe and proper facilities therefore.

1.20 CLEANING UP

The Contractor, at all times, shall keep the site of the Work free from rubbish and debris caused by their operations under the contract. When the Work has been completed, the Contractor shall remove from the site of the Work all of their plant, machinery, tools, construction equipment, temporary work and surplus materials so as to leave the Work and the site clean and ready for use.

Contractor to maintain control of dust and debris near the work area inside the building. Temporary wall structures and exhaust blowers shall be used for control.

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SECTION 4 MASONRY REPOINTING

PART 1 - GENERAL

1.1 DESCRIPTION

A. The following specification provides detailed requirements and instructions for replacement and repointing of historic brick on Greenfield City Hall.

- 1.2 SECTION REQUIREMENTS
- A. Submittals:
- 1. Manufacturer's data sheets for Portland Cement, and Hydrated Lime.
- 2. Sample of prepared mortar for color comparison with existing mortar.
- 3. Mild Cleaning Solution.
- 4. Evidence of experience and satisfactory completion of similar brick wall repointing projects.
- 1.3 PRODUCT DELIVERY, HANDLING, AND STORAGE.
- A. Supply Portland Cement and Hydrated Lime in unopened bags.
- B. Store materials off of the ground.
- C. Cover materials to protect from the elements.
- 1.4 JOB CONDITIONS
- A. Protection of Work

1. Secure waterproof cover over the top of wall at the end of each day and when work is not in progress.

B. Protection of Public

1. Provide and maintain barriers, covered staging, or other protection to protect the public from falling materials.

- C. Protection of Masonry Walls.
- 1. Protect walls below the work area from damage and mortar stains.
- D. Temperature Requirements Cold Weather Work.
- 1. Ambient temperatures between 32 deg. to 40 deg.
- a. Heat sand or mixing water to provide mortar temperatures between 40 deg. and 90 deg.
- b. Alternately, prepare mortar in heated area to maintain mortar temperature above 40 deg.
- 2. Ambient temperatures between 25 deg. And 32 deg.
- a. Heat sand and mixing water to provide mortar temperatures between 40 deg. and 90 deg.
- b. Alternately, prepare mortar in heated area to maintain mortar temperature above 40 deg.
- 3. Ambient temperatures between 20 deg. and 25 deg.
- a. Heat sand and mixing water to provide mortar temperatures between 40 deg. and 90 deg.
- b. Alternately, prepare mortar in heated area to maintain mortar temperature above 40 deg.
- c. Use temporary heat and polyethylene enclosure to keep air temperature on work area above freezing.
- 4. At all times, maintain mortar on mortar boards above freezing temperature.
- E. Protection Requirements for Finished Work.
- a. Protect masonry work from rain, snow, or freezing temperatures for 48 hours after repointing is complete.

PART 2 - PRODUCTS

- 2.1 Mortar Materials.
- A. Portland cement shall conform to ASTM C150, Standard Specification for Portland Cement, Type I.

B. Hydrated lime shall conform to ASTM C207, Standard Specification for Hydrated Lime for Masonry Purposes, Type S.

- C. Sand shall conform to ASTM C144.
- D. Mortar used in repointing joints shall be Type O Mortar conforming to ASTM C 270 consisting of:
- 1. 1 part Portland Cement
- 2. 2 parts hydrated lime
- 3. 9 parts clean sand
- E. Mortar Preparation, Pre-hydrated mortar:
- 1. Mix dry ingredients.
- 2. Add clean water to produce a damp consistency that will retain its shape when formed into a ball.
- 3. Let mortar set for 1 to 1 ½ hours.
- 4. After pre-hydrating, add water to a workable consistency.
- F. ADDITIVES.
- 1. No chemical additives, such as anti-freeze, shall be permitted.
- 2.2 BRICKS.

A. Bricks used to replace broken, cracked, or otherwise damaged bricks shall match existing bricks in color and dimensions.

A. Using a Pointer's Grinder, grind mortar out of **all** of the horizontal joints to a uniform depth of 3/4 in. Using a Toothing Chisel, chisel mortar out of **all** of the vertical joints to a uniform depth of 3/4 in. Use caution to prevent damage to the existing bricks. Replace any bricks damaged during the joint cleaning process.

B. Remove dust and debris from joints by blowing with compressed air or rinsing with water.

C. Pre-soak wall in preparation for repointing joints.

D. Press pre-hydrated mortar into joints in 1/4 in. layers using a tucking trowel, Compact each layer as it is placed by applying firm pressure with the pointing tool. Wait until the surface is thumbprint hard before applying subsequent layers.

E. Tool joints to match the existing joints when thumbprint hard to provide a uniform overall appearance.

4.2 BRICK REPLACEMENT.

A. Remove damaged bricks.

Carefully cut and chisel away remaining pieces of brick and mortar.

- B. Remove dust and debris from joints by blowing with compressed air or rinsing with water.
- C. Do not allow debris to fall into wall cavities.
- D. Dampen area of wall and allow time for all surface moisture to be absorbed prior to laying brick.
- E. Butter replacement brick and surrounding surfaces with mortar.
- F. Press brick into position.
- G. When thumbprint hard, tool joints to match existing wall joints.
- H. Clean the wall and remove excess mortar.
- 4.3 CLEANING BRICKWORK.
- A. Clean masonry as work progresses.
- 1. Remove mortar fins and smears before tooling joints.

2. Brush excess mortar after tooling and remove large mortar tags using wooden paddles or nonmetallic tools.

- B. Final Cleaning: After mortar is thoroughly cured, clean exposed masonry.
- 1. Wet wall surfaces with water and keep wet during the cleaning process.
- 2. Clean masonry with water and brush.
- 3. Addition of an approved mild masonry cleaning product to the wash water is permitted
- 4. Thoroughly rinse the area with clear water.
- 5. Use a wire brush to remove clumps of mortar where necessary.

Information about Prevailing Wage Schedules for Awarding Authorities and Contractors

- The wage rates will remain in effect for the duration of the project, except in the case of multi-year public construction projects. For construction projects lasting longer than one year, awarding authorities must request an updated wage schedule no later than two weeks before the anniversary of the date the contract was executed by the awarding authority and the general contractor. For multi-year CM AT RISK projects, the awarding authority must request an annual update no later than two weeks before the anniversary date, determined as the earlier of: (a) the execution date of the GMP Amendment, or (b) the execution date of the first amendment to permit procurement of construction services. The annual update requirement is not applicable to 27F "rental of equipment" contracts. The updated wage schedule must be provided to all contractors, including general and sub-contractors, working on the construction project.
- This wage schedule applies only to the specific project referenced at the top of this page and uniquely identified by the "Wage Request Number" on all pages of this schedule.
- An Awarding Authority must request an updated wage schedule if it has not opened bids or selected a contractor within 90 days of the date of issuance of the wage schedule. For CM AT RISK projects (bid pursuant to G.L. c.149A), the earlier of: (a) the execution date of the GMP Amendment, or (b) the bid for the first construction scope of work must be within 90-days of the wage schedule issuance date.
- The wage schedule shall be incorporated in any advertisement or call for bids for the project as required by M.G.L. c. 149, § 27. The wage schedule shall be made a part of the contract awarded for the project. The wage schedule must be posted in a conspicuous place at the work site for the life of the project in accordance with M.G.L. c. 149 § 27. The wages listed on the wage schedule must be paid to employees performing construction work on the project whether they are employed by the prime contractor, a filed sub-bidder, or a sub-contractor.
- Apprentices working on the project are required to be registered with the Massachusetts Division of Apprentice Standards (DAS). Apprentices must keep their apprentice identification card on their persons during all work hours on the project. An apprentice registered with DAS may be paid the lower apprentice wage rate at the applicable step as provided on the prevailing wage schedule. **Any apprentice not registered with DAS regardless of whether they are registered with another federal, state, local, or private agency must be paid the journeyworker's rate.**
- Every contractor or subcontractor working on the construction project must submit weekly payroll reports and a Statement of Compliance directly to the awarding authority by mail or email and keep them on file for three years. Each weekly payroll report must contain: the employee's name, address, occupational classification, hours worked, and wages paid. Do not submit weekly payroll reports to DLS. For a sample payroll reporting form go to http://www.mass.gov/dols/pw.
- Contractors with questions about the wage rates or classifications included on the wage schedule have an affirmative obligation to inquire with DLS at (617) 626-6953.
- Contractors must obtain the wage schedules from awarding authorities. Failure of a contractor or subcontractor to pay the prevailing wage rates listed on the wage schedule to all employees who perform construction work on the project is a violation of the law and subjects the contractor or subcontractor to civil and criminal penalties.
- Employees not receiving the prevailing wage rate set forth on the wage schedule may file a complaint with the Fair Labor Division of the office of the Attorney General at (617) 727-3465.
