1. Describe the Project

The proposed city wide outdoor amenities include interactive play amenities such as concrete chess, ping pong tables, foosball, and cornhole boards that will enhance Greenfield's vibrancy by creating unexpected opportunites that change the way people play in public spaces. These amenities become social hubs, fostering positive social interactions, collaboration, and connection; allowing everyone to play and learn!

This proposal also includes solar charging picnic tables where the table itself will harness green solar energy to create a space where the community can sit, relax, and enjoy Greenfield's parks and public spaces, all while charging their electronic devices. These tables also create opportunities for community members to work remotely from public spaces. Additionally, in support of Greenfield's active cycling community, this request includes installing bike racks and repair stations in additional parks and public spaces.

2. What are the goals of the proposed project?

- -Create social hubs throughout the City.
- -Foster positive social interactions through active play.
- -Create new and unexpected ways to play in the community.
- -Engage new park users, especially the teen population.
- -Reinforce Greenfield's reputation as a great place to live, work, and PLAY.
- -Harness solar energy to provide free charging of electronic devices.
- -Provide free and accesible cycling tools to promote cycling in the community as an alternate means of transportation.

3. Who will benefit from this project and why/how?

A community that plays together, stays together! Creating a space in our parks with a main purpose of fostering postive social interactions will benefit the entire community. Positive social interaction, especially in an outdoor setting, is proven to have a positive impact on mental health. These non-traditional recreational offerings will especially appeal to teens, but are suitable for all ages and promote intergenerational play.

Solar charging stations will benefit the community by providing a public space where citizens can work remotely and stay outdoors longer. The addition of cycling infrastructure further promotes cycling within the community and will provide cyclists with free tools to care for and maintain their bikes.

4. How will you measure your success?

Success will be measured by number of users and positive feedback from community members, schools, and social media.

The CPA allows for funds to be spent for the creation and rehabilitation of land for recreational use. The addition of the Site Amenities throughout the City will create a new active outdoor recreation opportunity for citizens of all ages.
