1. Describe the Project
In 2015, Greenfield High School completed major construction and renovations to both the building and its exterior space and athletic fields. Part of that renovation included the addition of a new track. This track is widely used by both the students and the community. Unfortunately, during the construction of the track, there was an oversight regarding ADA accessibility. While there is adequate marked parking and a paved entry into the track area, there is a large gap of grassy area between the paved entry and the track itself that prevent those in wheelchairs from easily accessing the space.
This project aims to correct this oversight by installing a concrete connection path from the end of the paved area to the track as well as a concrete viewing pad by the bleachers for spectators.
2. What are the goals of the proposed project?
-Provide accesibility to the GHS Track and spectator viewing area.
3. Who will benefit from this project and why/how?
This project will most directly impact those with disabilities who are currently unable to easily access the track or spectator viewing areas.
4. How will you measure your success?
Success will be measured by community and school feedback.

The CPA allows for funds to be spent for the creation and rehabilitation of land for recreational use. The addition of the ADA pathway to the track will provide access to the track for the entire community.
