

# **RENTER'S REBATE 2023 PROGRAM**

This program provides for a partial rebate on your 2022 rental & utility expenses, you must have been 65 years old or older or be a totally disabled <u>CT renter</u> in 2022 with income less than \$40,300 for an individual & \$49,100 for couples. **Call 203-453-8009 to schedule appointment.** 

FISHING LICENSES Those 65 years or older may obtain CT fishing licenses free of charge, renewable annually. # National Parks & Federal Recreational Lands Senior Pass /Access Pass

Life time passes available for a one-time fee of \$80 for US citizens or permanent residents who are 62 or older (free to permanently disabled citizens) to visit federal parks, monuments and recreation areas through out the US. Passes are obtained in person at the entrance of federally operated recreation areas or by mail. You may apply online or download an application at www.store.usgs.gov/pass. There is an additional \$10 processing fee over the internet and by mail. There is also an annual pass for seniors for \$20.

# What to know about Medicare when you travel abroad



Planning to travel abroad this summer? Before you go, remember that Medicare usually **does not** cover health care services or supplies while you're traveling outside the United States .That doesn't mean you have to travel abroad without health coverage. **Here are 3 ways you can get health coverage outside the U.S.:** 

- 1. If you have a Medicare Supplement Insurance (Medigap) policy, **check your policy** to see if it includes coverage when traveling outside the U.S.
- 2. If you have Medicare Advantage or another Medicare health plan (instead of Original Medicare), check with your plan to see if they offer coverage outside the U.S.
- 3. Consider buying a travel insurance policy that includes health coverage. Safe travels!
